ORDINANCE NO. 4 - 1996

BY: POLICE AND FIRE COMMITTEE

TITLE: AN ORDINANCE amending CHAPTER 353 "ON-STREET AND OFF-STREET PARKING" of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Massillon, by repealing existing Section 353.99 "penalty" of said CHAPTER 353 and enacting a new Section 353.99 "Penalty" of said CHAPTER 353, and declaring an emergency.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MASSILLON, STATE OF OHIO, THAT:

Section 1:

The existing Section 353.99 "Penalty" of CHAPTER 353 "ON-STREET AND OFF-STREET PARKING" of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Massillon be and hereby is repealed.

Section 2:

That there be and hereby is enacted a new Section 353.99 "Penalty" of CHAPTER 353 "ON-STREET AND OFF-STREET PARKING" of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Massillon. Said newly enacted Section shall read as follows:

353.99 PENALTY

(See Section 303.99 for Misdemeanor Classifications and Penalties.)

(a) Whoever violates any provisions of Chapter 353 shall be fined as follows:

- (1) Two dollars (\$2.00) if paid before 10:00 a.m. of the day following the violation, Sundays and legal holidays excluded.
- (2) Four dollars (\$4.00) if paid before 10:00 a.m. of the seventh day following the violation, Sundays and legal holidays excluded.
- (3) Ten dollars (\$10.00) if paid later than the seventh day following the violation, Sundays and legal holidays excluded.
- (4) If the fine is not paid before the forty-fifth day following such violation the offender shall be guilty of a minor misdemeanor.

(b) Whoever violates Section 351.03 shall in addition to any other penalty provided for in the Traffic Code be fined as follows:

- (1) Ten dollars (\$10.00) if the fine is paid before 10:00 A.M. of the tenth day following the violation.
- (2) Twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) if the fine is paid later than 10:00 A.M. on the tenth day following the violation.

(c) Whoever violates Section 351.20 shall in addition to any other penalty provided for in the Traffic Code be fined as follows:

- (1) Twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) if the fine is paid before 10:00 A.M. of the tenth day following the violation.
- (2) Fifty dollars (\$50.00) if the fine is paid later than 10:00 A.M. on the tenth day following the violation.

(d) Whoever violates Section 351.04 (f) shall in addition to any other penalty provided for in the Traffic Code be fined as follows:

- (1) Twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) if the fine is paid before 10:00 A.M. of the tenth day following the violation.
- (2) Fifty dollars (\$50.00) if the fine is paid later than 10:00 A.M. of the tenth day following the violation.

Section 3:

This ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure, the reason for the emergency being that said enactments are necessary for the more efficient operation of the Police Department and the regulation of parking within the City of Massillon, Ohio, and for the additional reason for the preservation of the public health, safety and welfare of the community. And provided it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the elected members to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor. Otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MASSILLON,
STATE OF OHIO, THAT:

Section 1:

The Council of the City of Massillon, Ohio, hereby finds that it is necessary to enter into a contract agreement with the Catholic Community Services of Stark County Inc. to provide funding for operating assistance for the Family Living Center. The contract for services shall not exceed Ten thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00).

Section 2:

That the Mayor and the Director of Service and Safety of the City of Massillon be and is hereby authorized to enter into a contract agreement with the Catholic Community Services of Stark County Inc. to provide funding for operating assistance for the Family Living Center.

Section 3:

Upon delivery of the aforesaid agreement, the Director of Public Service and Safety is hereby authorized to issue vouchers to the Auditor of the City of Massillon, Ohio, directing prompt payment for said agreement and the City Auditor is authorized and directed to honor and pay said vouchers.

Section 4:

That this Ordinance is declared to be an emergency measure immediately necessary for the preservation of the health, safety and welfare of the community and for the additional reason that it is necessary to implement the 1996 Community Development Block Grant Program. Provided it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the elected members to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor. Otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

Section 1:

The Council of the City of Massillon, Ohio, hereby finds that it is necessary to enter into a contract agreement with The Stark County Regional Planning Commission for Housing Rehabilitation Technical Assistance for the City of Massillon. The contract for services shall not exceed Thirteen Thousand Dollars (\$13,000.00).

Session 2:

The Mayor and Director of Public Service and Safety of the City of Massillon be and is hereby authorized to enter into a contract agreement with The Stark County Regional Planning Commission for Housing Rehabilitation Technical Assistance for the City of Massillon, Ohio.

Section 3:

Upon delivery of the aforesaid agreement, the Director of Public Service and Safety is hereby authorized to issue vouchers to the Auditor of the City of Massillon, Ohio, directing prompt payment for said agreement and the City Auditor is authorized and directed to honor and pay said vouchers.

Section 4:

That this Ordinance is declared to be an emergency measure immediately necessary for the preservation of the health, safety and welfare of the community and for the additional reason that it is needed to assist the City of Massillon in its Housing Rehabilitation Program. TITLE: AN ORDINANCE accepting an application for annexation for territory to the City of Massillon, Ohio, and declaring an emergency.

WHEREAS, a petition for the annexation for certain territory in Perry Township, was duly filed by Aane Aaby, Agent for the petitioners, and

WHEREAS, the said petition was duly considered by the Board of County Commissioners of Stark County on July 19, 1995, and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners on October 17, 1995, approved the annexation of said territory to the City of Massillon as hereinafter described, and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners certified the transcript and pertinent documents of proceedings in connection with said annexation with the map and petition required in connection therewith, to the City Auditor of the City of Massillon, who received same on November 13, 1995, and

WHEREAS, at least two-thirds of the members elected to Council of the City of Massillon, Ohio, have found, considered and determined that in order to annex said territory to the City of Massillon, this constitutes an emergency, requiring immediate action.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MASSILLON, STATE OF OHIO, THAT

Section 1:

The application of Aane Aaby, Agent for the petitioners is hereby accepted for the annexation of the following described territory in the County of Stark and adjacent to the City of Massillon, to wit:

Section 4:

This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure, the reason for the emergency being that said enactment is necessary for the more efficient operation of the City of Massillon, Ohio, and for the additional reason that is in the best interest of the property owners in the annexed area that their property become a part of the City of Massillon. Provided it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the elected members to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor. Otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

TITLE: AN ORDINANCE authorizing the Mayor of the City of Massillon to enter into negotiations with the owners of property within the Great Adventure's Theme Park project area site for the purpose of determining the total cost of the project to the City of Massillon and for the Mayor to enter into negotiations with the developer of the project to determine the terms to be included in a potential agreement between the City and the developer, and declaring an emergency.

WHEREAS, a developer has submitted a plan to construct a Great Adventure's Theme Park within the City of Massillon;

WHEREAS, the developer has requested that the City of Massillon acquire certain property within the project site and to sell said property as well as additional property owned by the City for the purpose of constructing the Theme Park;

WHEREAS, real estate appraisals have been obtained by the City for the property within the project site and it is now necessary to determine what the total cost of the project will be to the City;

WHEREAS, this Ordinance is not a commitment to the project but only an authorization for the Mayor to negotiate with the owners for the purpose of determining the total acquisition costs;

WHEREAS, all final negotiations made by the Mayor shall not be binding upon the City of Massillon until Council reviews and approves the negotiated prices and the necessary project financing is secured;

WHEREAS, it is further necessary for the Mayor to open discussions with the developer for the purpose of determining the terms that will be contained in a potential agreement between the City and the developer;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MASSILLON, STATE OF OHIO, THAT:

Section 1:

The Mayor of the City of Massillon is hereby authorized to enter into negotiations with the owners of the property within the Great Adventure's Theme Park project area site so as to determine the total cost of the project to the City of Massillon. Included in the negotiations shall be the cost to relocate and move the affected property owners.

Section 2:

The negotiations by the Mayor shall not be binding on the City and the negotiated agreements shall be subject to the review and final approval by the Council of the City of Massillon and it is further subject to the City securing the necessary financing for the project.

Section 3:

The Mayor is further authorized to enter into discussions with the developer to determine the terms of a potential agreement between the City and the developer. This Council requests the Mayor to take into consideration the following items in the discussions:

- A. Purchase price for the land.
- B. Admission tax.
- C. All financial expenditures that the developer is requesting from the City.
- D. Land site preparation and costs.
- E. Long term plan for parking.

Section 4:

It is the City of Massillon's intent that if the project is approved at a later date, that the funding will not be made from the General Fund within the City of Massillon.

Section 5:

That this Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the preservation of the health, safety and welfare of the community and for the additional reason that it is necessary to determine the total cost to the City of Massillon for the construction of a Great Adventure's Theme Park in the downtown area of the City of Massillon. Provided it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the elected members to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor. Otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

ORDINANCE NO. 19 - 1996

BY: COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT AND ANNEXATION COMMITTEE

TITLE: AN ORDINANCE approving and authorizing the Mayor to enter into an agreement with United Studios of America Marketing Association, Inc., providing an economic development "inducement grant" to assist the company in relocating to and expanding its operations in downtown Massillon, and declaring an emergency.

WHEREAS, the City of Massillon carries out a variety of economic development programs designed to promote the creation and expansion of business and industry in the community, with a special emphasis on the revitalization of the downtown area; and

WHEREAS, United Studios of America Marketing Association, Inc., ("USAMA") a portable photographic service franchise corporation, desires to relocate its national headquarters in downtown Massillon through the acquisition of property located at 48 First Street, N.E.; and

WHEREAS, United Studios of America Marketing Association, Inc., also proposes to located in this same building its Cleveland/Canton/Massillon franchise; a company running its Toledo/Detroit franchise operations; a quality-control company serving only USAMA franchises; and a photographic development laboratory; and

WHEREAS, United Studios of America Marketing Association, Inc., through this proposed business relocation and expansion, plans to provide approximately 58-80 jobs in downtown Massillon within a twelve month period; and

WHEREAS, the City of Massillon proposes to assist United Studios of America Marketing Association, Inc., in this proposed relocation and expansion by providing an economic development "inducement grant", the purpose of which is to help offset the company's costs in acquiring the project site, establishing operations in Massillon, and installing the photographic development lab.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MASSILLON, STATE OF OHIO, THAT:

Section 1:

This Council hereby approves and authorizes the Mayor to enter into an agreement with United Studios of America Marketing Association, Inc., providing an economic development "inducement grant," in a total amount not to exceed Forty Thousand Dollars (\$40,000.00), for the purpose of assisting the company in relocating to and expanding its operations in downtown Massillon. This "inducement grant" shall be provided as follows:

1. \$20,000 shall be provided to United Studios of America Marketing Association, Inc., or its designee upon the purchase of the property at 48 First Street, N.E., in downtown Massillon and the establishment of its business and franchise operations at this location.
2. An additional \$20,000 shall be provided to United Studios of America Marketing Association, Inc., upon completion of the installation of the photographic development laboratory at the 48 First Street, N.E., property.
3. This "inducement grant" shall be provided in the form of a deferred payment loan, at 0% interest, for a five year term. The balance on said deferred payment loan shall be reduced by 20% each year that the company or any related entity of the company continues to occupy the project site. At the end of the five year period, the balance on said deferred payment loan shall be \$0.00, and no payment shall be required, provided that the company or any related entity of the company is still in operation at the project site.

Section 2:

In return for this economic development grant assistance, United Studios of America Marketing Association, Inc., shall provide the City with information regarding the number of jobs that it has provided as a result of the company's relocation and expansion in downtown Massillon.

Section 3:

This Ordinance is declared to be an emergency measure immediately necessary for the preservation of the health, safety, and welfare of the community and for the additional reason that it is necessary to improve the economic climate of the community through the expansion of business and employment opportunities. Provided it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the elected members to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor. Otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
