Section 1:

The Council of the City of Massillon, Ohio, hereby determines that it is necessary to establish a rate schedule for fees to be charged at the Legends of Massillon Golf Course for the 1996 golf season.

Section 2:

TITLE: AN ORDINANCE approving the editing and inclusion of certain Ordinances as part of the various component codes of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Massillon, Ohio, and declaring an emergency.

WHEREAS, various ordinances of a general and permanent nature have been passed which should be included in the Codified Ordinances of Massillon, Ohio; and

WHEREAS, numerous sections in the Traffic and General Offenses Codes need to be amended or enacted so as to conform to enactments of the Ohio General Assembly;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MASSILLON, STATE OF OHIO, THAT:

Section 1:

The editing, arrangement and numbering or renumbering of the following ordinances and parts of ordinances are hereby approved as parts of the various component codes of the Codified Ordinances of Massillon, Ohio, so as to conform to the classification and numbering system of the Codified Ordinances to wit:

Section 2:

The following sections of the Traffic and General Offenses Codes, as amended, are hereby approved and adopted as amended or enacted so as to conform to enactments of the Ohio General Assembly.

Traffic Code

333.07 STREET RACING.

(Redefines the former offense of drag racing as "street racing".)

335.07 DRIVING UNDER SUSPENSION, REVOCATION OR RESTRICTION.

(Adds offense of operating a vehicle without proof of financial responsibility when so required and giving false document to law enforcement officer.)

General Offenses Code

525.01 LAW ENFORCEMENT AND PUBLIC OFFICE DEFINITIONS.

(Adds "legislative campaign fund" to definitions.)

525.02 FALSIFICATION.

(Redefines a false statement constituting an offense under subsection (a)(4).)

525.11 SOLICITING OR RECEIVING IMPROPER COMPENSATION.

(Adds exception of voluntary contribution to a legislative campaign fund.)

529.01 LIQUOR CONTROL DEFINITIONS.

(Amends definition of "low-alcohol beverages".)

529.04 LIQUOR CONSUMPTION IN MOTOR VEHICLE.

(Adds exception for passengers in chauffeured limousines.)

529.07 OPEN CONTAINER PROHIBITED.

(Adds exception for passengers in chauffeured limousines.)

537.14 DOMESTIC VIOLENCE.

(Redefines "family or household member".)

537.15 TEMPORARY PROTECTION ORDER.

(Increases penalty for the offense of violating a protection order.)

549.07 UNDERAGE PURCHASE OF FIREARMS.

(Adds new section prohibiting purchase of firearms by anyone under eighteen years of age and handguns by anyone under twenty-one years of age.)

Section 3:

A copy of such Ordinances as edited, arranged and numbered or renumbered as parts of the Codified Ordinances is attached to this Ordinance in the form of 1995 Replacement Pages to the Codified Ordinances.

Section 4:

That this Ordinance is declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the preservation of the health, safety and welfare of the community and for the additional reason that there exists an imperative necessity for the earliest publication and distribution of the Codified Ordinances to the officials and residents of the City of Massillon, Ohio, so as to facilitate administration, daily operation and avoid practical and legal entanglements. Provided it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the elected members to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor. Otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

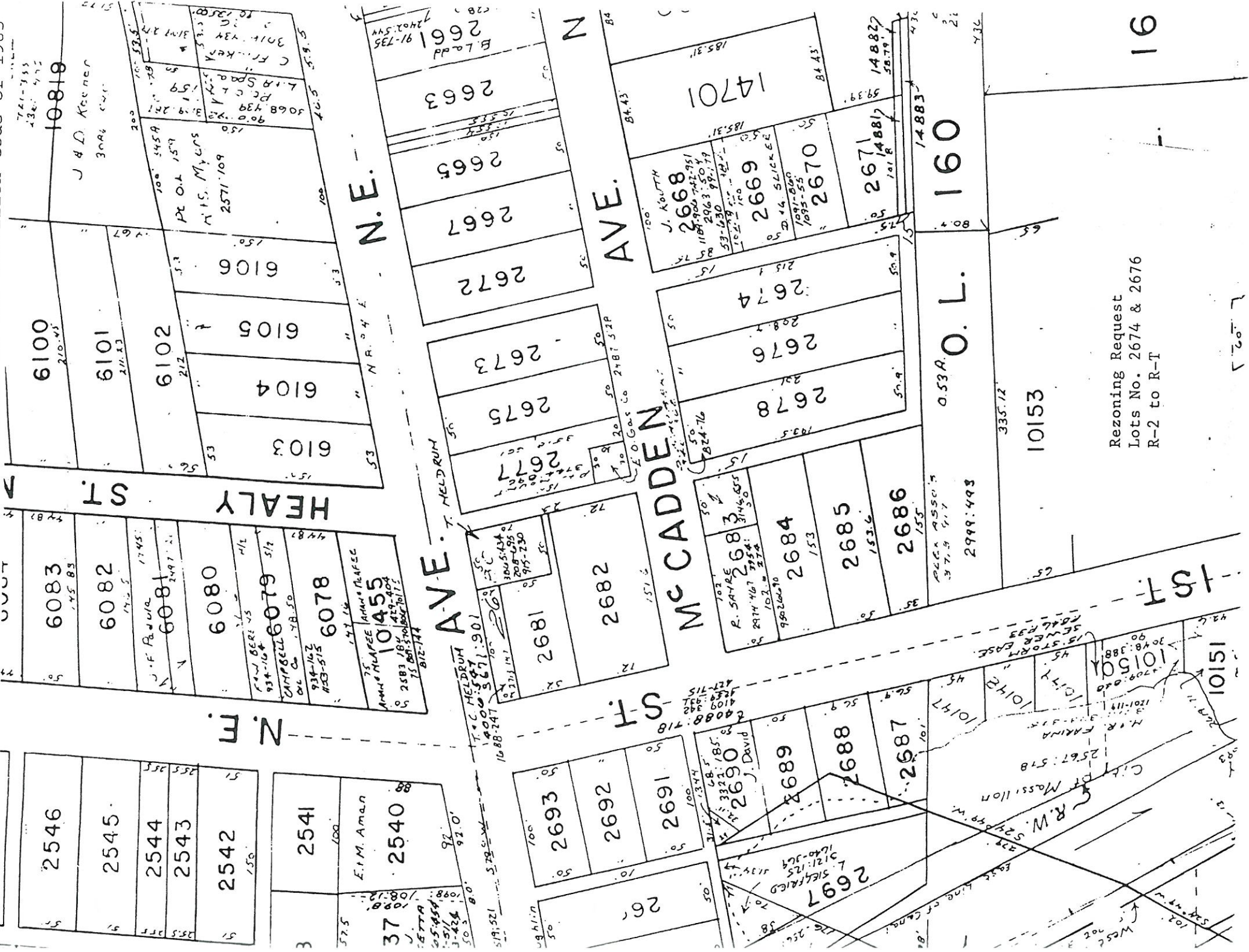

That the Board of County Commissioners of Stark County, Ohio, are hereby petitioned under the authority of Section 503.07, Ohio Revised Code, to add the one (1) tract of land described in Section 2 of this ordinance to Massillon Township, Stark County, Ohio.

Section 5:

That upon passage of this ordinance the Clerk of Council is directed to forward a certified copy thereof and the attached map, together with an authenticated copy of the proceedings relating thereto, to the Board of County Commissioners of Stark County, Ohio.

Section 6:

That this Ordinance is declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the health, safety and welfare of this community and for the further reason that the timely resolution of its subject matter is essential for making the boundary lines of Massillon Township conform with the corporation lines of the City of Massillon, Ohio. Provided it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the elected members to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor. Otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

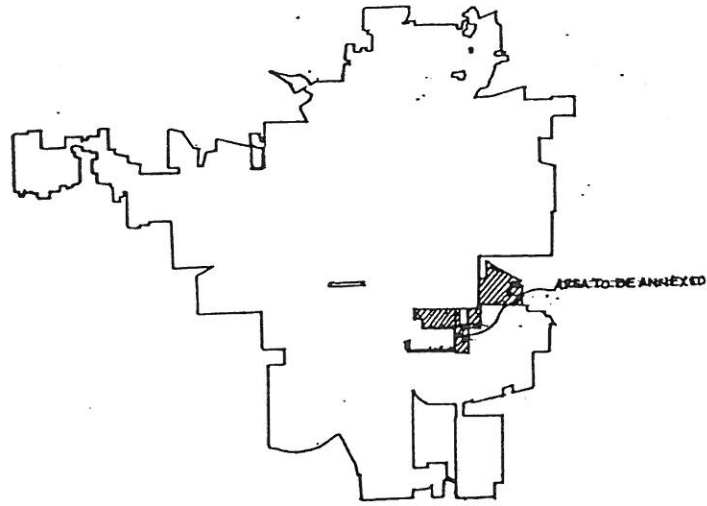

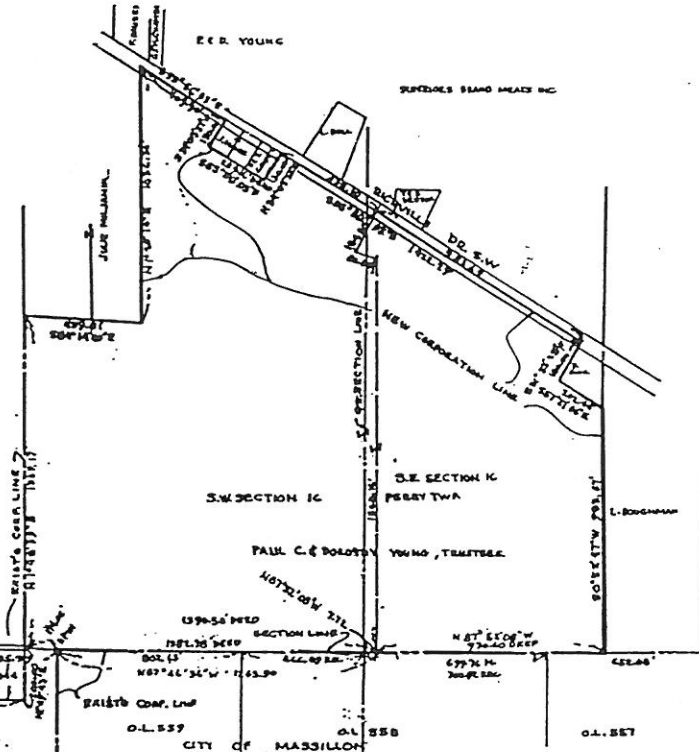
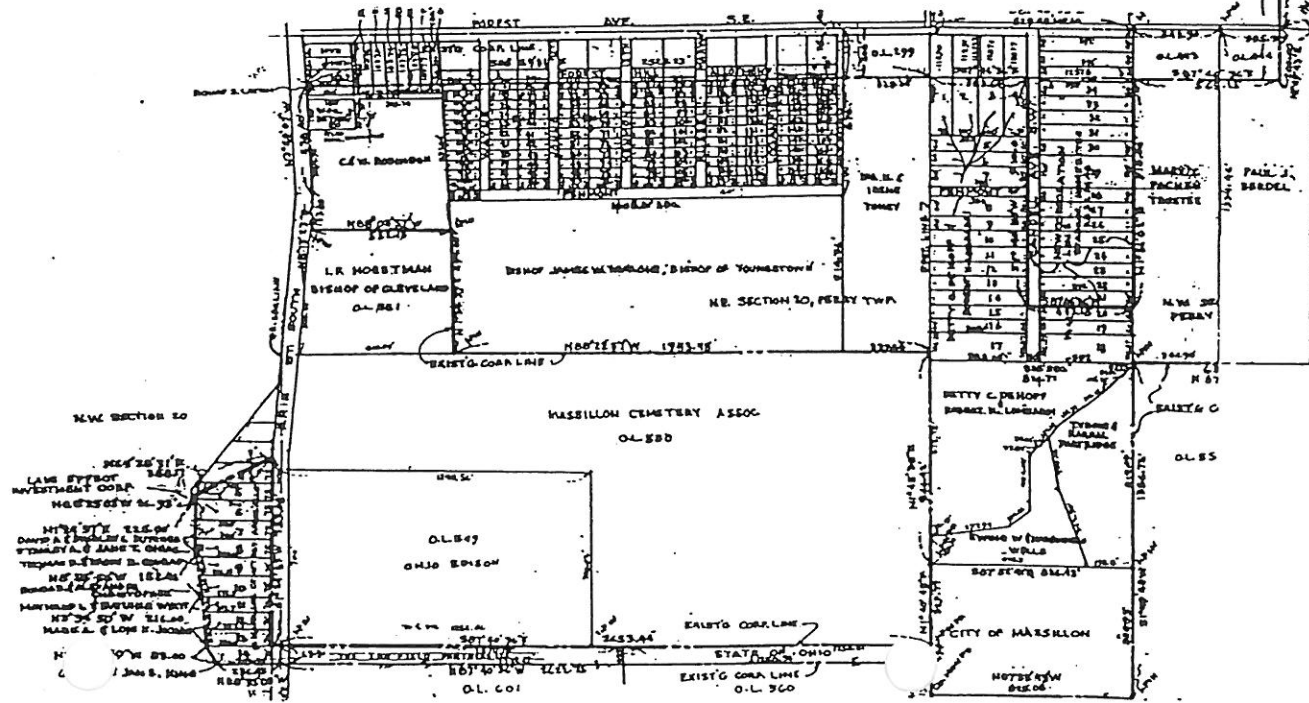
