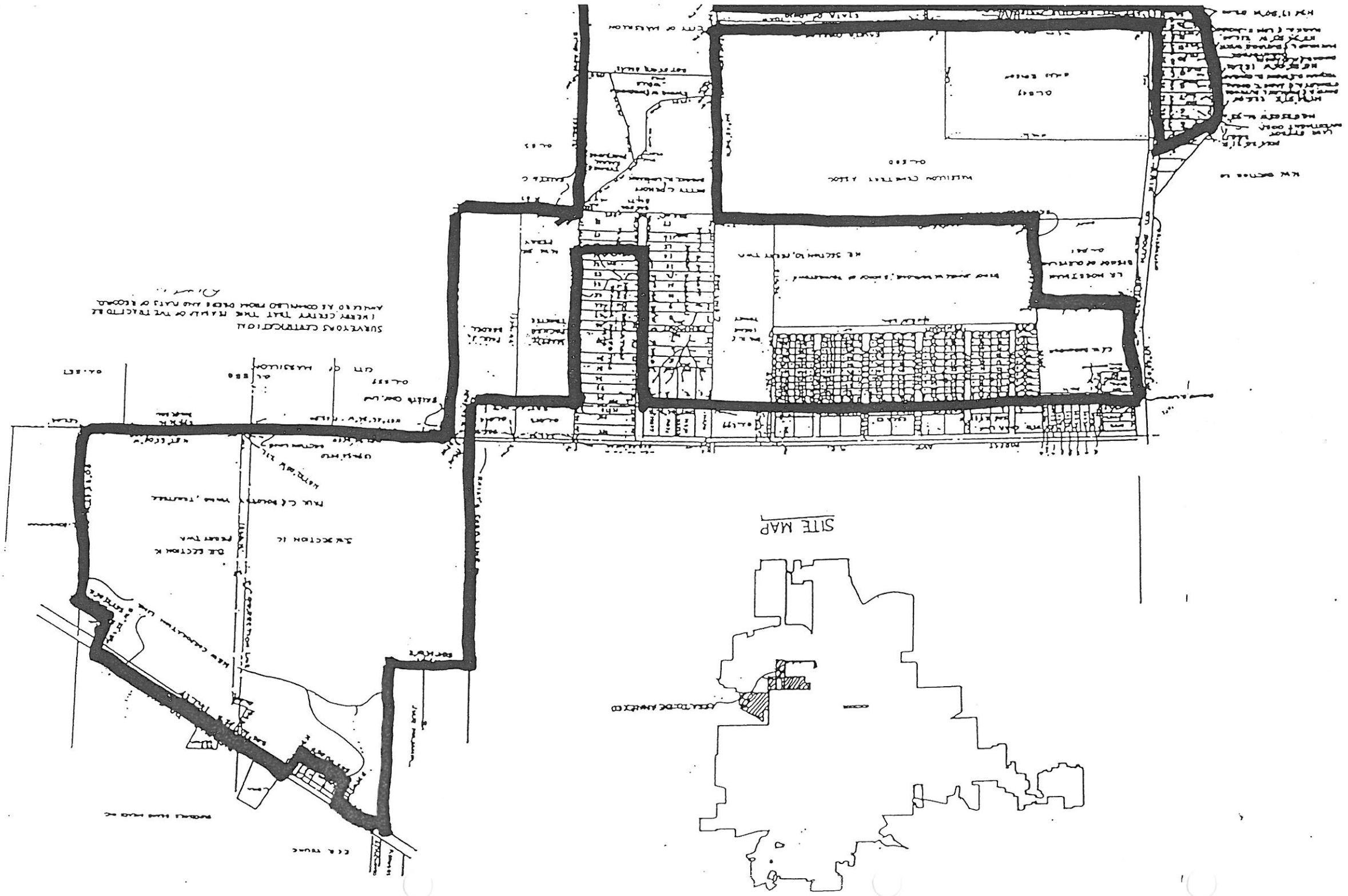

Section 2:

WHEREAS, pending Ohio House Bill 598, would prohibit a municipality from collecting income tax from an individual who works in the municipality but is not a resident; and

WHEREAS, since a large portion of the income tax collected in the City of Massillon are from non-resident workers, the passage of House Bill 598 would cause a major reduction in the tax yield and would have a great impact on the City's budget,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MASSILLON, STATE OF OHIO, THAT:

Section 1:

The Council of the City of Massillon strongly urges the defeat of Ohio House Bill 598 which would prohibit a municipal corporation other than the municipal corporation of residence from levying a tax on the income of an individual.
