BY: STREETS, HIGHWAYS, TRAFFIC & SAFETY COMMITTEE

TITLE: AN ORDINANCE vacating a certain public alley, and declaring an emergency.

WHEREAS, there has been filed with this Council by the owners of all of the lots and lands bounding and abutting upon the alley hereinafter described, a petition requesting that a portion thereinafter described be vacated, and

WHEREAS, upon hearing, the Council hereby find that there is good cause for such vacation and that it will not be detrimental to the general interest of this community and that such vacation should be made.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MASSILLON, STATE OF OHIO, THAT:

Section 1:

A request to vacate a 12 foot wide alley lying between 8th Street, S.E. and 11th Street, S.E., and running in a north-south direction between Oak Avenue, S.E. and South Avenue, S.E.; specifically, the request is to vacate that portion of the alley from the south property line of Lots No. 2225 and 2226 northerly a distance of 170 feet to the north property line of Lots No. 2225 and 2226. This vacation plat is filed in the City Engineer's Office as M-865, Acc. No. 3322, which is made a part hereof by reference and which was approved by the City Planning Commission on May 8, 1996. The said vacation is hereby approved, adopted and confirmed.

Section 2:

That this Ordinance is declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the health, safety and welfare of the community and for the reason that the alley is no longer needed for a municipal purpose and it would benefit the owners of the abutting property. Provided it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the elected members to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor. Otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

RESOLUTION NO. 13 - 1996

BY: COMMITTEE OF THE WHOLE

TITLE: A RESOLUTION opposing Senate Bill 19, which designates the State of Ohio as the first low-level radioactive waste dumping site for six midwestern states, and declaring an emergency.

WHEREAS, on June 9, 1995, Governor George Voinovich signed Senate Bill 19, which designates the State of Ohio as the first low-level radioactive waste dumping site for six midwestern states; and

WHEREAS, the "low-level" radioactive wastes that will be put into this dump are very highly toxic and long-lived radioactive materials, including all wastes from nuclear power plants except the "high level" radioactive fuel rods; and

WHEREAS, there is no safe technology for disposal of "low-level" radioactive waste, and the taxpayers in the State of Ohio will take permanent title to and environmental and economic liability for a dump that is damaging the environment and jeopardizing the health and welfare of the citizens of the State of Ohio.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MASSILLON, STATE OF OHIO, THAT:

Section 1:

The Mayor and Council of the City of Massillon do hereby strongly protect and oppose the State of Ohio being selected as the receiver of such hazardous radioactive nuclear waste from six midwestern states.

Section 2:

The Clerk of Council be and she is hereby directed to forward a certified copy of this Resolution to Governor George V. Voinovich, U.S. Congressman Ralph Regula, U.S. Senators John Glenn and Mike DeWine, State Senator Scott Oelslager, and State Representatives Kirk Schuring and Johnnie Maier.

Section 3:

It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees or subcommittees that resulted in such formal action, were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

Section 4:

This Resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, safety and welfare of said City, and for the further reason that Council deems it necessary to oppose the selection of Ohio as the dumping site for the low-level nuclear waste of six midwestern states; therefore, this Resolution shall take effect and be in force immediately from and after its passage and approval by the Mayor.
