WHEREAS, the Parks and Recreation Board of the City of Massillon, Ohio, plans to apply for an Ohio Department of Natural Resources Grant for funding so as to provide assistance for the Sippo Valley Corridor Project,

WHEREAS, the Grant request will be in the amount of \$375,785.00 and the City will be responsible for thirty percent (30%) of the total cost.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MASSILLON,
STATE OF OHIO, THAT:

Section 1:

The Parks and Recreation Board of the City of Massillon is hereby authorized to file an application with Ohio Department of Natural Resources (ONDR) for funding assistance under the Nature Works Program.

Section 2:

That this Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the preservation of the health, safety and welfare of the community and for the further reason that the application for the Nature Works Program must be submitted to the Ohio Department of Natural Resources by July 5, 1996. Provided it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the elected members to Council it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor. Otherwise it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

TITLE: AN ORDINANCE approving and authorizing the Mayor to enter into an agreement with E-B Wireworks Inc., providing an economic development "inducement grant" to assist the company in relocating to and expanding its operations in Massillon, and declaring an emergency.

WHEREAS, the City of Massillon carries out a variety of economic development programs designed to promote the creation and expansion of business and industry in the community; and

WHEREAS, E-B Wireworks Inc., desires to relocate its headquarters in Massillon through the acquisition of property located at the Finefrock Industrial Park; and

WHEREAS, E-B Wireworks Inc., through this proposed business relocation and expansion, plans to provide approximately 105 jobs in Massillon; and

WHEREAS, the City of Massillon proposes to assist E-B Wireworks Inc., in this proposed relocation and expansion by providing an economic development "inducement grant", the purpose of which is to help offset the company's costs in relocating to the new facility.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MASSILLON STATE OF OHIO, THAT:

Section 1:

This Council hereby approves and authorizes the Mayor to enter into an agreement with E-B Wireworks Inc., providing an economic development "inducement grant," in a total amount not to exceed Twenty Thousand Dollars (\$20,000.00) for the purpose of assisting the company in relocating to and expanding its operations in Massillon. This "inducement grant" shall be provided as follows:

1. \$20,000.00 shall be provided to E-B Wireworks Inc., when the company starts the relocation of its business into Massillon.
2. This "inducement grant" shall be provided in the form of a deferred payment loan, at 0% interest, for a five year term. The balance on said deferred payment loan shall be reduced by 20% each year that the company or any related entity of the company continues to occupy the project site. At the end of the five year period, the balance on said deferred payment loan shall be \$0.00, and no payment shall be required, provided that the company or any related entity of the company is still in operation at the project site.

In return for this economic development grant assistance, E-B Wireworks Inc., shall provide the City with information regarding the number of jobs that it has provided as a result of the company's relocation and expansion in Massillon.

Section 3:

This Ordinance is declared to be an emergency measure immediately necessary for the preservation of the health, safety, and welfare of the community and for the additional reason that it is necessary to improve the economic climate of

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MASSILLON STATE OF OHIO, THAT:

Section 1:

This Council hereby approves and authorizes the Mayor to enter into an agreement with E-B Advertising Display Co., Inc., providing an economic development "inducement grant," in a total amount not to exceed Seventy Five Thousand Dollars (\$75,000.00) for the purpose of assisting the company in relocating to and expanding its operations in Massillon. This "inducement grant" shall be provided as follows:

1. \$75,000.00 shall be provided to E-B Advertising Display Co., Inc., when the company starts the relocation of its business into Massillon.
2. This "inducement grant" shall be provided in the form of a deferred payment loan, at 0% interest, for a five year term. The balance on said deferred payment loan shall be reduced by 20% each year that the company or any related entity of the company continues to occupy the project site. At the end of the five year period, the balance on said deferred payment loan shall be \$0.00, and no payment shall be required, provided that the company or any related entity of the company is still in operation at the project site.

In return for this economic development grant assistance, E-B Advertising Display Co., Inc., shall provide the City with information regarding the number of jobs that it has provided as a result of the company's relocation and expansion in Massillon.

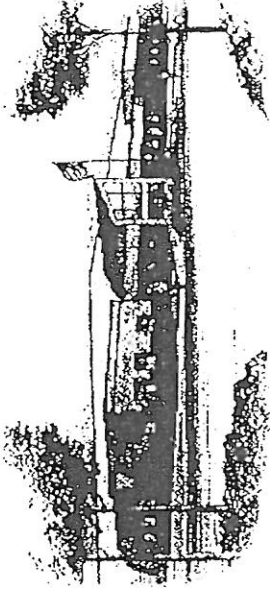
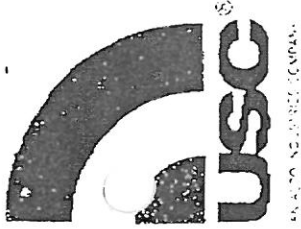

U.S. CHEMICAL & PLASTICS

**AMENDMENT TO URBAN JOBS
AND ENTERPRISE ZONE AGREEMENT**

The Amendment is made and entered into this Ninth day of May, 1996 by and between THE CITY OF MASSILLON, OHIO (the "City") for itself and as the successor-in-interest to the Board of County Commissioners of Stark County, Ohio, and U.S. CHEMICAL & PLASTICS, INC., A DIVISION OF ALCO INDUSTRIES, INC. ("USC") and J.J.&W. LIMITED PARTNERSHIP ("JJ&W") (USC and JJ&W may be referred to collectively as the "Enterprise").

WITNESSETH, THAT,

WHEREAS, the parties have previously entered into an Urban Jobs and Enterprise Zone Agreement, dated November 23, 1993 (the "Agreement"), whereby the Enterprise agreed and undertook to construct and equip a 137,520 square foot manufacturing building on an approximate 14.5 acre site on Nova Drive, S.E. (the "Project") and the City provided the Enterprise with development incentives to support the economic viability of the Project; and,

WHEREAS, the Agreement provides for a tax exemption for tangible personal property first used in business by the Enterprise as a result of the Agreement and installed at the Project Site by June 30, 1994; and,

WHEREAS, due to circumstances beyond the control of the Enterprise, all machinery and equipment ordered by the Enterprise for purchase and installation was not installed until September 30, 1995; and,

WHEREAS, in order to accomplish the intended purpose of the Agreement, the parties have determined to amend the Agreement, in the particulars set forth herein.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants set forth in the Agreement and the benefit to be deemed by each party from the completion of the Project as contemplated by the Agreement, the parties hereby agree as follows:

1. Section 3, subsection (1) is hereby amended to read as follows:

"(1) A tax exemption for tangible personal property first used in business by the Enterprise as a result of this Agreement, pursuant to Section 5709.63(A) of the Ohio Revised Code. This tax exemption shall be for a term of ten (10) years, at the rate of 75% on all machinery and equipment, furniture and fixtures and increase in current inventory levels as described in Section 1 of this Agreement and which is acquired as party of the Project and installed at the Project Site by September 30, 1995."

2. In all other respects the Agreement is hereby confirmed and ratified as written.

STATE OF OHIO, THAT:

Section 1:

There be and is hereby established within the City of Massillon, Ohio, an asset capitalization threshold for financial reporting at \$2,500.00.

Section 2:

The City Auditor be and is hereby authorized and directed to draw her warrants and make payments on vouchers duly approved by the proper departmental authority.

Section 3:
