Section 1:

The Mayor and the Director of Public Service and Safety of the City of Massillon, Ohio, is hereby authorized and directed to enter into a contract agreement with the Neighborhood Housing Services of Massillon, Inc., to provide housing rehabilitation and neighborhood improvement services, in the City of Massillon. The City's share of the program development costs shall not exceed One Hundred Thirty Thousand Dollars (\$130,000.00)

Section 2:

That this Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the health, safety, and welfare of the community, and for the further reason that these services are needed to meet the goals and objectives of the City's Community Development Block Grant Program. Provided it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the elected members to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor. Otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

WHEREAS, Five Oaks, located at 210 Fourth Street N.E., Massillon, Ohio, is listed on the National Register of Historic Places due to its architectural and historic significance, and

WHEREAS, the City of Massillon has allocated \$ 21,000 of its 1997 Community Development Block Grant Program Budget to provide funding assistance for the historic preservation of Five Oaks;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MASSILLON, STATE OF OHIO, THAT:

Section 1:

This Council of the City of Massillon, Ohio, hereby finds that it is necessary to enter into a contract, with the Massillon Heritage Foundation, Inc., to provide funding assistance for the historic preservation of Five Oaks, also known as the Massillon Women's Club, in the City of Massillon, Ohio. The contract for the funding assistance shall not exceed Twenty-One Thousand Dollars (\$21,000.00)

Section 2:

The Mayor and Director of Public Service and Safety of the City of Massillon be and are hereby authorized to enter into a contract with the Massillon Heritage Foundation, Inc., to provide funding assistance for the historic preservation of Five Oaks, also known as the Massillon Women's Club, in the City of Massillon, Ohio.

Section 3:

Upon delivery of the aforesaid agreement, the Director of Public Service and Safety is hereby authorized to issue vouchers to the Auditor of the City of Massillon, Ohio, directing prompt payment for said agreement and the City Auditor is authorized and directed to honor and pay said vouchers.

Section 4:

That this Ordinance is declared to be an emergency measure immediately necessary for the preservation of the health, safety and welfare of the community and for the additional reason that it is necessary for the historic preservation of one of Massillon's nationally known buildings. Provided it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the elected members to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor. Otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

Section 2:

The Director of Public Service and Safety of the City of Massillon, Ohio, is hereby authorized and directed to prepare plans and specifications and to advertise for and receive sealed bids according to law, and enter into contract, upon award and approval by the Board of Control, with the lowest and best bidder for street improvements in certain designated lower income neighborhoods.

Section 3:

That this Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the preservation of the health, safety and welfare of the community and for the additional reason that it is necessary bids be received so that the roads may be repaired pursuant to the requirements of the Community Development Block Grant Program. Provided it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the elected members to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor. Otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

## ORDINANCE NO. 12 - 1997

BY: STREETS, HIGHWAYS, TRAFFIC &amp; SAFETY COMMITTEE

TITLE: AN ORDINANCE enacted by the City of Massillon, Stark County, Ohio, in the matter of the hereinafter described improvement and to request cooperation by the Ohio Director of Transportation and declaring an emergency.

WHEREAS, the City has identified the need for and proposes the improvement of a portion of the public highway which is described as follows:

Construct two additional ramps at existing S.R. 21 and Erie Street interchange.

said portion of highway within the municipal corporation limits being hereinafter referred to as the improvement, and

WHEREAS, the City further desires cooperation from the Ohio Director of Transportation in the planning, design and construction of said improvement.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MASSILLON, OHIO, THAT:

Section 1:

The City of Massillon hereby requests the cooperation of the Ohio Director of Transportation in the cost of the above described improvement as follows:

- 1). The City of Massillon agrees to assume and bear one hundred percent (100%) of preliminary engineering and right of way for the improvement.
- 2). The City of Massillon agrees to initially assume and bear the entire cost and expense of the Federal Share of the construction phase of the improvement at the time that the project is let for construction.
- 3). Upon completion of the project, as per agreement between the City and SCATS dated January 24, 1997, SCATS will make the Federal Funding available to allow the Director of Transportation to reimburse the City for the normal eighty percent (80%) Federal share of all eligible items for the project in equal installments in July, 1998 and July, 1999 (State Fiscal Years 1999 and 2000).
- 4). The City of Massillon agrees to assume and bear one hundred percent (100%) of the cost of those features requested by the City which are not necessary for the improvement, as determined by the State and Federal Highway Administration.
- 5). The State agrees to absorb the non-federal share of construction costs and its in-house preliminary engineering costs.
- 6). Rescind Ordinance 77 - 1992 dated 5-4-1992.

Section 2:

It is declared to be in the public interest that the consent of said City be and such consent is hereby given to the Director of Transportation to construct the above described improvement, in accordance with plans, specifications and estimates as approved by the Director.

Section 3:

The Director of Public Service and Safety of the City of Massillon, is hereby empowered and directed on behalf of the City to enter into agreements with the Director of Transportation necessary to complete the planning and construction of this improvement.

Section 4:

The traffic control devices installed within the limits of the project will conform with Section 4511 of the Ohio Revised Code.

Section 5:

Upon completion of said improvement, said City, will thereafter keep said highway open to traffic at all times, and

- (a) Maintain the improvement in accordance with the provisions of the statutes relating thereto and make ample financial and other provision for such maintenance; and
- (b) Maintain the right-of-way and keep it free of obstruction in a manner satisfactory to the State of Ohio and hold said right-of-way inviolate for public highway purposes and permit no signs, posters, billboards, roadside stands or other private installations within the right-of-way limits; and
- (c) Place and maintain all traffic control devices conforming to the Ohio Manual of Uniform Traffic Control Devices on the improvement in compliance with the provisions of Section 4511.11 and related sections of the Ohio Revised Code.
- (d) Regulate parking in the following manner:

Prohibit parking in accordance with Section 4511.66 of the Ohio Revised Code, unless otherwise controlled by local ordinance or resolution.

Section 6:

The following is further required to be in the said agreement:

- (a) That all existing street and public way right-of-way within the City which is necessary for the aforesaid improvement, shall be made available therefor.
- (b) That the City will acquire any additional right-of-way required for the construction of the aforesaid improvement.
- (c) That arrangements have been or will be made with and agreements obtained from all public utility companies whose line or structures will be affected by the said improvement and said companies have agreed to make any and all necessary plant removals or rearrangements in such manner as to be clear of any construction called for by the plans of said improvement and said companies have agreed to make such necessary rearrangements immediately after notification by said City or the Department of Transportation.
- (d) That it is hereby agreed that the City shall at its own expense, make all rearrangements of water mains, service lines, fire hydrants, valve boxes, sanitary sewers or other municipally owned utilities and/or any appurtenances thereto, which do not comply with the provision of Directive H-P-508 inside or outside the corporate limits as may be necessary to conform to the said improvement and rearrangements shall be done at such time as requested by the Department of Transportation Engineer.
- (e) That the construction, reconstruction, and/or rearrangement of both publicly and privately owned utilities, referred to in subsections (c) and (d) above, shall be done in such a manner as not to interfere unduly with the operation of the contractor constructing the improvement and all backfilling of trenches made necessary by such utility rearrangements shall be performed in accordance with the provisions of the Ohio Department of Transportation Construction and Material Specifications and shall be subject to approval by the State.
- (f) That the installation of all utility facilities on the right-of-way shall conform with the requirements of the Federal Highway Administration Policy and Procedure Memorandum 30-4 "Utilities Relocation and Adjustments" and the Department of Transportation's rules on Utility Accommodation.

- (g) That the City hereby agrees to accept responsibility for any and all damages or claims for which it is legally liable arising from the negligence of its officers, employees or agents in the performance of the City's obligations made or agreed to in Section (a), (b), (c), (d), (e) and (f) hereinabove. Likewise, the State agrees to accept responsibility for any and all damages or claims for which it is legally liable arising from the negligence of its officers, employees or agents in the performance of the State's obligations made or agreed to in Sections (a), (b), (c), (d), (e) and (f) hereinabove.

Section VII

This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure by reason of the need for expediting highway improvements to promote highway safety, and provided it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

Construct two additional ramps at existing S.R. 21 and Erie Street interchange.

said portion of highway within the municipal corporation limits being hereinafter referred to as the improvement, and

WHEREAS, the City further desires cooperation from the Ohio Director of Transportation in the planning, design and construction of said improvement.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MASSILLON, OHIO, THAT:

Section 1:

The City of Massillon hereby requests the cooperation of the Ohio Director of Transportation in the cost of the above described improvement as follows:

- 1). The City of Massillon agrees to assume and bear one hundred percent (100%) of preliminary engineering and right of way for the improvement.
- 2). The City of Massillon agrees to initially assume and bear the entire cost and expense of the Federal Share of the construction phase of the improvement at the time that the project is let for construction.
- 3). Upon completion of the project, as per agreement between the City and SCATS dated January 24, 1997, SCATS will make the Federal Funding available to allow the Director of Transportation to reimburse the City for the normal ~~eight~~ percent (80%) Federal share of all eligible items for the project in equal installments in July, 1998 and July, 1999 (State Fiscal Years 1999 and 2000).
- 4). The City of Massillon agrees to assume and bear one hundred percent (100%) of the cost of those features requested by the City which are not necessary for the improvement, as determined by the State and Federal Highway Administration.
- 5). The State agrees to absorb the non-federal share of construction costs and its in-house preliminary engineering costs.
- 6). Rescind Ordinance 77 - 1992 dated 5-4-1992.

Section 2:

It is declared to be in the public interest that the consent of said City be and such consent is hereby given to the Director of Transportation to construct the above described improvement, in accordance with plans, specifications and estimates as approved by the Director.

Section 3:

The Director of Public Service and Safety of the City of Massillon, is hereby empowered and directed on behalf of the City to enter into agreements with the Director of Transportation necessary to complete the planning and construction of this improvement.

Section 4:

The traffic control devices installed within the limits of the project will conform with Section 4511 of the Ohio Revised Code.

Section 5:

Upon completion of said improvement, said City, will thereafter keep said highway open to traffic at all times, and

- (a) Maintain the improvement in accordance with the provisions of the statutes relating thereto and make ample financial and other provision for such maintenance; and

Prohibit parking in accordance with Section 4511.66 of the Ohio Revised Code, unless otherwise controlled by local ordinance or resolution.

Section 6:

The following is further required to be in the said agreement:

- (a) That all existing street and public way right-of-way within the City which is necessary for the aforesaid improvement, shall be made available therefor.
- (b) That the State will acquire any additional right-of-way required for the construction of the aforesaid improvement.
- (c) That arrangements have been or will be made with and agreements obtained from all public utility companies whose line or structures will be affected by the said improvement and said companies have agreed to make any and all necessary plant removals or rearrangements in such manner as to be clear of any construction called for by the plans of said improvement and said companies have agreed to make such necessary rearrangements immediately after notification by said City or the Department of Transportation.
- (d) That it is hereby agreed that the City shall at its own expense, make all rearrangements of ~~water mains, service lines, fire hydrants, valve boxes, sanitary sewers~~ or other municipally owned utilities and/or any appurtenances thereto, which do not comply with the provision of Directive H-P-508 inside or outside the corporate limits as may be necessary to conform to the said improvement and rearrangements shall be done at such time as requested by the Department of Transportation Engineer.
- (e) That the construction, reconstruction, and/or rearrangement of both publicly and privately owned utilities, referred to in subsections (c) and (d) above, shall be done in such a manner as not to interfere unduly with the operation of the contractor constructing the improvement and all backfilling of trenches made necessary by such utility rearrangements shall be performed in accordance with the provisions of the Ohio Department of Transportation Construction and Material Specifications and shall be subject to approval by the State.
- (f) That the installation of all utility facilities on the right-of-way shall conform with the requirements of the Federal Highway Administration Policy and Procedure Memorandum 30-4 "Utilities Relocations and Adjustments" and the Department of Transportation's rules on Utility Accommodation.



- (g) That the City hereby agrees to accept responsibility for any and all damages or claims for which it is legally liable arising from the negligence of its officers, employees or agents in the performance of the City's obligations made or agreed to in Section (a), (b), (c), (d), (e) and (f) hereinabove. Likewise, the State agrees to accept responsibility for any and all damages or claims for which it is legally liable arising from the negligence of its officers, employees or agents in the performance of the State's obligations made or agreed to in Sections (a), (b), (c), (d), (e) and (f) hereinabove.

Section VII

This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure by reason of the need for expediting highway improvements to promote highway safety, and provided it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
