WHEREAS, the City of Massillon has encouraged the development of real property and the acquisition of personal property located in the area designated as an Enterprise Zone; and

WHEREAS, Canton Fabricators, Inc., dba R.J. Breinings & Sons, Inc., is desirous of investing \$280,000 to acquire and renovate the buildings located at 1115-1125 Industrial Avenue S.W., located within the Enterprise Zone and to purchase new machinery and equipment; and

WHEREAS, the Council of the City of Massillon, Ohio (hereinafter "Council") by Ordinance No. 163 - 1994 adopted a July 18, 1994, has designated an area of the City as an "Enterprise Zone" pursuant to Chapter 5709 of the Ohio Revised Code; and

WHEREAS, effective September 12, 1994, the Director of Development of the State of Ohio has determined that the aforementioned area designated in said Ordinance No. 163 - 1994 contains the characteristics set forth in 5709.61(A) of the Ohio Revised Code, and has certified said area as an Enterprise Zone under Chapter 5709; and

WHEREAS, The City of Massillon, having the appropriate authority for the stated type of project is desirous of providing Canton Fabricators, Inc., dba R.J. Breinings & Sons, Inc., with the incentives available for development of the Project in the said Enterprise Zone, under Chapter 5709 of the Ohio Revised Code; and

WHEREAS, Canton Fabricators, Inc., dba R.J. Breinings & Sons, Inc., has submitted a proposed agreement application, herein attached as Exhibit "A", to the City of Massillon, Ohio, requesting that the incentives available for development within the Enterprise Zone be approved for the project; and

This Ordinance is declared to be an emergency measure immediately necessary for the reason being that the materials, supplies and equipment to be purchased are needed for immediate use and for the preservation of the health, safety and welfare of the community. Provided it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the elected members to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon passage and approval by the Mayor. Otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

That this Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure, the reason for the emergency being that said funds must be deposited in the correct accounts and for the preservation of the public health, safety and welfare of the community. Provided it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the elected members to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor. Otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

TITLE: AN ORDINANCE authorizing the Director of Law and his co-counsel to file the necessary legal action against the Massillon Community Hospital and all necessary defendants for the purpose of preventing the sale of Massillon Community Hospital to Columbia/HCA Healthcare Corporation, and declaring an emergency.

WHEREAS, in 1904, James F. Pocock and Amelia E. Pocock donated certain real estate and funds for the purpose of the construction and operation of a non-profit hospital; and

WHEREAS, the Pocock deed contained certain conditions and restrictions that require the hospital to be used for the operation of a not for profit general hospital; and

WHEREAS, the deed required the property to pass to and become the property of the City of Massillon if it is not used for the operation of a not for profit general hospital or if it is sold and the proceeds of the sale are not used for the operation of a not for profit general hospital; and

WHEREAS, the City of Massillon has been informed by the Board of Trustees of the Massillon Community Hospital that the sale to Columbia/HCA Healthcare Corporation, a for profit corporation, shall be completed on or before March 31, 1997; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Ohio Revised Code, Section 753.53, it is necessary for this Council to authorize the Director of Law and his co-counsel to file court action on behalf of the City of Massillon.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MASSILLON, STATE OF OHIO, THAT:

Section 1:

It is necessary and it is in the best interest of the community of Massillon that legal action be taken to prevent the sale of Massillon Community Hospital to Columbia/HCA Healthcare Corporation.

Section 2:

The Director of Law of the City of Massillon and his co-counsel are hereby authorized to file the necessary legal action against the Massillon Community Hospital and all necessary defendants for the purpose of preventing the sale of Massillon Community Hospital to Columbia/HCA Healthcare Corporation.

Section 3:

The Director of Law is hereby authorized to issue vouchers to the Auditor of the City of Massillon, Ohio, directing prompt payment for all necessary costs and expenses associated with the legal action, and the City Auditor is authorized and directed to honor and pay said vouchers.

Section 4:

That this Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, welfare, and safety, and for the additional reason that it is necessary to file this legal action in that the Massillon Community Hospital has informed the City of Massillon that the sale to Columbia/HCA Healthcare Corporation will be complete on or before March 31, 1997 and that time is of the essence to file the lawsuit to prevent the sale. Provided it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Ohio Revised Code, Section 753.53, it is necessary for this Council to authorize the Director of Law and his co-counsel to file court action on behalf of the City of Massillon.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MASSILLON, STATE OF OHIO, THAT:

Section 1:

It is necessary and it is in the best interest of the community of Massillon that a declaratory judgment action be filed in order to determine what rights, if any, the City has in certain real estate owned by Massillon Community Hospital and the Health Group.

Section 2:

The Director of Law of the City of Massillon and his co-counsel are hereby authorized to file a declaratory judgment action in order to determine what rights that the City of Massillon has in the "Property".

Section 3:

The Director of Law is hereby authorized to issue vouchers to the Auditor of the City of Massillon, Ohio, directing prompt payment for all necessary costs and expenses associated with the legal action, and the City Auditor is authorized and directed to honor and pay said vouchers.

Section 4:

That this Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, welfare, and safety, and for the additional reason that it is necessary to file this legal action in that the Massillon Community Hospital Trustees and the Health Group have informed the City of Massillon that the sale of the hospital to a for profit corporation will be complete on or before March 31, 1997 and that time is of the essence to file the declaratory action to determine the rights of the City. Provided it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
