WHEREAS, the City of Massillon carries out a variety of economic development programs designed to promote the creation and expansion of business and industry in the community, with a special emphasis on the revitalization of the area; and

WHEREAS, United Studios of America Marketing Association, Inc., ("USAMA") a portable photographic service franchise corporation, desires to relocate its national headquarters in Massillon through the acquisition of property located at 641 Lincoln Way West; and

WHEREAS, United Studios of America Marketing Association, Inc., also proposes to locate in this same building its Cleveland/Canton/Massillon franchise, a company running its Toledo/Detroit franchise operations; a quality-control company serving only USAMA franchises; and a photographic development laboratory; and

WHEREAS, United Studios of America Marketing Association, Inc., through this proposed business relocation and expansion, plans to provide approximately 58-80 jobs in Massillon within a twelve month period; and

WHEREAS, the City of Massillon proposes to assist United Studios of America Marketing Association, Inc., in this proposed relocation and expansion by providing an economic development "inducement grant", the purpose of which is to help offset the company's costs in acquiring the project site, establishing operations in Massillon, and installing the photographic development lab.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MASSILLON, STATE OF OHIO, THAT:

## Section 1:

This Council hereby approves and authorizes the Mayor to enter into an agreement with United Studios of America Marketing Association, Inc., providing an economic development "inducement grant," in a total amount not to exceed Forty Thousand Dollars (\$40,000.00), for the purpose of assisting the company in relocating to and expanding its operations in Massillon. This "inducement grant" shall be provided as follows:

- \$20,000 shall be provided to United Studios of America Marketing Association, Inc., or its designee upon the purchase of the property at 641 Lincoln Way West, Massillon, and the establishment of its business and franchise operations at this location.
- An additional \$20,000 shall be provided to United Studios of America Marketing Association, Inc., upon completion of the installation of the photographic development laboratory at the 641 Lincoln Way West, property.
- 3. This "inducement grant" shall be provided in the form of a deferred payment loan, at 0% interest, for a five year term. The balance on said deferred payment loan shall be reduced by 20% each year that the company or any related entity of the company continues to occupy the project site. At the end of the five year period, the balance on said deferred payment loan shall be \$0.00, and no payment shall be required, provided that the company or any related entity of the company is still in operation at the project site.

#### Section 2:

In return for this economic development grant assistance, United Studios of America Marketing Association, Inc., shall provide the City with information regarding the number of jobs that it has provided as a result of the company's relocation and expansion in Massillon.

#### Section 3:

This Ordinance is declared to be an emergency measure immediately necessary for the preservation of the health, safety, and welfare of the community and for the additional reason that it is necessary to improve the economic climate of the community through the expansion of business and employment opportunities. Provided it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the elected members to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor. Otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE USE OF A PORTION OF THE PROCEEDS OF THE PROPOSED MAXIMUM \$ 3,000,000.00 RECREATION BONDS, OR NOTES PARKS AND ANTICIPATION THEREOF, OF THE CITY, DATED NOT EARLIER THAN JUNE 1, 1997, TO BE ISSUED FOR THE PURPOSE OF PARKS AND RECREATION, INCLUDING ACQUIRING REAL PROPERTY AND INTERESTS IN REAL PROPERTY FOR PARKS AND RECREATION PURPOSES; RENOVATING, REPAIRING AND IMPROVING EXISTING PARK FACILITIES, FURNISHING AND EQUIPPING ALL OF THE FOREGOING; AND LANDSCAPING AND IMPROVING THE SITES THEREOF, TO REIMBURSE THE CITY'S GENERAL OR CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT FUNDS FOR MONEYS PREVIOUSLY ADVANCED FOR SUCH PURPOSE, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the City of Massillon (the "City") may advance costs for the above-referenced purpose (the "Project") from its General or Capital Improvement Funds; and

WHEREAS, the City desires to reimburse any such costs with a portion of the proceeds of the above-referenced bonds (the "Bonds").

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MASSILLON, COUNTY OF STARK, STATE OF OHIO, THAT:

Section 1. The City intends that this resolution constitute an "official intent" for purposes of Section 1.150-2(e) of the Treasury Regulations prescribed under the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, and declares its intention to use a portion of the proceeds of the Bonds to reimburse the City for expenses of the Project advanced from its General or Capital Improvement Funds.

Section 2. It is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the passage of this resolution were taken in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action, were in

moetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.
Section 3. This resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety of the City and its inhabitants for the reason that the City has an opportunity to obtain real property and interests in real property for park purposes at a favorable price; wherefore this resolution shall take effect and be in force from and immediately after its adoption.
