Ltd., the Lessor, providing for the adoption of a project which will establish a facility and preserve employment opportunities within the City of Massillon Enterprise Zone, and declaring an emergency.

WHEREAS, the City of Massillon has encouraged the development of real property and the acquisition of personal property located in the area designated as an Enterprise Zone; and

WHEREAS, Republic Engineered Steel Inc., and J.J. & W.V. Ltd., the Lessor, are proposing to construct a new facility on 5.53 acre parcel located within the Massillon Enterprise Zone, and Republic Engineered Steel Inc., and J.J. & W.V. Ltd., the Lessor, are proposing to relocate its manufacturing, warehouse, sales and corporate office operations to this new facility, at a total combined investment of \$2,974,000.00 (hereinafter the "Project"), provided that the appropriate development incentives are available to support the economic viability of said Project; and

WHEREAS, the Council of the City of Massillon, Ohio, (hereinafter "Council") by Ordinance No. 163-1994, adopted on July 18, 1994, has designated an area of the City as an "Enterprise Zone" pursuant to Chapter 5709 of the Ohio Revised Code; and

WHEREAS, effective September 12, 1994, the Director of Development of the State of Ohio has determined that the aforementioned area designated in said Ordinance No. 163 - 1994 contains the characteristics set forth in 5709.61(A) of the Ohio Revised Code, and has certified said area as an Enterprise Zone under Chapter 5709; and

WHEREAS, the City of Massillon, having the appropriate authority for the stated type of project is desirous of providing Republic Engineered Steel Inc., and J.J. & W.V. Ltd., the Lessor, with the incentives available for development of the Project in said Enterprise Zone, under Chapter 5709 of the Ohio Revised Code; and

WHEREAS, Republic Engineered Steel Inc., and J.J. & W.V. Ltd., the Lessor, have submitted a proposed agreement application, herein attached as Exhibit "A", to the City of Massillon, Ohio, requesting that the incentives available for development within the Enterprise Zone be approved for the Project; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor of the City of Massillon, Ohio, has investigated the application submitted by Republic Engineered Steel Inc., and J.J. & W.V. Ltd., the Lessor, and has recommended approval of the same to the Council on the basis that the companies are qualified by financial responsibility and business experience to preserve employment opportunities and said Enterprise Zone and to improve the economic climate of the City of Massillon; and

WHEREAS, the project site is located in the Massillon City School District and the Board of Education has been notified in accordance with Section 5709.83 and have been given a copy of the application.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MASSILLON, STATE OF OHIO, THAT:

#### Section 1:

This Ordinance is declared to be an emergency measure immediately necessary for the preservation of the health, Safety and welfare of the City of Massillon, Ohio and for the further reason that approval of said agreement is necessary so as to maximize the investment that will be made by Republic Engineered Steel Inc., and J.J. & W.V. Ltd., the Lessor, within the City of Massillon, Ohio. Provided it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the elected members to Council it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

#### OHIO ENTERPRISE ZONE AGREEMENT

This Agreement made and entered into by and between the City of Massillon, Ohio, a municipal corporation, with its main offices located at One James Duncan Plaza, Massillon, Ohio 44646 (hereinafter referred to as "City of Massillon"), Republic Engineered Steel, Inc., an Ohio Corporation with its main offices located at 410 Oberlin Road, S.W., Massillon, Ohio 44647, (hererinafter referred to as "RES"), and JJ&W V Ltd., the Lessor, an Ohio Limited Partnership with its offices located at 1621 Allen Avenue, S.E., Canton, Ohio 44707 (hereinafter referred to as "JJ&W").

#### WITNESSETH:

Whereas, the City of Massillon has encouraged the development of real property and the acquisition of personal property located in the area designated as an Enterprise Zone; and

Whereas, RES and JJ&W are desirous of establishing a facility within the Enterprise Zone through the construction of a new thirty-four thousand three hundred eighty (34,380) square foot building that will centralize, restructure and relocate all of Republic Engineered Steel's current machine and fabrication shop operations in Stark County into one facility, improving efficiency and streamlining operations while also preserving employment opportunities (hereinafter referred to as the "Project"), provided that the appropriate development incentives are available to support the economic viability of said Project; and

Whereas, the Council of the City of Massillon, Ohio (hereinafter "Council") by Ordinance No. 163-1994, adopted on July 18, 1994, has designated an area of the City as an "Enterprise Zone" pursuant to Chapter 5709 of the Ohio Revised Code; and

Whereas, effective September 12, 1994, the Director of Development of the State of Ohio has determined that the aforementioned area designated in said Ordinance No. 163-1994 contains the characteristics set forth in 5709.61 (A) of the Ohio Revised Code, and has certified said area as an Enterprise Zone under Chapter 5709; and

Whereas, the City of Massillon, having the appropriate authority for the stated type of project, is desirous of providing RES and JJ&W with the incentives available for development of the Project in the said Enterprise Zone, under Chapter 5709 of the Ohio Revised Code; and

Whereas, RES and JJ&W have submitted a proposed agreement application, herein attached as Exhibit A, (hereinafter referred to as the "Application") to the City of Massillon, Ohio, requesting that the incentives available for development within the Enterprise Zone be approved for the Project; and

Whereas, RES and JJ&W have remitted the required state application fee of \$500.00 made payable to the Ohio Department of Development with the application to be forwarded with the final agreement; and

Whereas, the Mayor of the City of Massillon, Ohio, has investigated the Application submitted by RES and JJ&W, and has recommended approval of the same to the Council on the basis that the enterprise is qualified by financial responsibility and business experience to create and preserve employment opportunities in said Enterprise Zone and to improve the economic climate of the City of Massillon; and

Whereas, the project site as proposed by RES and JJ&W is located in the Massillon City School District and the Board of Education of said district and any applicable Joint Vocational School District have been notified in accordance with Section 5709.83 and been given a copy of the Application; and

Whereas, pursuant to Section 5709.62(C) and in conformance with the format required under Section 5709.631 of the Ohio Revised Code, the parties hereto desire to set forth their agreement with respect to matters hereinafter contained.

Now, therefore, in consideration of the mutual covenants herein contained and the benefit to be derived by the parties from the execution hereof, the parties herein agree as follows:

#### Section 1:

RES and JJ&W shall construct a new thirty-four thousand three hundred eighty (34,380) square foot building at 4135 Commerce Drive, S.W., Massillon, Ohio, to house Republic Engineered Steel's machine and fabrication shop operations that are being consolidated and relocated to this facility from the company's four existing Stark County steel plants. Said new facility shall be constructed on an 5.530 acre parcel of land, known as and being Part of Out Lot 587, in the City of Massillon, Stark County, Ohio.

The Project will involve a total investment by RES and JJ&W of (\$2,974,000) Two Million Nine Hundred Seventy-Four Thousand Dollars, plus or minus 10%, at the proposed project site. Included in this investment are (\$2,128,000) Two Million One Hundred Twenty-Eight Thousand Dollars for construction of the new facility; and (\$846,000) Eight Hundred Forty-Six Thousand Dollars to purchase first used machinery and equipment; furniture and fixtures.

In addition, RES will relocate and use at the project site existing machinery and equipment, with a total approximate value of (\$143,688) One Hundred Forty-Three Thousand Six Hundred Eighty-Eight Dollars.

The Enterprise has reported that it does not have an existing base level of inventory at the project site, and further, that all inventory relocated to the project site from existing facilities will not be subject to the tax exemptions granted under this agreement..

The Project will begin in July 1997, and all acquisition, construction, and installation will be completed by November 1997.

The total investment by RES and JJ&W in undertaking this Project and establishing the new facility represents a significant new investment on behalf of the enterprise, and as such, the City of Massillon hereby determines that the Project is eligible for the tax incentives and other benefits as described in this Agreement.

If, at any time, RES and JJ&W determine that they will not undertake all the improvements set forth in this Section I, or otherwise desire to modify the Project, RES and JJ&W will notify the City of Massillon, stating the reasons for its determination. The parties will thereupon confer to discuss the effect of the enterprise's determination on the tax exemptions provided herein and to amend or terminate this Agreement accordingly. In no event shall any such amendment operate to revoke retroactively the tax exemptions provided herein.

#### Section 2:

RES currently has 3221 full-time permanent employees in the State of Ohio. RES will be relocating to the Enterprise Zone Project Site 43 existing full-time permanent employees from the following locations: 15 existing full-time permanent employees will be relocated from the enterprise's two Massillon plants located at 410 Oberlin Road, S.W., and 401 Rose Avenue, S.E.; and 28 existing full-time permanent employees will be relocated from the enterprise's two Canton plants located at 2633 8th Street, N.E., and 2201 Harrison Avenue, S.E. RES will use its best efforts to retain these 43 existing full-time permanent jobs at the Project Site.

The retention of these existing jobs will maintain the company's current annual payroll for these jobs of (\$1,441,000) One Million Four Hundred Forty-One Thousand Dollars.

#### Section 3:

RES and JJ&W shall provide to the proper Tax Incentive Review Council any information reasonably required by the council to evaluate the enterprise's compliance with the agreement, including returns filed pursuant to section 5711.02 of the Ohio Revised code if requested by the council. RES and JJ&W shall also be required to supply a copy of the Ohio Department of Taxation State Tax return form 913 to the Tax Incentive Review Council for each year the agreement is in effect or required to be reviewed.

#### Section 4:

The City of Massillon hereby grants a tax exemption pursuant to Section 5709.62 for eligible new tangible personal property acquired in conjunction with the Project, including, a new Gidding and Lewis table type CNC horizontal boring mill, office equipment and furniture. This tax exemption shall be at the rate of 75% on all machinery and equipment acquired as part of the Project. Each identified project improvement will receive a ten year exemption period. The exemption commences the first year for which the tangible personal property would first be taxable were that property not exempted from taxation. No exemption shall commence after December 31, 1998 nor extend beyond December 31, 2008

#### Section 5:

The City of Massillon hereby grants RES and JJ&W a tax exemption for real property improvements made to the Project Site pursuant to Section 5709.62 of the Ohio Revised Code. This tax exemption shall be at the rate of 75%. Each identified project improvement will receive a ten year exemption period. The exemption commences the first year for which the real property exemption would first be taxable were that property not exempted from taxation. No exemption shall commence after December 31, 1998, nor extend beyond December 31, 2008.

RES and JJ&W must file the appropriate tax forms (DTE 23) with the County Auditor and (#913) with the State Department of Taxation to effect and maintain the exemptions covered in the agreement. The #913 Ohio tax form must be filed annually.

#### Section 6:

Waivers under section 5709.633 of the revised code: not applicable.

#### Section 7

RES and JJ&W shall pay to the City of Massillon an annual monitoring fee of (\$500) Five Hundred Dollars for each year the agreement is in effect. The fee shall be made payable to the City of Massillon and shall be paid by certified check and delivered to the Mayor by March 31 of each year that the fee is due and payable. This fee shall be deposited in a special fund created for such purpose and shall be used exclusively for the purpose of complying with section 5709.68 of the revised code and by the tax incentive review council created under section 5709.85 of the revised code exclusively for the purposes of performing the duties prescribed under that section.

#### Section 8:

RES and JJ&W shall pay such real and tangible personal property taxes as are not exempted under this agreement and are charged against such property and shall file all tax reports and returns as required by law. If the enterprises fail to pay such taxes or file such returns and reports, all incentives granted under this agreement are rescinded beginning with the year for which such taxes are charged or such reports or returns are required to be filed and thereafter.

#### Section 9:

The City of Massillon shall perform such acts as are reasonably necessary or appropriate to effect, claim, reserve, and maintain exemptions from taxation granted under this Agreement including, without limitation, joining in the execution of all documentation and providing any necessary certificates required in connection with such exemptions.

#### Section 10:

If for any reason the Enterprise Zone designation expires, the Director of the Ohio Department of Development revokes certification of the zone, or the City of Massillon revokes the designation of the zone, entitlements granted under this agreement shall continue for the number of years specified under this agreement, unless RES and JJ&W materially fail to fulfill their obligations under this Agreement and the City of Massillon terminates or modifies the exemptions from taxation under this agreement.

#### Section 11:

If RES and JJ&W materially fail to fulfill its obligations under this Agreement, or if the City of Massillon determines that the certification as to delinquent taxes required by this agreement is fraudulent, the City of Massillon may terminate or modify the exemptions from taxation granted under this Agreement.

#### Section 12:

RES and JJ&W hereby certify that at the time this agreement is executed, RES and/or JJ&W do not owe any delinquent real or tangible personal property taxes to any taxing authority in the State of Ohio, and does not owe delinquent taxes for which RES and/or JJ&W is liable under Chapter 5733., 5735., 5739., 5741., 5743., 5747., or 5753. of the Revised Code, or, if such delinquent taxes are owed, RES and/or JJ&W currently are paying the delinquent taxes pursuant to an undertaking enforceable by the State of Ohio or an agent or instrumentality thereof, has filed a petition of bankruptcy under 11 U.S.C.A. 101, et seq., or such a petition has been filed against RES and/or JJ&W. For the purposes of the certification, delinquent taxes are taxes that remain unpaid on the latest day prescribed for payment without penalty under the chapter of the Revised code governing payment of those taxes.

#### Section 13:

RES and/or JJ&W affirmatively covenants that it does not owe: (1) any delinquent taxes to the State of Ohio or a political subdivision of the State: (2) any moneys to the State or a state agency for the administration or enforcement of any environmental laws of the State; and (3) any other moneys to the State, a state agency or a political subdivision of the State that are past due, whether the amounts owed are being contested in a court of law or not.

#### Section 14:

RES, JJ&W and the City of Massillon acknowledge that this Agreement must be approved by formal action of the legislative authority of the City of Massillon as a condition for the agreement to take effect. This Agreement takes effect upon such approval.

#### Section 15:

The City of Massillon has developed a policy to ensure recipients of Enterprise Zone tax benefits practice non-discriminating hiring in its operations. By executing this agreement, RES and JJ&W are committing to following non-discriminating hiring practices acknowledging that no individual may be denied employment solely on the basis of race, religion, sex, disability, color, national origin, or ancestry.

#### Section 16:

Exemptions from taxation granted under this agreement shall be revoked if it is determined that RES, JJ&W, any successor enterprise, or any related member (as those terms are defined in Section 5709.61 of the Ohio Revised Code) has violated the prohibition against entering into this agreement under Division (E) of Section 3735.671 or Section 5709.62 of the Ohio Revised Code prior to the time prescribed by that division or either of those sections.

#### Section 17:

This Agreement is not transferrable or assignable without the express, written approval of the City of Massillon.

#### Section 18:

RES and JJ&W affirmatively covenants that it has made no false statements to the State or local political subdivision in the process of obtaining approval for the Enterprise Zone incentives. If any representative of RES and JJ&W has knowingly made a false statement to the State or local political subdivision to obtain the Enterprise Zone

incentives, RES and JJ&W shall be required to immediately return all benefits received under the Enterprise Zone Agreement pursuant to ORC Section 9.66(C)(2) and shall be ineligible for any future economic development assistance from the State, any state agency, or a political subdivision pursuant ORC 9.66(C)(1). Any persons who provides a false statement to secure economic development assistance may be guilty of falsification, a misdemeanor of the first degree, pursuant ORC 2931.13(D)(1), which is punishable by a fine of not more than \$1,000 and/or a term of imprisonment of not more than six months.

## 15 - b. Business's reasons for requesting tax incentives:

Republic Engineered Steels, Inc. operates four (4) plants in Stark County each having it's own shops and crafts to maintain and repair equipment. An utilization evaluation, including a complete inventory of the equipment was recently performed on all Stark County Shops and Crafts operations. The evaluation shows that the Stark County Shops on an individual plant basis are marginally effective and, as a whole for Stark County, there are greater deficiencies in the utilization of both equipment and personnel. These deficiencies include: operating inefficient equipment while more efficient equipment is under utilized; redundant equipment and overlapping capability; only the day turn is covered; and support facilities that are duplicated. These all contribute to a maintenance structure that is inefficient at the individual plant, and is, on a county wide basis, grossly inefficient and uneconomical for Republic to support because it utilizes neither employee or equipment in the most cost efficient and productive manner.

The savings generated will help us to be more competative, keep our overall cost of production down, and inline with the oversea market.

Submission of this application expressly authorizes the City of Massillon, Ohio to contact the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency to confirm statements contained within this application including item #7 and to review applicable confidential records. 
