RESOLUTION NO. 13 - 1997

BY: SEWER AND WASTE DISPOSAL COMMITTEE

TITLE: A RESOLUTION directing the City Engineer and the Director of Public Service and Safety to prepare cost estimates, plans, profiles and specifications; along with a Resolution declaring it necessary for construction of sanitary sewer for the Fothergill/Belmont Area.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MASSILLON, STATE OF OHIO, THAT:

Section 1:

It is necessary to construct sanitary sewer on 29th Street N.W., Belmere Avenue N.W., Starbrook Street N.W., Crest Circle N.W., Stanton Avenue N.W., Noble Place N.W. and Gordon Avenue N.W.

Section 2:

That it is determined that the improvement aforesaid is conducive to the public health, convenience and welfare. Council hereby finds that said improvement has been petitioned for by the owners of more than 60% of the foot frontage of the property abutting upon said improvement.

Section 3:

That plans, specifications, cost estimates and profiles of the proposed improvement heretofore will be prepared by the City Engineer and be on file with the Clerk of Council in the office of the Director of Public Service and Safety of the City of Massillon, Ohio.

That the grade of said improvement shall be at the grade as shown on the City Engineer's plans and profiles.

Section 4:

Council hereby determines that the whole cost of said improvement shall be assessed by front footage of the property bounding and abutting on the improvement upon all lands bounding and abutting upon the proposed improvement, which said lands are hereby determined to be especially benefitted by said improvement. The cost of said improvement shall include the expense of the preliminary and other surveys, plans, specifications, profiles and estimates, and of printing and publishing notices, resolutions, and ordinances required and the serving of said notices, the amount of damages resulting from the improvement, and the cost of construction; together with interest on notes and bonds issued in anticipation of the collection of deferred assessments and all other necessary expenditures.

Section 5:

That the assessments to be levied shall be in forty (40) semi annual installments with interest on deferred payments at the same rate as shall be borne by the bond to be issued in anticipation of the collection thereof, provided that the owner of any property assessed may, at his option, pay such assessment in cash within 30 days after passage of the assessing ordinance.

Section 6:

That the Bonds of the City of Massillon shall be issued in anticipation of the collection of assessments by installments and in amount equal thereto, and notes of said City shall be issued in anticipation of the issuance of such bonds.

Section 7:

That the City Engineer is directed to prepare and file with the Clerk of this Council estimated assessments of the cost of the improvement described in this resolution in accordance with the method of assessment set forth in this resolution and based upon the estimate of cost now on file with the Clerk of this Council, showing the assessment against each lot or parcel of land to be assessed. Such estimated assessments shall be kept by said Clerk on file in the office of the Director of Public Service and Safety and shall be available for inspection by any interested person. Upon the filing of said estimates, the Clerk of this Council is directed to cause notice of the adoption of this Resolution and the filing of said estimated assessments to be served on the owners of all lands to be assessed in the manner provided by R.C. 727.13.

Section 8:

That whereas a petition subscribed by the owners of more than 60% of the property abutting the hereinafter described improvement has been filed with this Council requesting the improvement by special assessment upon the abutting property owners of the Fothergill/Belmont Area by the construction of sanitary sewer. The Director of Public Services and Safety of the City of Massillon and the City Engineer of said City are hereby directed to prepare plans, specifications and profiles of the aforesaid improvements with reference to the property abutting thereon, and an estimate of the cost of the improvement showing, among other things, the amount allocated to labor and materials, the total cost and the apportionment, if any, between the property owners and the City. The Director of Public Service and Safety and the City Engineer are further directed upon completion of the aforesaid data to file the same in the office of the Clerk of Council of the City of Massillon, where it shall be maintained open to inspection of all persons interested.

Section 9:

This Resolution shall be in effect immediately from and after passage and upon approval by the Mayor.
