

GRANT OF EASEMENT OF RIGHT OF WAY

THE CITY OF MASSILLON, OHIO, a municipal incorporation of Stark County, Ohio, the Grantor, for the agreements set forth below, One Dollar and other valuable consideration paid, grants to RICHARD H. IRWIN and SHERRY L. IRWIN, Grantees, whose tax mailing address is 13090 Wooster Street NW, Massillon, Stark County, Ohio, an easement of right of way for ingress and egress, the parameters of said easement being described as follows:

Situated in the Township of Tuscarawas, County of Stark and State of Ohio, and known as and being part of the Southwest Quarter of Section 3, (T-12,R-10), more fully bounded and described as follows, to-wit:

Beginning at the northwest corner of said Southwest Quarter of Section 3, thence S03°05'W along the west line of said Section, a distance of 66.0 feet to the northwest corner of a tract of land now or formerly owned By L. Kurtz, thence S86°38'E along the north line of said Kurtz tract and the north line of a tract of land now or formerly owned by R. & L. Graybill, a distance of 680.46 feet to the northwest corner of a 4.222 acre tract of land now or formerly owned by R. & S. Irwin, said corner being the true place of beginning for the easement herein described;

- Thence N03°22'E a distance of 66.0 feet to the south line of a 1.003 acre tract of land now or formerly owned by R. & R. Irwin;
- Thence S86°38'E along the south line of said 1.003 acre, Irwin tract, a distance of 10.00 feet to a point;
- Thence S03°22'W a distance of 66.0 feet to a point on the north line of said 4.222 acre, Irwin tract;
- Thence N86°38'W along the north line of said 4.222 acre tract, a distance of 10.00 feet to the true place of beginning.


The above described ingress and egress easement contains 0.015 of an acre of land (660 square feet), as surveyed under the supervision of Bruce D. Conery, P.S. no. 6499 of Buckeye Surveying Services, Inc. of Canton, Ohio, in April of 1998, and is part of a tract of land conveyed to the City of Massillon by a deed recorded in Official Record Imaging No. 95055122;

to pass on foot (or with domestic animals, lawn equipment, etc.) over the property of Grantor (as conveyed to Grantor by a deed recorded in Official Record Imaging Instrument No. 95055122). Said easement is otherwise described in the attached Exhibit "A".

Said easement shall be only for residential purposes incidental to Grantees' use of the otherwise noncomiguous tracts of land of Grantees (as conveyed to Grantees by deed recorded in Official Records Vol. 317, Page 376). Further, said easement is non-exclusive; without limiting the foregoing, it is specifically agreed and acknowledged by the parties said easement shall not interfere with the Grantor's use of its property as a city park and/or recreational trail for the general public.

Additionally, this grant is conditioned upon Grantees maintaining the easement right-of-way at their own expense; however, nothing herein shall be construed as requiring Grantees to maintain or take any other sort of responsibility for the Grantor's use of its property. Further, any improvement or structural changes Grantees may require for the actual means of ingress and egress over the easement shall be conditioned upon prior written approval by Grantor, which approval will not be unreasonably withheld.

RESOLUTION NO. 12 - 1998

BY: COMMITTEE OF THE WHOLE

TITLE: A RESOLUTION providing for the submission to the electors of the City of Massillon at a Special Election on August 4, 1998, the question of the approval of the issue of a renewal of a one (1) Mill Operating Levy to provide continued funding for the Massillon Museum which is operated by the Massillon Museum, Inc., a non-profit corporation, and declaring an emergency.

WHEREAS, the amount of revenues which will be raised by the City of Massillon, Ohio, within the ten mill limitation by levies on the current tax duplicate of the City of Massillon will be insufficient to provide adequate funds for the City of Massillon, to provide for a free Museum of Art, Science, or History that is maintained and operated by a private, non-profit organization as authorized by Section 5705.19 (AA) of the Ohio Revised Code; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary to levy a renewal of a tax in excess of the ten mill limitation for the purpose of providing funds to provide for a free Museum of Art, Science, or History that is maintained and operated by a private, non-profit organization.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MASSILLON, STATE OF OHIO, THAT:

Section 1:

There shall be submitted to the electors of the City of Massillon at a Special Election on August 4, 1998, the question of the approval of issues providing for the levy of a renewal of a tax in the amount of one (1) Mill for each One Dollar (\$1.00) of valuation, which amounts to Ten Cents (.10¢) per One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) of valuation for a period of Five (5) years, to wit: 1998, 1999, 2000, 2001 and 2002 for the purpose of providing for a free Museum of Art, Science, or History that is maintained and operated by a private, non-profit organization as authorized by Section 5705.19(AA) of the Ohio Revised Code.

Section 2:

The Clerk of Council is hereby directed to certify to the Board of Election of Stark County, Ohio, a copy of this Resolution upon the enactment of this Resolution for its submission to the electors of the City of Massillon, Ohio, for the question of its passage at the Special Election to be held on August 4, 1997. The Clerk of Council is directed to request the Board of Elections to provide notice of election on the question of levying said renewal tax as required by law. The Clerk shall also provide the Board of Elections with a proposed sample ballot which is attached to this Resolution.

Section 3:

That this Resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure and shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval by the Mayor. The reason for the emergency lies in the fact that the immediate enactment of this Resolution is necessary to provide for the orderly submission of the proposed levy to the electors of the City of Massillon in the interest of the public welfare and for the levy of a tax as provided in this Resolution in order to obtain sufficient revenue for the operation of a free Museum of Art, Science or History.

ORDINANCE NO. 120 - 1998

TITLE: AN ORDINANCE repealing Ordinance No. 162 - 1995 and enacting a new ordinance to accept the Final Plat for the University Village Phase I in the City of Massillon, Stark County, Ohio, presently on file in the office of the City Engineer, and declaring an emergency.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MASSILLON, STATE OF OHIO, THAT:

Section 1:

Ordinance No. 162 - 1995 is hereby repealed.

Section 2:

The Final Plat for University Village Phase I in the City of Massillon, Stark County, Ohio, presently on file in the Office of the City Engineer and designated as File No. 98PS05 be, and the same is approved and accepted and that the dedication to public use of the streets and alleys thereon shown, be, and the same is hereby accepted and confirmed. This plat was approved by the Planning Commission at a meeting held April 8, 1998. The undertaking given by the owners for improvement of streets and now on file with the City Engineer is approved. The description of University Village Phase I is as follows:

Being Known as part of Out Lot 557, a 16.733 acre parcel located on University Drive S.E., north of Nave Road S.E. and between St. Andrews Golf Estates and Richville Drive. This first phase development in the University Village Phase I subdivision will create a total of 46 single family residential lots. Also included in this plat is the dedication of the following streets: University Drive S.E.; Malone Avenue S.E.; Xavier Drive S.E.; Urbana Avenue S.E.; and Wilmington Avenue S.E.

Section 3:

This Ordinance is declared to be an emergency measure for the reason that said plat is urgently needed for the development of this area and for the proper community growth and hence immediately necessary for the preservation of the health, safety and welfare of the community. Provided it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the elected members to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
