NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MASSILLON, STATE OF OHIO: THAT

## Section 1:

Existing Section 505.11 "Hunting Prohibited" of CHAPTER 505 "ANIMALS AND FOWL" of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Massillon is hereby repealed.

#### Section 2:

That there is hereby enacted a new Section 505.11 "Hunting Prohibited" of CHAPTER 505 "ANIMALS AND FOWL" of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Massillon and which shall read as follows:

### 505.11 HUNTING PROHIBITED

- (a) No person shall hunt or pursue game within the corporate limits, except on premises zoned A-2 General Agricultural.
- (b) No person shall hunt or pursue game on premises zoned A-2 General Agricultural in a manner that is unsafe or without due regard for the safety of persons or property.
- (c) No person shall hunt or pursue game on premises zoned A-2 General Agricultural who is not an owner or resident of the premise.
- (d) No person shall hunt or pursue game on premises zoned A-2 General Agricultural except for domestic consumption or pest or vermin control.
- (e) It shall be prima-facie evidence of hunting if a person is found within the corporate limits with any firearm, bow and arrow or other similar weapon, if such weapon is loaded or with the firing mechanism in a closed position so that the weapon could be fired if loaded.
- (f) Whoever violates this section is guilty of a misdemeanor of the fourth degree.

### Section 3:

This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure, the reason for the emergency being that said enactment is needed to amend the City's ordinances concerning the prohibition of hunting in certain areas within the City and for the additional reason for the preservation of the public health, safety and welfare of the community. Provided it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the elected members to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor. Otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MASSILLON, STATE OF OHIO: THAT

## Section 1:

Existing Section 549.10 "Discharging Firearms" of CHAPTER 549 "WEAPONS AND EXPLOSIVES" of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Massillon is hereby repealed.

#### Section 2:

That there is hereby enacted a new Section 549.10 "Discharging Firearms" of CHAPTER 549 "WEAPONS AND EXPLOSIVES" of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Massillon and which shall read as follows:

#### 549.10 DISCHARGING FIREARMS

- (a) No person shall discharge any air gun, rifle, shotgun, revolver, pistol or other firearm within the corporate limit of the municipality, except on premises zoned A-2 General Agricultural.
- (b) No person shall discharge any air gun, rifle, shotgun, revolver, pistol or other firearm within the corporate limit of the municipality, except on premises zoned A-2 General Agricultural and in a manner that is safe or with due regard for the safety of persons or property.
- (c) No person shall discharge any air gun, rifle, shotgun, revolver, pistol or other firearm on premises zoned A-2 General Agricultural who is not an owner or resident of the premise.
- (e) This section does not apply when firearms are used in self defense, in discharge of official duty or when otherwise legally authorized.
- (f) Whoever violates this section is guilty of a misdemeanor of the fourth degree.

#### Section 3:

This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure, the reason for the emergency being that said enactment is needed to amend the City's ordinances concerning the discharging of firearms within certain areas of City and for the additional reason for the preservation of the public health, safety and welfare of the community. Provided it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the elected members to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor. Otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MASSILLON, STATE OF OHIO: THAT

#### Section 1:

Existing Section 557.08(a) "Cutting and Destroying Weeds Required" of CHAPTER 557 "WEEDS AND TREES" of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Massillon is hereby repealed.

#### Section 2:

That there is hereby enacted a new Section 557.08(a) "Cutting and Destroying Weeds Required" of CHAPTER 557 "WEEDS AND TREES" of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Massillon and which shall read as follows:

### 557.08 CUTTING AND DESTROYING WEEDS REQUIRED

(a) <u>Prohibitions.</u> No person, whether as owner, lessee, agent, tenant or any other person having charge or care of land in the City, shall permit noxious weeds or other undesirable vegetation, grasses, etc., to grow thereon to a height in excess of twelve inches, or to mature their seeds thereon, or fail to cut and destroy such weeds and other undesirable vegetation when notified by the Director of Public Safety and Service to do so. This provision shall not apply to premised zoned A-2 General Agricultural when the premised are utilized in pursuit of a reasonable agricultural use.

## Section 3:

This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure, the reason for the emergency being that said enactment is needed to amend the City's ordinances concerning the cutting and destroying weeds required within the City and for the additional reason for the preservation of the public health, safety and welfare of the community. Provided it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the elected members to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor. Otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

TITLE: AN ORDINANCE amending PART ELEVEN - PLANNING AND ZONING CODE - TITLE FIVE of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Massillon, by the addition of a new CHAPTER 1174 "A-2 GENERAL AGRICULTURAL DISTRICT" of PART ELEVEN - PLANNING AND ZONING CODE - TITLE FIVE, and declaring an emergency.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MASSILLON, STATE OF OHIO, THAT:

### Section 1:

That there be and hereby is enacted a new CHAPTER 1174 "A-2 GENERAL AGRICULTURAL DISTRICT" of PART ELEVEN - PLANNING AND ZONING CODE - TITLE FIVE, of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Massillon. Said newly enacted CHAPTER 1174 shall read as follows:

# CHAPTER 1174 A-2 General Agricultural District

1174.01 Intent. 1174.02 Principal uses permitted.

1174.03 Principal uses permitted Subject to special conditions. 1174.04 Area and bulk requirements.

#### 1174.01 INTENT.

The A-2 General Agricultural District is established as a zone in which agricultural uses are encouraged as the principal uses of the land. The specific intent is to facilitate the proper use of lands best suited to agriculture to minimize the conflicts between urban and agricultural uses, to preserve and protect agricultural land from unnecessary encroachment by nonagricultural uses, and to prevent the premature termination of agricultural pursuits, to preserve open space, and to provide for the diversity of land uses in the City to specifically include the agricultural pursuits historically important to the cultural heritage of the City and its environs. This chapter is necessary to foster the preservation of farms and rural lifestyles through zoning, which is prohibited to unincorporated areas surrounding the City.

# 1174.02 PRINCIPAL USES PERMITTED.

In a General Agricultural District, no building or land shall be used and no building shall be created except for one or more of the following specified uses unless otherwise provided in this chapter:

- (a) Agricultural buildings and uses provided:
  - Buildings used to house farm animals.
  - (2) Livestock and poultry raising or breeding for consumption on the premises and for commercial purposes.
  - (3) Production of crops, timber and pasturage.
  - (4) Recycling of organic matter.
  - (5) Roadside stands, which shall be limited to one sign advertising such products not exceeding twenty square feet, and which shall include a required minimum of two off-street parking places; all of which shall be located and set back so as not to create a traffic hazard.
  - (6) Slaughtering of livestock and poultry, production of fertilizer, processing of animal skins and hides, and the reduction of animal matter, provided that the animals, skins, hides, and animal matter are either produced on the premises or the resulting product is employed as an end use on the premises.
  - One-family detached dwellings.
  - (8) Publicly owned and operated parks, playgrounds and recreational facilities.
  - Conservation of natural resources including land, water and open space conservation and wildlife refuges.
  - (10) Accessory buildings and uses customarily incident to any of the permitted uses.

# 1174.03 PRINCIPAL USES PERMITTED TO SPECIAL CONDITIONS.

No use which is not specifically set forth in section 1174.02 of this chapter shall be

permitted.

Where an owner of premises in a General Agricultural District intends to use the premises in furtherance of agriculture beyond the uses specified in section 1174.02 the Massillon City Board of Zoning Appeals may grant a special approval to the owner of the premises pursuant to this section and section 1129.05 to permit one or more uses not specifically set forth in section 1174.02. Such approval must:

(1) be for a specified period of years, or

(2) be specifically restricted to run to the benefit of the owner of the premises, and

(3) not be transferrable to a subsequent owner, and

- (4) not run with the land, and
- (5) be in furtherance of, incident to, or an extension of a permitted use.

# 1174.04 AREA AND BULK REQUIREMENTS

Minimum lot size shall be twenty acres.

Minimum frontage on a public street shall be one hundred feet.

Minimum width of any lot shall be one hundred feet.

There shall be no set back requirement on any agricultural use, including growing crops, standing timber or woodlot production, pasturage, holding fields fallow or in natural succession, or to permit the maximumization of agricultural production or conservation except that no building shall be nearer than fifteen feet to any lot boundary.

#### Section 2:

## AGREEMENT FOR ANNEXATION DEVELOPMENT SERVICES

This agreement is entered into on August \_\_\_\_, 1998, by and between the City of Massillon, Ohio, One James Duncan Plaza 44646 ("City"), and Jennifer Tully, 7867 Daytona NW, Massillon, Ohio 44646 ("Consultant").

Consultant agrees to assist and advise the City on matters relating to obtaining owner support on one or more petitions for annexation of areas identified by the City. Consultant and the City agree that no results in the form of successfully completed annexations are guaranteed. Consultant agrees to utilize Consultant's best efforts to obtain a necessary majority of signatures on one or more annexation petitions covering each of the areas identified by the City.

# Consultant's duties shall be:

Develop general maps describing the territory or territories to be annexed in sufficient detail under Ohio Revised Code Chapter 709 to allow the City Engineer or his designee to complete an accurate annexation map showing approximate acreage, location on Stark County tax maps, location relative to adjacency to existing City boundaries, owners and residents of included and adjacent parcels, Stark County permanent parcel numbers of all parcels in the territory or territories sought to be annexed;
- 2. Develop annexation configurations, including alternative annexation configurations, of the territory or territories sought to be annexed as identified by the City;
- 3. Research and develop owner specific information, including current and projected tax and financial valuations and impacts upon affected owners and residents and the desires and needs for existing and projected or additional infrastructure and services from the City;
- 4. Research and develop a calculation of costs and impacts to the City for territories sought to be annexed;
- 5. Survey property owners in areas identified by the City to determine the current and proposed usage of their property and their needs, utilization of existing infrastructure and services and desires for additional infrastructure and services, opinions of the current political subdivision in which the property is located and the infrastructure and services provided to the property whether by the political subdivision of another entity, opinions of the City of Massillon and its available and projected infrastructure and services, opinions regarding annexation in general and willingness to annex to the City of Massillon, and opinions on municipal incorporation or merger, whether to a new or existing entity, including the City of Massillon;
- 6. Facilitate meetings between property owners and resident of areas sought to be annexed with City officials to discuss costs and impacts of the annexation and the need for infrastructure, services and development assistance;
- 7. Assist City officials in developing the required statement of services to be provided the territory sought to be annexed;
- 8. Secure the signatures of a majority of owners in the territory or territories sought to be annexed as identified by the City;
- 9. Attend public hearings regarding the territory or territories sought be annexed; and
- 10. Act as a liaison between the various units of governments that may have an interest in annexation.

In consideration of the services provided by Consultant, the City agrees to compensate the Consultant as a fee NOT TO EXCEED Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00). Said fee will be based on an hourly rate of Ten Dollars (\$10.00) per hour. The City shall reimburse actual, reasonable, and necessary expenses incurred in the performance of this agreement. The term of this agreement shall be three months.

#### BY: SEWER AND WASTE DISPOSAL COMMITTEE

TITLE: A RESOLUTION directing the City Engineer and the Director of Public Service and Safety to prepare cost estimates, plans, profiles and specifications for construction of sanitary sewer for the Fothergill/Belmont Area.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MASSILLON, STATE OF OHIO, THAT:

#### Section 1:

It is necessary to investigate the construction of a sanitary sewer on 29th Street N.W., Belmere Avenue N.W., Starbrook Street N.W., Crest Circle N.W., Stanton Avenue N.W., Noble Place N.W. and Gordon Avenue N.W.

### Section 2:

That it is determined that the improvement aforesaid is conducive to the public health, convenience and welfare. Council hereby finds that said improvement has been petitioned for by the owners of more than 60% of the foot frontage of the property abutting upon said improvement.

#### Section 3:

That plans, specifications, cost estimates and profiles of the proposed improvement heretofore will be prepared by the City Engineer and be on file with the Clerk of Council in the office of the Director of Public Service and Safety of the City of Massillon, Ohio.

That the grade of said improvement shall be at the grade as shown on the City Engineer's plans and profiles.

#### Section 4:

Council hereby determines that the whole cost of said improvement shall be assessed per each lot of the property bounding and abutting on the improvement upon all lands bounding and abutting upon the proposed improvement, which said lands are hereby determined to be especially benefitted by said improvement. The cost of said improvement shall include the expense of the preliminary and other surveys, plans, specifications, profiles and estimates, and of printing and publishing notices, resolutions, and ordinances required and the serving of said notices, the amount of damages resulting from the improvement and the cost of construction; together with interest on notes and bonds or Ohio Water Pollution Control Loan Fund Construction Loan issued in anticipation of the collection of deferred assessments and all other necessary expenditures.

## Section 5:

The assessments to be levied shall be in forty (40) bi-annual installments with interest on deferred payments at the same rate as shall be borne by the bond or loan to be issued in anticipation of the collection thereof, provided that the owner of any property assessed may, at his option, pay such assessment in cash within 30 days after passage of the assessing ordinance.

#### Section 6:

The bonds of the City of Massillon or loan from the Ohio Water Pollution Control Loan Fund shall be issued in anticipation of the collection of assessments by installments and in amount equal thereto and notes of said City shall be issued in anticipation of the issuance of such bonds if and only if a loan from the Ohio Water Pollution Control Loan Funds cannot be obtained by the City of Massillon.

#### Section 7:

The City Engineer is directed to prepare and file with the Clerk of this Council estimated assessments of the cost of the improvement described in this resolution in accordance with the method of assessment set forth in this resolution and based upon the estimate of cost now on file with the Clerk of this Council, showing the assessment against each lot or parcel of land to be assessed. Such estimated assessments shall be kept by said Clerk on file in the office of the Director of Public Service and Safety and shall be available for inspection by any interested person. Upon the filing of said estimates, the Clerk of this Council is directed to cause notice of the adoption of this Resolution and the filing of said estimated assessments to be served on the owners of all lands to be assessed in the manner provided by R.C. 727.13

Section 8:

Whereas a petition subscribed by the owners of 1000 of the property abutting the hereinafter described improvement has been filed with this Council requesting the improvement by special assessment upon the abutting property owners of 29th Street N.W., Belmere Avenue N.W., Starbrook Street N.W., Crest Circle N.W., Stanton Avenue N.W., Noble Place N.W. and Gordon Avenue N.W. by the construction of a sanitary sewer main and laterals. The Director of Public Service and Safety of the City of Massillon and the City Engineer of said City are hereby directed to prepare plans, specifications and profiles of the aforesaid improvements with reference to the property abutting thereon, and an estimate of the cost of the improvement showing, among other things, the amount allocated to labor and materials, the total cost and the apportionment, if any, between the property owners and the City. The Director of Public Service and Safety and the City Engineer are further directed upon completion of the aforesaid data to file the same in the office of the Clerk of Council of the City of Massillon, where it shall be maintained open to inspection of all persons interested.

### Section 8:

This Resolution shall be in effect immediately from and after passage and upon approval by the Mayor.
