Section I:

RESOLUTION NO. 1 - 1999

BY: PUBLIC UTILITIES/GOLF COURSE COMMITTEE

A RESOLUTION requesting that the Ohio General Assembly oppose a consumer bailout of First Energy as part of the state's plan to open up the electric utility industry to competition, and allow communities to shop for power supply on behalf of their residents and businesses, and declaring an emergency.

WHEREAS, affordable priced electric service is essential to the health, safety and economic well-being of all Ohioans, and

WHEREAS, northern Ohio electric ratepayers have been paying some of the highest rates for electricity in the United States for decades because of utility investments in nuclear nower plants; and

WHEREAS, northern Ohio electric consumers currently pay rates that are thirty to fifty percent higher than customers of other Ohio utilities, presenting a significant economic disadvantage to the region's residential and business customers; and

WHEREAS, the Ohio General Assembly is considering proposals to bring customer choice to the electric utility industry, which will affect the cost of electricity; and

WHEREAS, the purpose of introducing competition to the electric utility industry is to reduce the cost of electricity and ensure choice of utility supplies; and

WHEREAS, legislation now pending in the Ohio General Assembly, S.B. 237 and H.B. 731, would force northern Ohio residential and small business customers to continue to pay for utilities' nuclear plant investments (stranded costs) once competition is introduced; and

WHEREAS, full recovery of stranded costs would cost the each northern Ohio household more than \$2,150.00 over a five-year period; and

WHEREAS, if residential and small business customers are to benefit from competition 'hey must form larger purchasing groups to shop for power supply, now, therefore

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MASSILLON, STATE OF OHIO, THAT:

Section 1:

Electric utility competition in Ohio must not penalize ratepayers or taxpayers by forcing them to bail out utilities' past bad investments (stranded costs).

Section 2:

That electric utility competition in Ohio must result in immediate and significant price reductions for all northern Ohio consumers, including residents and small businesses.

Section 3:

That electric utility competition in Ohio must facilitate the formation of consumer purchasing groups at the community level and allow cities and villages to shop for power supply on behalf of their residents and businesses.

Section 4:

That the Clerk of Council is hereby directed to transmit certified copies of this resolution of Governor Bob Taft, Senate President Richard Finan, House Speaker Jo Ann Davidson, State Representative Johnny Maier, Representative Kirk Schuring and Senator Scott Oelslager.
