NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MASSILLON, STATE OF OHIO, THAT:

Section 1:

The Council of the City of Massillon, Ohio, hereby determines it to be necessary in the public health, safety and welfare to advertise for and receive sealed bids and enter into a contract, upon award and approval of the Board of Control, with the lowest and best bidder to pave and/or resurface various streets within the City of Massillon.

Section 2:

The Director of Public Service and Safety of the City of Massillon, Ohio, is hereby authorized and directed to prepare plans and specifications and to advertise and receive sealed bids and enter into contract, upon award and approval by the Board of Control, with the lowest and best bidder to pave and/or resurface various streets within the City of Massillon.

Section 3:

That this Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the preservation of the health, safety and welfare of the community and for the additional reason that it is necessary that the advertising for bids be made to pave and/or resurface the streets prior to the Spring of 1999. Provided it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the elected members Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor. Otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

AGREEMENT FOR DEVELOPMENT SERVICES

This agreement is entered into on March 16, 1999 by and between the City of Massillon, Ohio, One James Duncan Plaza 44646 ("City") and Jennifer Tully and Tully Consultants, 4805 Cranberry Ave. NW, Canton, Ohio 44709 ("Consultant") to begin March 16, 1999 and end May 14, 1999.

Consultant agrees to assist and advise the City on matters relating to annexation. City and Consultant agree that no specific results are guaranteed, particularly in the form of completed annexations.

Consultant's duties shall be:

1. Develop general maps describing the territory or territories to be annexed in sufficient detail under Ohio General Code Chapter 709 to allow the City Engineer or his designee to complete an accurate annexation map showing approximate acreage, location on Stark County Tax Maps, location relative to adjacency to existing City boundaries, owners and residents of included and adjacent parcel, and Stark County permanent parcel numbers of all parcels in the territory sought to be annexed;
2. Develop annexation configurations, including alternative annexation configurations, of the territory or territories sought to be annexed as identified by the City;
3. Research and develop owner-specific information, including current and projected tax and financial valuations and impacts upon affected owners and residents and the desires and needs for existing and projected or additional infrastructure and services from the City;
4. Research and develop a calculation of costs and impacts to the City for territories sought to be annexed;
5. Survey property owners in areas identified by the City to determine the current and proposed usage of their property and their needs, utilization of existing infrastructure and services and desires for additional infrastructure and services, opinions of the current political subdivision in which the property is located and the infrastructure and services provided to the property whether by the political subdivision or another entity, opinions of the City of Massillon and its available and projected infrastructure and services, opinions regarding annexation in general and willingness to annex to the City

of Massillon, and opinions on municipal incorporation or merger, whether to a new or existing entity, including the City of Massillon;

6. Facilitate meetings between property owners and residents of areas sought to be annexed with City officials to discuss costs and impacts of the annexation and the need for infrastructure, services and development assistance;
7. Assist City officials in developing the required statement of services to be provided the territory sought to be annexed;
8. Attempt to secure the signatures of a majority of owners in the territory or territories sought to be annexed as identified by the City;
9. Attend public hearings regarding the territory or territories sought to be annexed;
10. Act as a liaison between the various units of government that may have an interest in annexation;
11. Provide research of legal and other authoritative resources concerning annexation-related matters concerning the City;
12. Provide such other duties as assigned by the Mayor of the City of Massillon; and
13. Employ her best efforts to perform the duties listed in this agreement. Specifically, Consultant agrees that the ultimate goal of this agreement is to complete annexation of territory into the City of Massillon and Consultant shall focus her services to maximize the probabilities of completing annexations.

City agrees to provide access to all maps, geographic and other information relating to potential or impending annexations.

City agrees that Consultant shall be under the supervision of the Mayor of the City of Massillon. The Mayor may designate one or more of his staff to provide direct supervision of Consultant.

City and Consultant agree that the term of this contract may be extended, without further councilmatic action, for an additional period of up to two months, upon the same conditions as expressly set forth in this agreement, upon the mutual written consent of the City and the Consultant, and expressly conditioned on the availability of funds.

Consultant shall perform assigned duties a minimum of fifteen hours, but no more

than a maximum of thirty hours, per week.

In consideration of the services provided by Consultant, the City agrees to compensate the Consultant as a fee for services a sum at the rate of eleven dollars and fifty cents (\$11.50) per hour, not including reimbursement of expenses. Said fee will be payable upon invoice turned in by consultant to City. The City shall reimburse actual, reasonable, and necessary expenses, including mileage, incurred in the performance of this agreement from a City of Massillon purchase order different from that which fees are paid. City agrees that reimbursement for expenses will not be included in Consultant's 1099 form that is issued to Consultant for services.

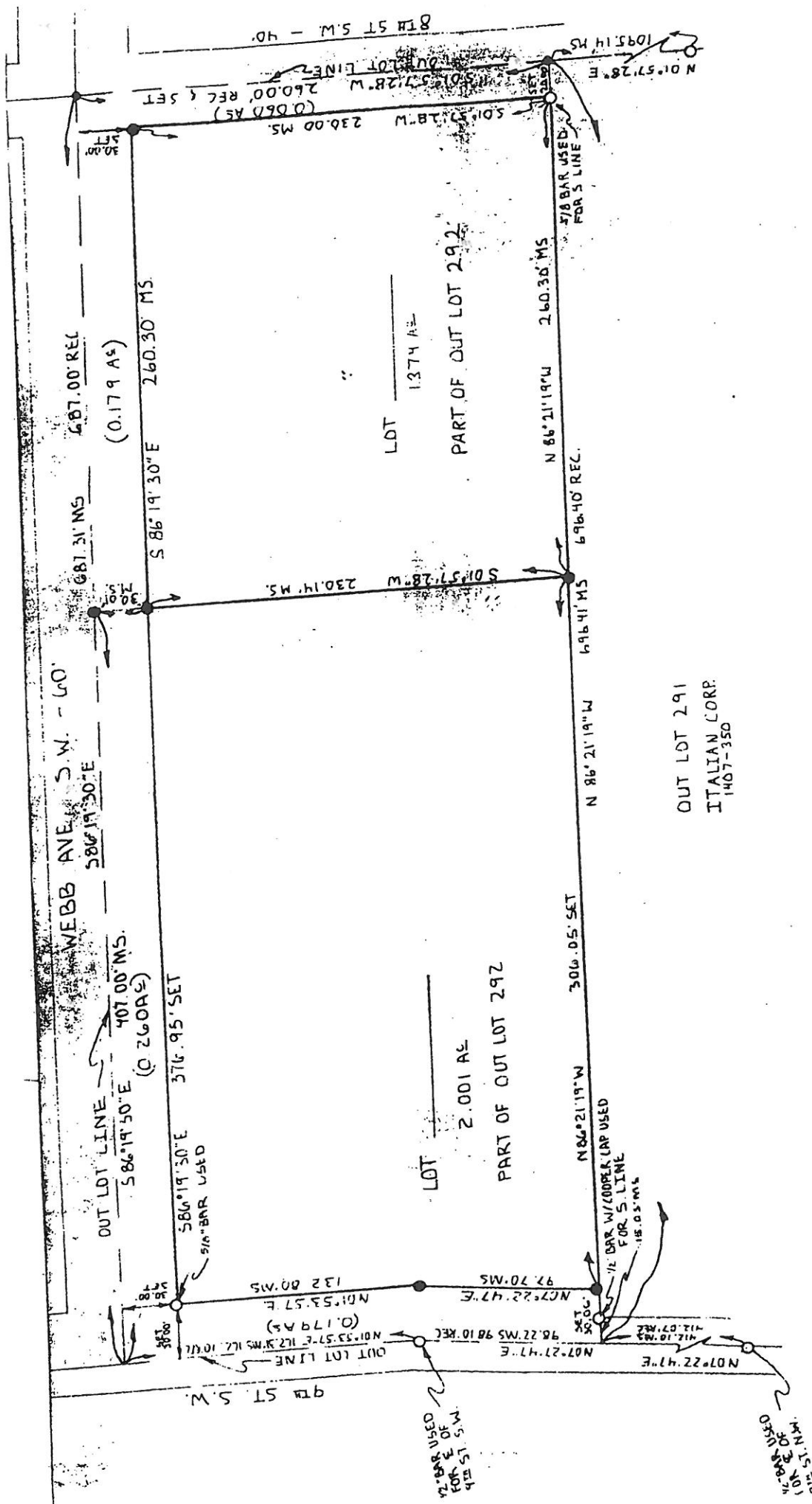

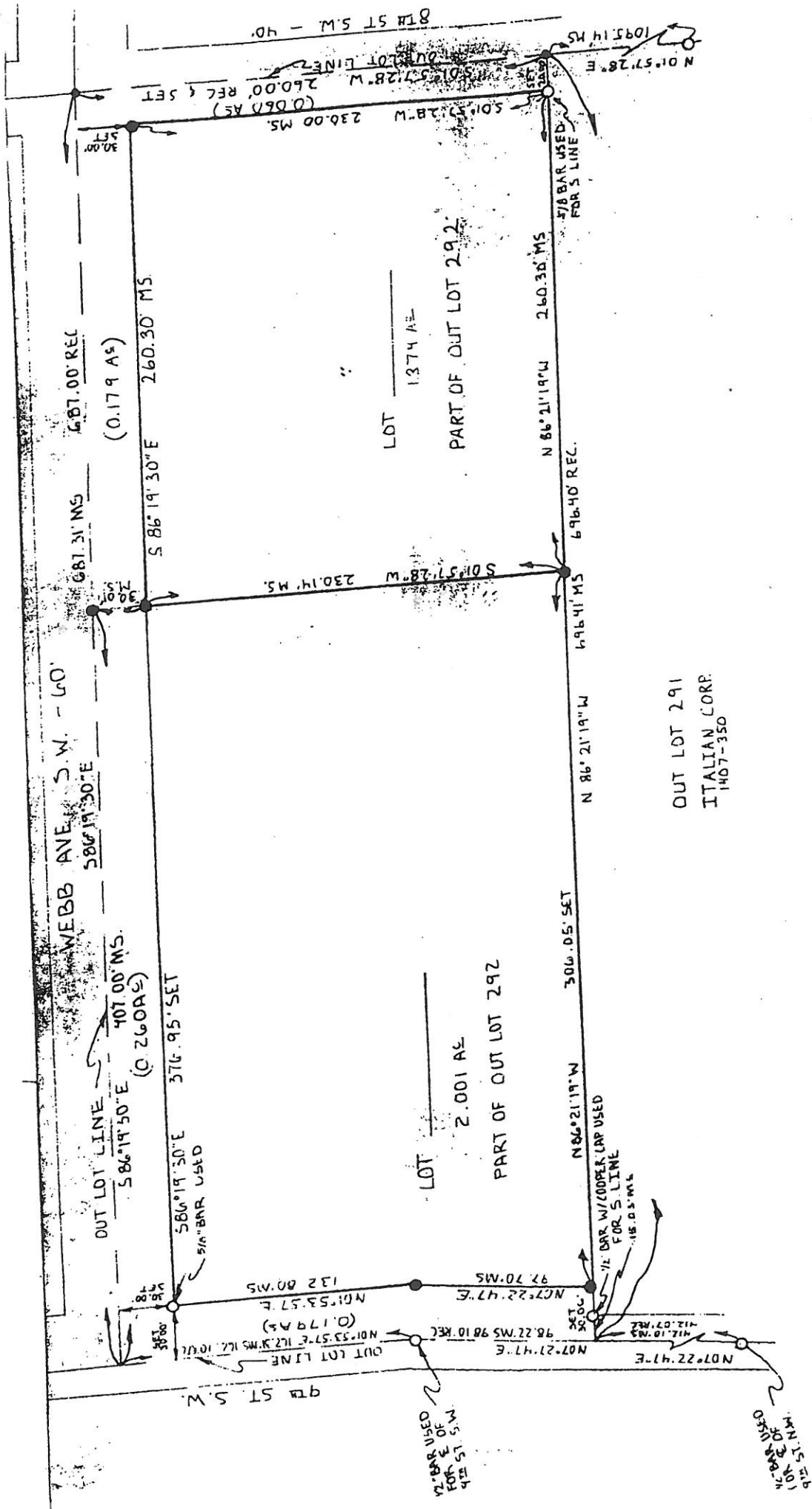

TITLE: A RESOLUTION estimating the aggregate maximum amount of public funds for the City of Massillon, Ohio, to be awarded and be on deposit as of August 1, 1999 to and including July 31, 2001, inviting bids from banking institutions qualified to serve as depositories of municipal funds under the Uniform Depository Act of the State of Ohio, fixing the date for the designation of such depositories, and declaring an emergency.

WHEREAS, the present depository agreement between the local banks and the City of Massillon, Ohio, for the deposit of municipal funds expires on July 31, 1999; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary for the City to enter into a new agreement pursuant to the provisions of the Uniform Depository Act of the State of Ohio;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MASSILLON, STATE OF OHIO, THAT:

Section 1:

The Treasurer of the City of Massillon, Ohio, be and is hereby authorized to invite banking institutions in the City of Massillon, Ohio, duly qualified to serve as depositories of municipal funds under the provisions of the Uniform Depository Act of the State of Ohio, to serve as depositories of the municipal funds of said City for two (2) year period from and including August 1, 1999 to and including July 31, 2001.

Section 2:

That the meeting for the designation of the depositories will be held at 3:00 P.M. on Friday, June 4, 1999, in the Council Chambers of the City Hall.

Section 3:

That the Clerk of this Council shall cause a copy of this Resolution together with a notice of the date on which the meeting for the designation of such depository will be held to be published once a week for two (2) consecutive weeks in two (2) newspapers of general circulation in Stark County, Ohio.

Section 4:

That all applications shall be presented to the Treasurer of the City of Massillon, Ohio, not later than 12:00 Noon Friday, May 7, 1999, and said applications shall contain any and all information so requested by said Treasurer.

Section 5:

That this Resolution is declared to be an emergency measure immediately necessary for the preservation of the health, safety and welfare of the community and for the further reason that it is necessary to give this Resolution immediate effect in order that the various city officers can provide the steps necessary for the timely execution of depository contracts within the time limitation imposed by state law. Wherefore, this Resolution shall be in full force and effect immediately from and after passage and upon approval by the Mayor.
