WHEREAS, pursuant to the administrative hearing and public notice provisions of the Cable Communications and Franchise Act of I989 (Public Law No. 98-549) the required hearing has been held upon due public notice given thereof;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MASSILLON, STATE OF OHIO, THAT:

## Section 1:

Having reviewed the performance of Massillon Cable TV, Inc. under its existing franchise and its proposal for a renewal of the franchise, Council finds said service to have been adequate and that the company's financial and technical ability and proposed future service plans will sufficiently meet the needs of the community.

## Section 2:

The Director of Public Service and Safety is hereby authorized and directed to enter into a non-exclusive agreement with Massillon Cable TV, Inc. for the operation of a cable television system within the City of Massillon, Ohio, for a period of ten (10) years on the terms set forth in Ordinance No. 58 - 1989.

## Section 3:

This Ordinance is declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the health, safety and welfare of the community and for the additional reason that the Massillon Cable TV, Inc. franchise agreement with the City is about to expire. Provided it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the elected members to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor. AN ORDINANCE authorizing the Mayor to enter into an agreement with the Massillon Area Chamber of Commerce, the Massillon Public Library, the Massillon City Board of Education, the United Way of Western Stark County, Inc., the Massillon Development Foundation, Inc., and the Massillon Museum, Inc, to form a consortium for the purpose of providing expanded communication opportunities to serve the community, becoming a participating member in the Massillon Gateway consortium, and declaring an emergency.

WHEREAS, a more informed citizenry is more involved in their community and their government; and

WHEREAS, the citizenry and the Greater Massillon community need free access to the information they own, in a broad, direct, cost-effective and timely manner; and

WHEREAS, communication technologies have expanded beyond the ever important print and broadcast mediums; and

WHEREAS, an increasing number of Massillonians rely on nontraditional media and channels of communications; and

WHEREAS, the City of Massillon, the Massillon Area Chamber of Commerce, the Massillon Public Library, the Massillon City Board of Education, the United Way of Western Stark County, Inc., the Massillon Development Foundation, Inc., and the Massillon Museum, Inc., have determined that a consortium of nonprofit organizations and governmental units to provide expanded communication opportunities to serve the community is a better practice than each agency acting in a manner not coordinated with other area agencies and duplicating information; and

WHEREAS, the City of Massillon, the Massillon Area Chamber of Commerce, the Massillon Public Library, the Massillon City Board of Education, the United Way of Western Stark County, Inc., the Massillon Development Foundation, Inc., and the Massillon Museum, Inc., have vorked together to form the Massillon Gateway Consortium; and

WHEREAS, at least two-thirds of the members elected to Council of the City of Massillon, Ohio, have found, considered and determined that in order to provide expanded communication opportunities to serve the community, this constitutes an emergency, requiring immediate action.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MASSILLON, STATE OF OHIO, THAT:

#### Section 1:

This Council hereby authorizes and directs the Mayor to enter into an agreement with the Massillon Area Chamber of Commerce, the Massillon Public Library, the Massillon City Board of Education, the United Way of Western Stark County, Inc., the Massillon Development Foundation, Inc., and the Massillon Museum, Inc, to form a consortium for the purpose of providing expanded communication opportunities to serve the community.

#### Section 2:

Attached hereto and made a part of this ordinance is the Massillon Gateway Articles of Consortium described in section 1 of this ordinance.

#### Section 3:

This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure, for the efficient operation of the various departments of the City of Massillon and for the preservation of the public health, safety and welfare of the community. Provided it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the elected members to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor. Otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

# MASSILLON GATEWAY ARTICLES OF CONSORTIUM

To keep Massillonians and friends of Massillon informed about their community, the community organizations and the governmental institutions of Massillon, by these articles, agree to join together for the purpose of providing expanded communication opportunities to serve the community in exemplary ways.

## Purposes

A more informed citizenry will become more involved in their community. Massillonians need free access to the information they own, in a broad, direct, cost-effective, and timely manner. With the expansion of communications technologies beyond the important print and broadcast mediums, information access must be provided through technologies as they emerge. This consortium has the vital role of providing appropriate noncommercial access to communications technologies and informational content that will assist a significant portion of the community to be better informed about itself. Further, the consortium will provide valued information about the community, its people, businesses, organizations, neighborhoods, governments, events, activities and opportunities. In these ways, the community will continue to strengthen its vitality, continue its growth and development, and continue its attraction to those neighbors, friends, and others interested in the great community of Massillon, Ohio.

The intent of the consortium is to use communication methods beyond the traditional print and broadcast media organizations that have served this community so well and continue to do so. The consortium intends to serve the community as an additional pathway of communication that supplements and enhances those so valued by the community.

The consortium is a natural outgrowth of pioneering efforts of the City of Massillon, the Massillon Area Chamber of Commerce, the Massillon Public Library, the Massillon City Board of Education, the United Way of Western Stark County, Inc. and others to keep the community informed though a presence on the Internet through the World Wide Web. Continuation of these efforts through coordination, cooperation and further development will be a primary focus of the consortium.

## Members

The initial members of the Massillon Gateway consortium shall be the City of Massillon, the Massillon Area Chamber of Commerce, the Massillon Public Library, the Massillon City Board of Education, the United Way of Western Stark County, Inc., the Massillon Development Foundation, Inc. and the Massillon Museum, Inc. Additional community organizations shall be eligible to become members according membership guidelines approved by the Massillon Gateway Board of Trustees. Classes of associate membership including entities other than community organizations may be established by the Board of Trustees.

## Governing Body

The Massillon Gateway consortium shall be governed by a Board of Trustees comprised of a representative of each of the community organizations that are members of the consortium with the Mayor of the City of Massillon as a member in addition to the member representing the City of Massillon. Each member of the Board of Trustees shall provide a designate to serve in the member's absence and each community organization that is a member of the consortium shall provide alternate members to serve in the absence of both the member and the designate.

The Board of Trustees may operate through an Executive Committee. The Executive Committee shall have full authority to act on behalf of the Board of Trustees between regular meetings of the Board.

Actions by the Board of Trustees shall be by consensus where practical and, where consensus cannot be reached, by a two-thirds majority approval. Actions by the Executive Committee shall be by consensus where practical and, where consensus cannot be reached, by a three-fourths majority. A quorum of seven members of the Board of Trustees and a quorum of four members of the Executive Committee shall be required to take action on the business of the consortium. The Board of Trustees shall conduct its business in a collaborative manner emphasizing consensus and may adopt simple rules of order for the business of the Board, the Executive Committee and all standing and special committees.

The Board of Trustees is hereby authorized to adopt all actions necessary or desirable to operate as an arm of the community. The Board has the authority to enter into contract, acquire real and personal property, hire personnel, secure the services of experts and accept donations.

#### Not-For-Profit

Massillon Gateway will operate as a not-for-profit organization under the laws of the State of Ohio. The consortium will operate in a nondiscriminatory manner and shall be inclusive of as many different portions of the community as possible within its means, but shall not condone or permit discriminatory or partisan political information in its services, or tolerate use of information that is hateful or offensive to the community at large.

#### Administration

Massillon Gateway shall be administered by the Massillon Area Chamber of Commerce, under the direction of the Board of Trustees of the consortium.

## Funding

Massillon Gateway shall operate subject to a budget approved annually by the Board of Trustees of the consortium, adjusted periodically as circumstances require. Authorized sources of funding for the consortium shall be membership fees, usage fees, contributions, advertisements, donations, governmental, public and private grants, and such other sources of revenue in keeping with the aims of the consortium in betterment of the greater Massillon community, as are approved in advance by the Board of Trustees.

#### Focus

Massillon Gateway is primarily concerned about Massillon, Ohio and shall focus its attention and efforts on the best interests of the residents of the City of Massillon and the Greater Massillon area. To the extent that businesses and organizations have a significant presence in the City of Massillon or the Greater Massillon area, as determined by the Board of Trustees, Massillon Gateway may expend its communications, attention, and efforts in including such members within the focus of the consortium.

# Allocation of Resources

The Board of Trustees of Massillon Gateway shall have the sole authority to decide how the resources of the consortium are allocated. Consideration shall be given to the relative contributions of the members but it is acknowledged as an inherent precept that the community organizations that will desire membership in the consortium have differing abilities to contribute to the accomplishment of the aims of the consortium. The needs of the community shall be the overarching determinant of the allocation of consortium resources.

## Noninterference

Massillon Gateway may utilize the assistance and resources of its member organizations, including cooperative dissemination of information but shall not exercise censorship over or otherwise interfere with the internal operations of any of its member organizations.

## Amendment

These articles of consortium may be amended by a three-quarters majority vote of the Board of Trustees and upon the approval of three-quarters of the original members of the consortium who are members of the consortium at the time of the amendment.

# Continued Existence

Massillon Gateway shall continue in existence until dissolved by a three-quarters majority vote of the Board of Trustees and upon the approval of three-quarters of the original members of the consortium who are members of the consortium at the time of the dissolution action.

## Adoption

This agreement shall be in full force and effect on the date that it is approved by all of the original members of the consortium. The governing body of each member shall take official action to approve this agreement and authorize an official representative of that organization to execute a copy of this agreement.

ACL COMPANY, L.L.C., a Georgia Corporation with its main offices located at 1
Concourse Parkway, suite 450, Atlanta, Georgia 30328 (hereinafter referred to as "the
Lessor").

#### WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the parties have previously entered into an Ohio Enterprise Zone Agreement dated May 19, 1999, whereby Heinz agreed to expand its existing facility within the City's enterprise zone through the construction, by Americold, of a new 164,000 square foot cold storage warehouse adjacent to the existing Heinz production facility located at 1301 Oberlin Road, S.W., and the City provided the companies with development incentives to support the economic viability of the Project; and

WHEREAS, the Agreement provides for a tax exemption for real property and personal property improvements made to the Project Site, identified as a 7.64 acre parcel of land, known as and being Out Lot 510, in the City of Massillon, Stark County, Ohio; and

WHEREAS, the Project Site has been expanded and is now identified as an 11.284 acre parcel of land, known as and being Part of Out Lots 287, 510, 511, and 750, in the City of Massillon, Stark County, Ohio; and

WHEREAS, Heinz and Americold propose to increase the proposed project investment from \$29,083,000 to \$31,583,000 through the installation of an additional \$2,500,000 in first used machinery and equipment to be located at the project site and leased by Americold from the Lessor; and

WHEREAS, in order to accomplish the intended purpose of the Agreement, the parties have determined to amend the Agreement, in the particulars set forth herein.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants set forth in the Agreement and the benefit to be deemed by each party from the completion of the Project as contemplated by the Agreement, the parties hereby agree as follows:

- 1. That Section 1, Paragraph 1 of the Agreement is hereby amended to read in part as follows: "Said facility shall be constructed on an 11.284 acre parcel of land, known as and being Part of Out Lots 287, 510, 511, and 750, in the City of Massillon, Stark County, Ohio, as further described in the attached Exhibit "A", attached hereto and made a part hereof.
- 2. That Section 1, Paragraph 2 of the Agreement is hereby amended to read as follows: "The Project will involve a total investment of (\$31,583,000) Thirty-One Million Five Hundred Eighty-Three Thousand Dollars, plus or minus 15%, at the proposed project site, further described as follows:
  - (\$16,000,000) Sixteen Million Dollars, to be invested by Americold, for construction of the new warehouse.
  - (\$1,000,000) One Million Dollars, to be invested by Heinz, for the purchase and installation of first used machinery and equipment.
  - (\$2,500,000) Two Million Five Hundred Thousand Dollars, to be invested by Americold, for the installation of first used machinery and equipment, specifically palletizing equipment, through a lease with the Lessor.
  - (\$12,083,000) Twelve Million Eighty-Three Thousand Dollars, to be invested by Heinz, for new inventory.
- 3. That ACL Company, L.L.C., the Lessor, is hereby recognized by the City through this amendment as a party to the Ohio Enterprise Zone Agreement between the City of Massillon, Ohio, Heinz Frozen Food Company, and VC Freezer Massillon L.L.C.; and that ACL Company, L.L.C. hereby joins in the agreements and undertakings as they relate to the investment and improvements of the Project.
- 4. In all other respects, the Agreement is hereby confirmed and ratified as written.


