(3) EPA Debt Payment Fund Twenty-Two Percent (22%) of City industrial

and user revenues received, shall be designated as the EPA Debt Payment Fund.

Section 3:

The Distribursement of Funds listed in Section 2, shall become effective July 1, 2000.

Section 4:

This ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure, the reason for the emergency being that said enactments are necessary for the more efficient operation of the WWT Department of the City of Massillon, Ohio, and for the additional reason for the preservation of the public health, safety and welfare of the community. And provided it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the elected members to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor. Otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
