BY: COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT AND ANNEXATION COMMITTEE

TITLE: AN ORDINANCE approving and authorizing the Mayor to enter into an agreement with Sibila Family Limited Partnership providing an economic development grant to the company as matching funds for the grant from the Ohio Rail Development Commission for the construction and expansion of rail lines in NeoCom Park I for the M.A. Hanna Resin Distribution facility, and declaring an emergency.

WHEREAS, the City of Massillon carries out a variety of economic development programs designed to promote the creation and expansion of business and industry in the community; and

WHEREAS, Sibila Family Limited Partnership desires to construct and expand rail lines in the NeoCom Park I for the M.A. Hanna Resin Distribution facility located at 4075 Millennium Boulevard, and

WHEREAS, Sibila Family Limited Partnership, through this proposed construction and expansion of rail lines in the NeoCom Park I for the M.A. Hanna Resin Distribution facility will provide a total of 33 jobs at the new facility, and

WHEREAS, the City of Massillon proposes to assist the Sibila Limited partnership, in this construction and expansion of rail lines in NeoCom Park I for the M.A. Hanna Resin Distribution facility by providing an economic development grant to the company as matching funds for the grant from the Ohio Rail Development Commission, the purpose of which is to help offset the company's costs in construction and expansion of these rail lines in the NeoCom Park I for the M.A. Hanna Resin Distribution facility in the City of Massillon.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MASSILLON STATE OF OHIO, THAT:

Section 1:

This Council hereby approves and authorizes the Mayor to enter into an agreement with Sibila Family Limited Partnership providing an economic development grant to the company as matching funds for the grant from the Ohio Rail Development Commission for the construction and expansion of rail lines in NeoCom Park I for the M.A. Hanna Resin Distribution facility in a total amount not to exceed Forty Thousand Dollars (\$40,000.00).

Section 2:

In return for this economic development grant assistance, the Sibila Family Limited Partnership, shall provide the City with information regarding the number of jobs that it has provided as a result of the company's construction and expansion of the rail lines in NeoCom Park I for the M.A. Hanna Resin Distribution facility in Massillon.

Section 3:

This Ordinance is declared to be an emergency measure immediately necessary for the preservation of the health, safety, and welfare of the community and for the additional reason that it is necessary to improve the economic climate of the community through the construction and expansion of the rail lines. Provided it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the elected members to Council it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor. Otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

BY: COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT & ANNEXATION COMMITTEE

TITLE: AN ORDINANCE authorizing and directing the Mayor to enter into an agreement with Ecodyne MRM, Inc., providing for the adoption of a project which will improve their facility and create employment opportunities within the City of Massillon Enterprise Zone, and declaring an emergency.

WHEREAS, the City of Massillon has encouraged the development of real property and the acquisition of personal property located in the area designated as an Enterprise Zone; and

WHEREAS, Ecodyne MRM, Inc. is proposing to improve its facility at 607 First Street S.W. within the Massillon Enterprise Zone, at a total investment of Two Hundred Forty-Four Thousand Dollars (\$244,000.00), (hereinafter the "Project"), provided that the appropriate development incentives are available to support the economic viability of said Project; and

WHEREAS, the Council of the City of Massillon, Ohio, (hereinafter "Council") by Ordinance No. 163-1994, adopted on July 18, 1994, and as amended by Ordinance No. 57-1998, adopted March 2, 1998 and as amended by Ordinance No. 43 - 1999, adopted March 1, 1999, has designated an area of the City as an "Enterprise Zone" pursuant to Chapter 5709 of the Ohio Revised Code; and

WHEREAS, effective September 12, 1994, and as amended on March 13, 1998, and as amended on March 9, 1999, the Director of Development of the State of Ohio has determined that the aforementioned area designated in said Ordinance No. 163 - 1994 contains the characteristics set forth in 5709.61(A) of the Ohio Revised Code, and has certified said area as an Enterprise Zone under Chapter 5709; and

WHEREAS, the City of Massillon, having the appropriate authority for the stated type of project is desirous of providing Ecodyne MRM, Inc. with the incentives available for development of the Project in said Enterprise Zone, under Chapter 5709 of the Ohio Revised Code; and

WHEREAS, Ecodyne MRM, Inc. has submitted a proposed agreement application, herein attached as Exhibit "A", to the City of Massillon, Ohio, requesting that the incentives available for development within the Enterprise Zone be approved for the Project; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor of the City of Massillon, Ohio, has investigated the application submitted by Ecodyne MRM, Inc. and has recommended approval of the same to the Council on the basis that the company is qualified by financial responsibility and business experience to create employment opportunities in said Enterprise Zone and to improve the economic climate of the City

WHEREAS, the project site is located in the Massillon School District and the Massillon Board of Education has been notified in accordance with Section 5709.83 and have been given a copy of the application.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MASSILLON, STATE OF OHIO, THAT:

Section 1:

The Council of the City of Massillon, Ohio does hereby authorize and direct the Mayor to enter into an agreement, attached hereto as Exhibit "A" and incorporated herein by reference, with Ecodyne MRM, Inc. providing for the adoption of a project which will improve their facility and preserve employment opportunities within the City of Massillon Enterprise Zone.

Section 2:

This Ordinance is declared to be an emergency measure immediately necessary for the preservation of the health, safety and welfare of the City of Massillon, Ohio and for the further reason that approval of said agreement is necessary so as to maximize the investment that will be made by Ecodyne MRM, Inc. within the City of Massillon, Ohio. Provided it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the elected members to Council it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor. Otherwise it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

TITLE: AN ORDINANCE authorizing the Mayor to enter into an agreement with the Massillon School District Board of Education and Ecodyne MRM, Inc., whereby authorizing general compensation to the School District resulting from the Enterprise Zone Agreement for the Ecodyne MRM, Inc., Project, and declaring an emergency.

WHEREAS, Ecodyne MRM, Inc., have requested a tax abatement on real and personal property from the City of Massillon (hereinafter the "City"); and

WHEREAS, the Ohio Enterprise Zone Program, pursuant to ORC Sections 5709.61 through 5709.60 authorizes municipalities to grant real and/or personal property tax exemptions on eligible new investments; and

WHEREAS, the City provided the School Board with notice of its intent to grant an enterprise zone tax abatement in the amount of 75% for ten years; and

WHEREAS, representatives of Ecodyne MRM, Inc., met with the Superintendent and/or his designees to discuss the impact of the project, requested further tax incentives from the Massillon School District (hereinafter "District") and agreed to make certain annual payments to compensate the District for tax revenues foregone as a result of the abatement and in consideration of the District agreeing to a 100% abatement; and

WHEREAS, the proposed payments from Ecodyne MRM, Inc., will compensate the District in an amount estimated and agreed upon by the parties as a result of the abatement.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MASSILLON, STATE OF OHIO, THAT:

Section 1:

The Council of the City of Massillon, Ohio, hereby determines it to be necessary in the public health, safety and welfare to enter into an agreement with the Massillon School District Board of Education, and Ecodyne MRM, Inc., whereby authorizing general compensation to the school district resulting from the Enterprise Zone Agreement for the Ecodyne MRM, Inc. Project.

Section 2:

The Mayor of the City of Massillon, Ohio, is hereby authorized to enter into an agreement with the ~~Perry~~ School District Board of Education and Ecodyne MRM, Inc., whereby authorizing general compensation to the school district resulting from the Enterprise Zone Agreement for the Ecodyne MRM, Inc. Project.

Section 3:

This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the health, safety, and welfare of the community, and for the additional reason that an agreement between the above named parties must be in place prior to the effective date of the tax abatement. Provided it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the elected members to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor. Otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

TITLE: AN ORDINANCE indicating what services the City of Massillon, Ohio, will provide to the West Warmington Area Annexation, upon annexation, and declaring an emergency.

WHEREAS, certain property owners have filed a petition requesting the West Warmington Area Annexation to be annexed to the City of Massillon, Ohio, pursuant to the Ohio Revised Code Section 709.02, and

WHEREAS, The Ohio Revised Code Section 709.031 (B) requires that upon receiving notice, the Municipal Legislative Authority, shall by Ordinance or Resolution, adopt a statement indicating what services, if any, the municipal corporation will provide to the territory proposed for annexation upon annexation, and

WHEREAS, this Ordinance is intended to comply with the requirements of the Ohio Revised Code Section 709.031 (B), and

WHEREAS, the legislative authority of the City of Massillon, Ohio, is supportive of the annexation proposal, and

WHEREAS, the Stark County Commissioners have scheduled a public hearing, to be held at the Perry Township Hall on November 29th, 2000 at 7:00 P.M.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MASSILLON, STATE OF OHIO, THAT:

Section I:

The City of Massillon, Ohio, will extend to the proposed area, upon annexation, the availability of all municipal services extended to all of the current citizens, residents and property owners of the City of Massillon, Ohio, including, but not limited, to the services of the Municipal Police Department, services of the Municipal Fire Department, services of the Municipal Service Department, services of the Engineering Department, services of the Building Department, services of the Street Department, services of the Safety Department, services of the Planning Department, services of the Health Department, services of the Sewer Department and services of the City of Massillon Administration.

Section 2:

That this Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the preservation of the health, safety and welfare of the community and for the additional reason that it is necessary to indicate what services the City of Massillon will provide to the area upon annexation prior to the Stark County Commissioners hearing on November 29th, 2000 at 7:00 P.M. at the Perry Township Hall. Provided it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the elected members to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor. Otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

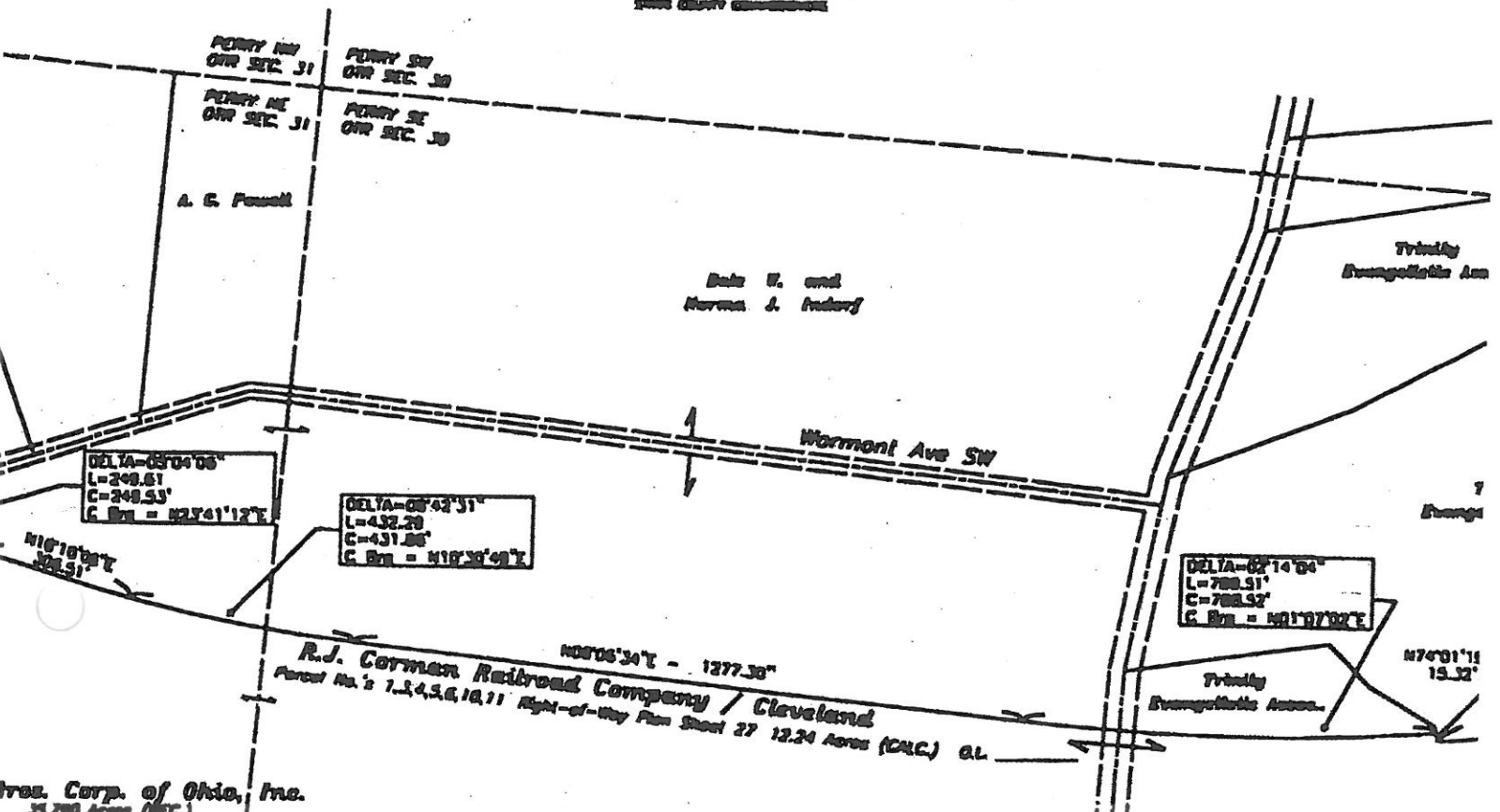

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MASSILLON, STATE OF OHIO, THAT:

Section 1:

The existing Section 765.09(f) "GENERAL INDEMNIFICATION AND LIABILITY INSURANCE" of CHAPTER 765 "CABLE COMMUNICATIONS" of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Massillon be and hereby is repealed.

Section 2:
