NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MASSILLON, STATE OF OHIO, THAT:

Section 1:

The Council of the City of Massillon, Ohio, hereby finds that it is necessary to enter into a Local Public Agency Agreement with the State of Ohio Department of Transportation for the Project. improvements of the 16th Street S.E. Project from Walnut Road S.E. to Harsh Avenue S.E., Project.

Section 2:

The Director of Public Service and Safety of the City of Massillon, Ohio, is hereby authorized and directed to enter into an Local Public Agency Agreement with the State of Ohio Department of Transportation for the improvements of the 16th Street S.E. Project from Walnut Road S.E. to Harsh Avenue S.E..

Section 3:

The City does hereby propose to cooperate with the Director of Transportation in said improvement as follows: ~~Consent is given by the City for the above improvement and furthermore, the City will assume and pay Twenty percent (20%) in local matching for the improvements of the 16th Street S.E. Project from Walnut Road S.E. to Harsh Avenue S.E.,~~ from the Federal Fund made available for these purposes by the Federal Highway Administration, Ohio Department of Transportation and the Local Public Agency with eligible costs associated with these approved categories at a rate of 100% for the Engineering Design and Right-of-Way phases and 100% of the construction costs with a maximum of \$4,170,000.00 for the STA-16th Street Project.

Section 4:

This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the health, safety, and welfare of the community, and for the reason that it is necessary to begin work on the 16th Street Improvements Project. Provided it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the elected members to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor. Otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

WHEREAS, The Ohio Revised Code Section 709.031 (B) requires that upon receiving notice, the Municipal Legislative Authority, shall by Ordinance or Resolution, adopt a statement indicating what services, if any, the municipal corporation will provide to the territory proposed for annexation upon annexation, and

WHEREAS, this Ordinance is intended to comply with the requirements of the Ohio Revised Code Section 709.031 (B), and

WHEREAS, the legislative authority of the City of Massillon, Ohio, is supportive of the annexation proposal, and

WHEREAS, the Stark County Commissioners have scheduled a public hearing, to be held at the Perry Township Hall, 3111 Hilton Street N.W. on December 20, 2000 at 7:00 P.M.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MASSILLON, STATE OF OHIO, THAT:

Section I:

The City of Massillon, Ohio, will extend to the proposed area, upon annexation, the availability of all municipal services extended to all of the current citizens, residents and property owners of the City of Massillon, Ohio, including, but not limited, to the services of the Municipal Police Department, services of the Municipal Fire Department, services of the Municipal Service Department, services of the Engineering Department, services of the Building Department, services of the Street Department, services of the Safety Department, services of the Planning Department, services of the Health Department, services of the Sewer Department and services of the City of Massillon Administration.

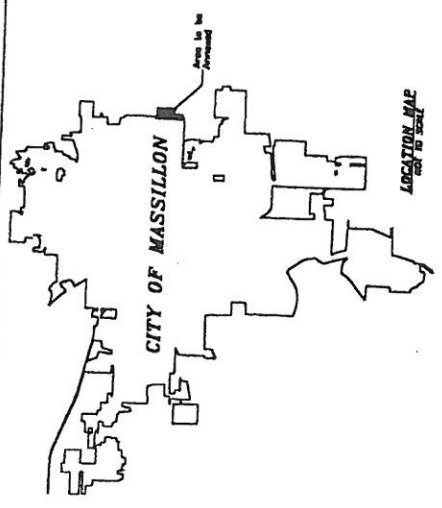
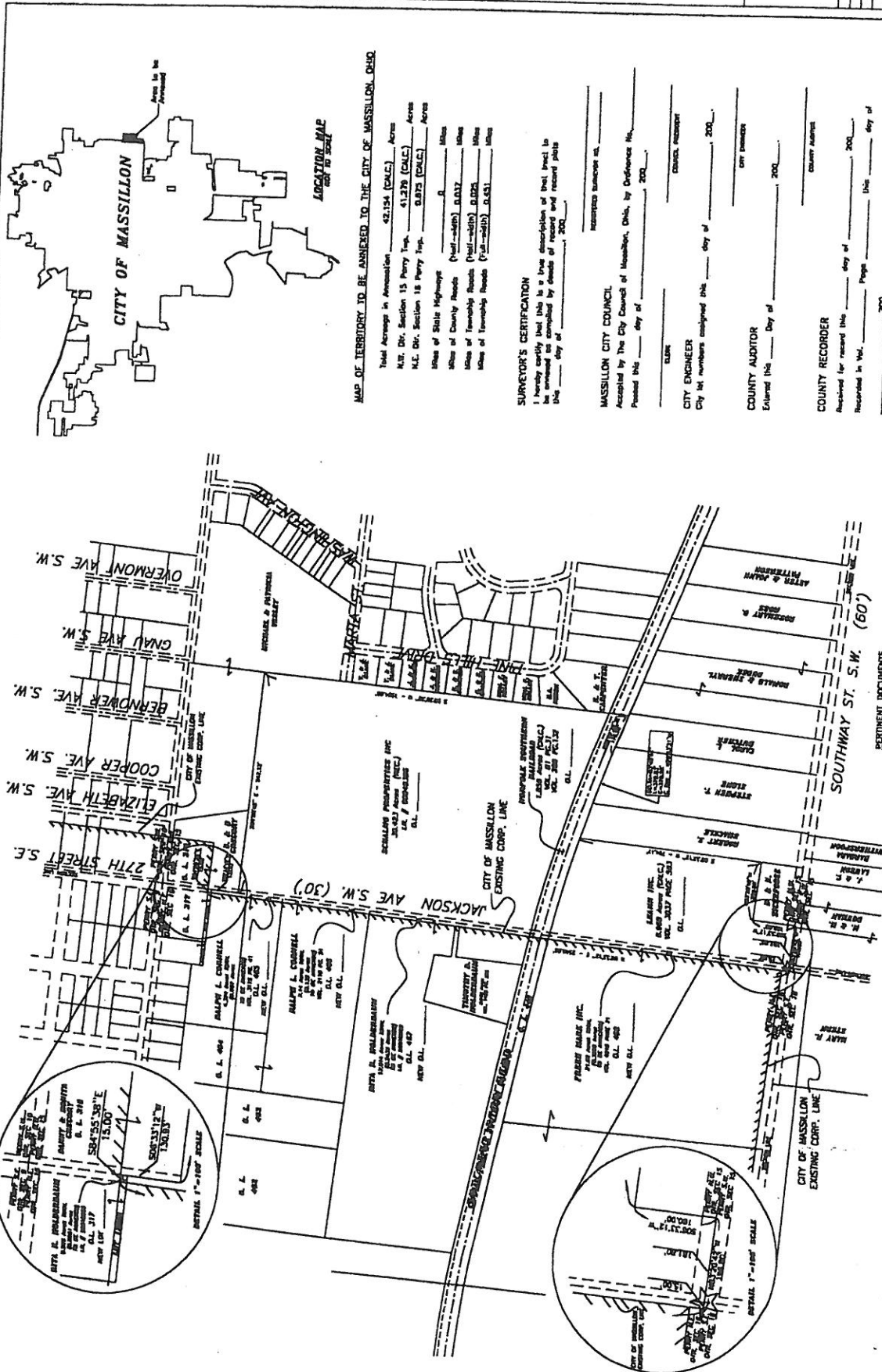
Section 2:

1. Thence N01°51'27"E along the east line of Lots 12597, 12594, 12593, 12590, 12587, 12586 and 12583 of said City of Massillon, a distance of 686.24 feet to a 5/8" bar set;
2. Thence S88°10'00"E along the south line of a parcel now or formerly owned by J. & E. Harford (674-587), a distance of 181.85 feet to a 1/2" pipe found;
3. Thence N01°53'40"E along the east line of said Harford parcel, a distance of 524.11 feet (passing over a 5/8" bar set at a distance of 488.78 feet);

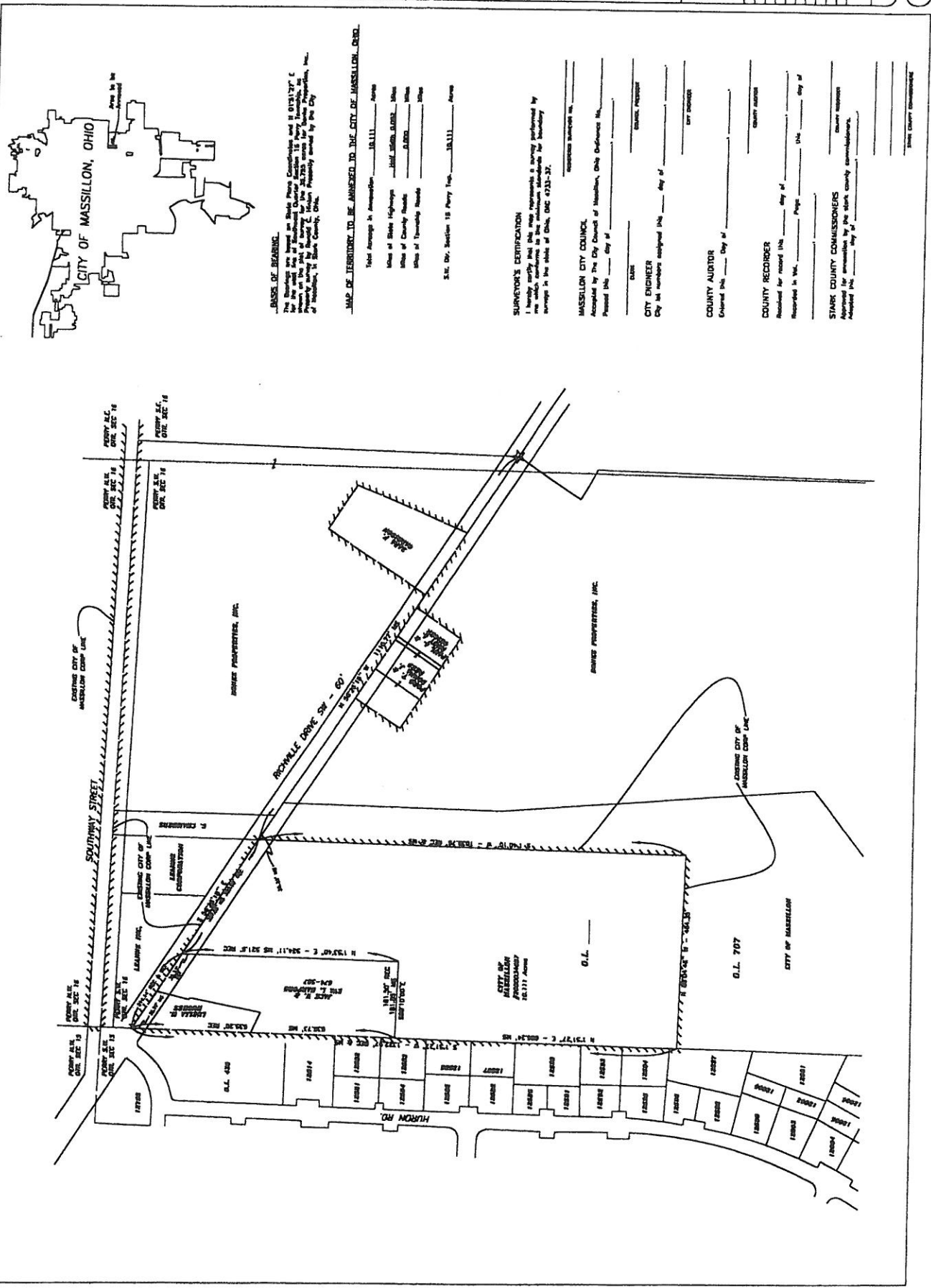

TITLE: AN ORDINANCE petitioning the Board of County Commissioners of Stark County, Ohio, for a change in the township lines of Massillon and Tuscarawas Township, and declaring an emergency.

WHEREAS, Massillon Township was erected to conform with the corporation limits of the City of Massillon, Stark County, Ohio by the Board of County Commissioners on August 19, 1963, and

WHEREAS, the corporation limits of the City of Massillon, Ohio, have been enlarged since the erection of said Massillon Township, through the annexation of one (1) tract of land comprising a part of Tuscarawas Township, and

WHEREAS, these annexed lands are still shown as a part of Tuscarawas Township, and the County Commissioners must amend the boundaries.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MASSILLON, STATE OF OHIO, THAT:

Section 1:

The Council of the City of Massillon, Ohio, hereby finds that the corporation limits of the City of Massillon includes one (1) tract of land which is part of Tuscarawas Township, Stark County, Ohio, and that it will be in the public interest of the City to have the boundaries of said Tuscarawas Township changed by excluding this one (1) tract of land from said Tuscarawas Township and adding this one (1) tract of land to Massillon Township within the corporation limits of the City.

Section 2:

The Board of County Commissioners of Stark County, Ohio, are hereby petitioned under the authority of Section 503.07 Ohio Revised Code, to change the Township boundaries of Tuscarawas Township and Massillon Township, all in Stark County, Ohio, by excluding from said Tuscarawas Township by adding to said Massillon Township the respective areas thereof which are presently located within the corporation limits of the City of Massillon, Ohio, which areas are described as follows:

Situated in the township of Tuscarawas, County of Stark, and State of Ohio, and known as and being part of the Southwest Quarter of Section 2, Township 12, (Tuscarawas), Range 10, and more fully bounded and described as follows:

Beginning at the Northwest corner of said Southwest quarter section and being the true place of beginning;

Thence S 89°49'51" E, following the North line of said Southwest quarter section, a distance of 585.75 feet to a point;

Thence along the west boundary of a tract of land currently or formerly or formerly owned by B. & B. Hamrick the following courses:

S 05°10'09" W a distance of 45.13 feet to a point;

S 81°21'39" E a distance of 75.10 feet to a point;

Thence along the west line of a tract of land currently or formerly owned by D. Kisner, on a bearing of S 06°29'21" W a distance of 219.36 feet to a point;

Thence along the southerly line of three tracts of land owned by D. Kisner, on a bearing of S 83°30'00" E a distance of 1052.15 feet to a point; said point being the Southeast corner of a tract of land currently or formerly owned by W. Amos,

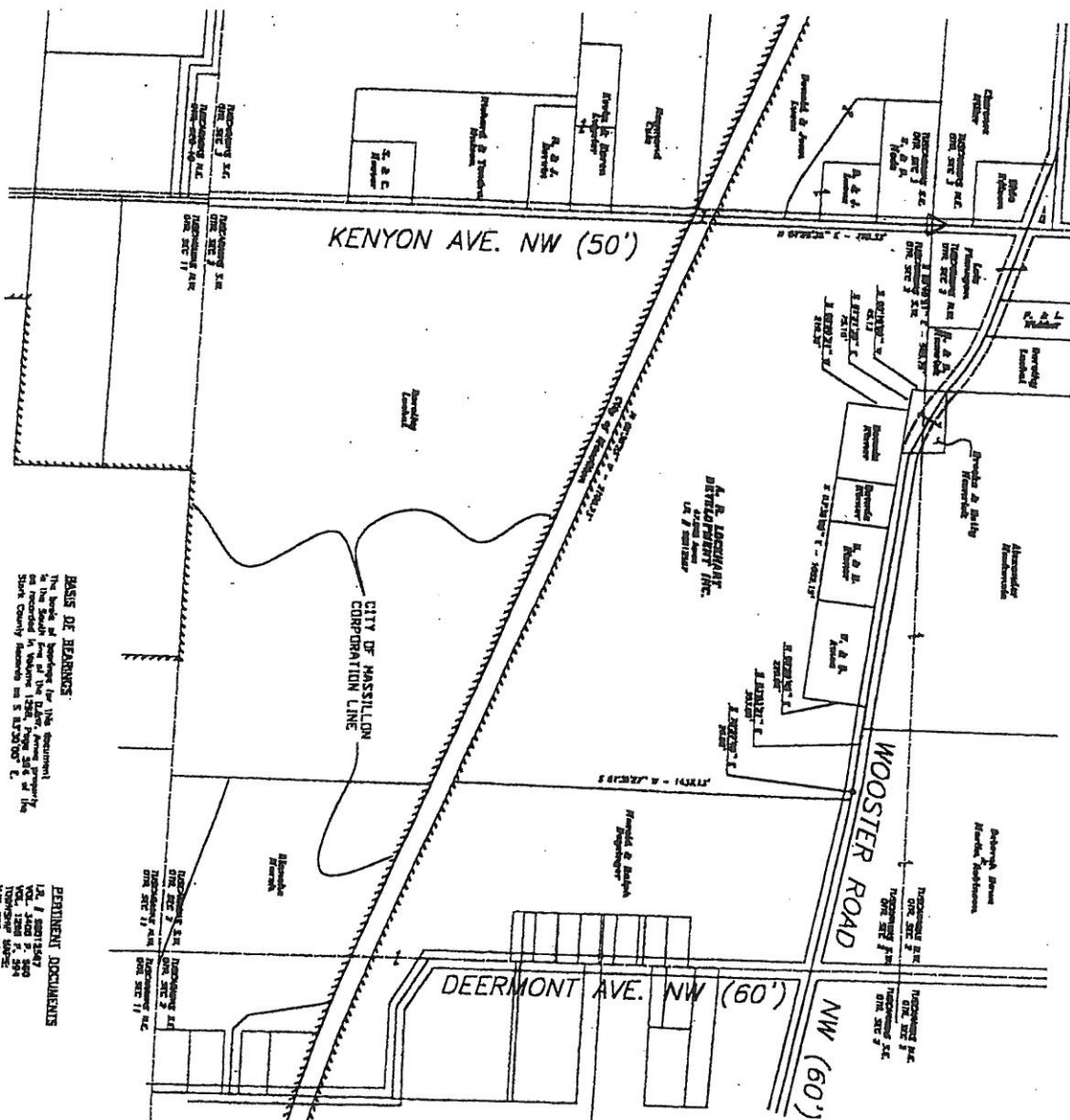

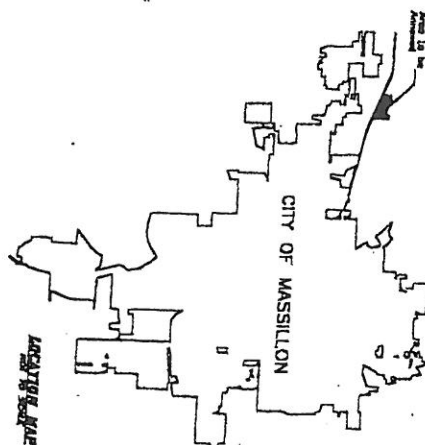

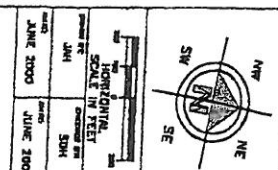

ORDINANCE NO. 248 - 2000

BY: COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT & ANNEXATION COMMITTEE

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF NOT TO EXCEED \$1,650,000 CITY OF MASSILLON, OHIO ADJUSTABLE RATE INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT REVENUE BONDS, SERIES 2000 (A.R.E. INC. PROJECT) FOR THE PURPOSE OF MAKING A LOAN TO ASSIST A.R.E. INC. IN THE FINANCING OF COSTS OF A "PROJECT" WITHIN THE MEANING OF CHAPTER 165, OHIO REVISED CODE; AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION AND DELIVERY OF A LOAN AGREEMENT PERTAINING TO THE PROJECT AND A TRUST INDENTURE SECURING THE PAYMENT OF THE BONDS; AND AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION AND DELIVERY OF A BOND PURCHASE AGREEMENT AND CERTAIN OTHER DOCUMENTS AND ACTIONS IN CONNECTION WITH THE ISSUANCE OF SUCH BONDS, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the City of Massillon, Ohio, a municipal corporation and political subdivision duly organized and validly existing under the laws of the State of Ohio, is authorized and empowered, by virtue of the laws of the State of Ohio, including without limitation, Section 13 of Article VIII, Ohio Constitution, and Chapter 165, as amended, Ohio Revised Code (the "Act"), (a) to issue its revenue bonds for the purpose of making a loan to assist in the financing of costs of acquiring, constructing and installing a "project", as defined in the Act, (b) to enter into a loan agreement and to provide for "revenues", as defined in the Act, sufficient to pay the principal of and interest and any premium on those revenue bonds, (c) to secure those revenue bonds by a trust indenture, as provided herein, and (d) to enact this Bond Legislation and to enter into the Indenture and the Agreement, all as defined herein, upon the terms and conditions provided herein and therein; and

WHEREAS, A.R.E. INC. (the "Borrower") has requested that the Issuer issue revenue bonds pursuant to the Act (the "Bonds") to assist the Borrower in financing the costs of acquiring, constructing and installing new robotics and related equipment and facility upgrades (the "Project") to be owned by the Borrower and used in its truck cap and truck lid manufacturing facility located at 400 Nave Road SE, Massillon, Ohio; and

WHEREAS, the Community Improvement Corporation of Massillon (the "CIC") has certified to the Issuer that the Project is in accordance with the plan for the industrial, commercial, distribution and research development of the Issuer heretofore confirmed by this City Council pursuant to Section 1724.10, Ohio Revised Code;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MASSILLON, STATE OF OHIO, THAT:

Section 1. Definitions. All words and terms used herein as defined words and terms but not otherwise defined herein shall have the respective meanings given to them in the Trust Indenture with respect to the Bonds (the "Indenture") between the Issuer and Bank One Trust Company, NA, and its successors in trust, as trustee (the "Trustee"), the substantially final form of which is on file with this Council.

Any reference herein to the Issuer or this Council (the "Issuing Authority") or to any officers, employees or members thereof, shall include those which succeed to their functions, duties or responsibilities pursuant to or by operation of law or who are lawfully performing their functions.

Unless the context shall otherwise indicate, words importing the singular number shall include the plural number, and vice versa, and the terms "hereof," "hereby," "hereto," "hereunder," and similar terms, mean this Bond Legislation.

Section 2. Determinations. This Issuing Authority determines that:

(a) The Project will be a "project" within the meaning of that term as defined in Section 165.01(H), Ohio Revised Code;

(b) The Project is consistent with the purposes of Section 13 of Article VIII, Ohio Constitution, to create or preserve jobs and employment opportunities and to improve the economic welfare of the people of the State of Ohio; and

(c) Provision of the loan to finance costs of the Project, including without limitation the financing thereof, will require the issuance, sale and delivery of the Bonds.

Section 3. Public Approval. This Issuing Authority, as the "applicable elected representative" of the Issuer for purposes of Section 147(f) of the Code, hereby approves the issuance of the Bonds in the maximum aggregate face amount of \$1,650,000.

This Issuing Authority also determines that, following reasonable notice, and prior to passage of this Bond Legislation, a public hearing was held with respect to the issuance of the Bonds, as required by Section 147(f) of the Code.

Section 4. Election of Capital Expenditure Limitation. The Issuer hereby elects to have the limitation on capital expenditures specified in Section 144(a)(4) of the Code apply to the Bonds.

Section 5. Authorization of Bonds. It is hereby determined to be necessary to, and the Issuer shall, issue, sell and deliver, as provided herein and in the Indenture and pursuant to the authority of the Act, the Bonds in the principal amount of not to exceed \$1,650,000 for the purpose of making a loan to assist the Borrower in financing the costs of the Project. The Bonds initially shall be issued in fully registered book entry only form and shall be designated "City of Massillon, Ohio Adjustable Rate Industrial Development Revenue Bonds, Series 2000 (A.R.E. INC. Project)." The final principal amount of the Bonds shall be set forth in the Indenture.

Section 6. Terms and Execution of the Bonds. The Bonds shall be issued in the forms and denominations and shall be numbered and payable as provided in the Indenture. The Bonds shall be dated as of the date of their initial delivery, shall mature on December 1, 2007 or such other maturity date not later than December 1, 2010 as shall be set forth in the Indenture, and shall have such terms, bear such interest (not to exceed 10% per annum), and be subject to mandatory and optional redemption as provided in the Indenture. This Issuing Authority hereby authorizes the Remarketing Agent to fix and establish the interest rate or rates in effect from time to time on the Bonds in the manner and pursuant to the provisions of the Indenture and the Remarketing Agreement. The Bonds shall be signed by the Mayor in his or her official capacity (provided that such signature may be facsimile). In case any officer whose signature or a facsimile thereof appears on the Bonds shall cease to be such officer before the issuance or delivery of the Bonds, such signature or facsimile thereof shall nevertheless be valid and sufficient for all purposes, the same as if he or she had remained in office until after that time.

The form of the Bonds submitted to this meeting, subject to appropriate insertions and revisions in order to comply with the provisions hereof and of the Indenture, are hereby approved, and when the same shall be executed on behalf of the Issuer by the appropriate officer thereof in the manner contemplated hereby and by the Indenture, in the maximum aggregate principal amount authorized hereby, shall represent the approved forms of Bonds.

Section 7. Sale of the Bonds. The Bonds are hereby sold at a purchase price of 100% of the principal amount thereof to Banc One Capital Markets, Inc. (the "Underwriter"). The Mayor is authorized and directed to make on behalf of the Issuer the necessary arrangements with the Underwriter to establish the date, location, procedure and conditions for the delivery of the Bonds, and to take all steps necessary to effect due execution and delivery of the Bonds under the terms of this Bond Legislation, the Bond Purchase Agreement, the Agreement and the Indenture. The Mayor is further authorized to determine on behalf of the Issuer that the final principal amount and terms of the Bonds, and the

sale thereof, all as provided in the aforesaid documents, are in the best interests of the Issuer and consistent with all legal requirements, such determination to be conclusively evidenced by the execution by such officer of those documents pursuant to Section 9 hereof. The proceeds from the sale of the Bonds shall be deposited and applied as provided in the Indenture and the Agreement.

Section 8. Arbitrage and Information Reporting Provisions.
The Issuer covenants that it will restrict the use of the proceeds of the Bonds in such manner and to such extent as may be necessary so that the Bonds will not constitute arbitrage bonds under Section 148 of the Code, after taking into account reasonable expectations at the time of the delivery of and payment for the Bonds.

The Mayor, the Auditor or any other officer having responsibility for issuing the Bonds, either alone or in conjunction with the Borrower or any officer, employee, agent of or consultant to the Borrower, shall give:

(i) an appropriate certificate or certificates of the Issuer for inclusion in the transcript of proceedings for the Bonds setting forth the reasonable expectations of the Issuer regarding the amount and use of the proceeds of the Bonds and the facts, estimates and circumstances on which they are based and other facts and circumstances relevant to the tax treatment of interest on the Bonds, as provided by the Borrower, all as of the date or dates of delivery of and payment for the Bonds; and

(ii) the statement setting forth the information required by Section 149(e) of the Code, which shall be based on the relevant information provided by the Borrower including an appropriate certificate, if required, setting forth information regarding the volume cap applicable to the Issuer for use in obtaining the certification required by Section 149(e)(2)(F) of the Code.

The Issuer covenants that it (i) will take, or require to be taken, all actions that may be required of it for the interest on the Bonds to be and remain excluded from gross income of the owners thereof for federal income tax purposes, and (ii) will not take or authorize to be taken any actions that would adversely affect that exclusion under the provisions of the Code. The Mayor, the Auditor and other appropriate officers are hereby authorized and directed to take any and all actions and make or give reports and certifications, as may be appropriate to assure such exclusion of that interest.

Section 9. Authorization of Agreement, Indenture, Bond Purchase Agreement, Offering Memorandum and All Other Documents to be Executed by the Issuer. In order to better secure the payment

of the principal of, premium, if any, and interest on the Bonds as the same shall become due and payable, and to provide for the financing of the Project, the Mayor is authorized and directed to execute, acknowledge and deliver, in the name and on behalf of the Issuer, the Agreement, the Indenture and the Bond Purchase Agreement, in substantially the forms submitted to and now on file with the Issuer which are hereby approved, with such changes therein not inconsistent with this Bond Legislation and not substantially adverse to the Issuer as may be permitted by the Act and approved by the officer executing the same on behalf of the Issuer. The approval of such changes by such officer, and that such are not substantially adverse to the Issuer, shall be conclusively evidenced by the execution of the Agreement, the Indenture and the Bond Purchase Agreement by such officer.

The Issuer has no objection to the use and distribution of an Offering Memorandum (the "Offering Memorandum"), in substantially the form submitted to and now on file with the Issuer, in connection with the issuance, sale and delivery of the Bonds. However, the Issuer has not confirmed, and assumes no responsibility for, the accuracy, completeness or fairness of any statements in the Offering Memorandum or any other written materials used in connection with the offer and sale of the Bonds or in any way relating to the Project, the Borrower, the Bank, the Remarketing Agent or the Underwriter.

The Mayor and the Auditor are each separately authorized to take any and all actions and to execute such financing statements, assignments, certificates and other instruments that may be necessary or appropriate in the opinion of the Issuer's bond counsel, in order to effect the issuance of the Bonds, the financing of the Project and the intent of this Bond Legislation.

Section 10. Covenants of Issuer. In addition to other covenants of the Issuer in this Bond Legislation, the Issuer further covenants and agrees as follows:

(a) Payment of Principal, Premium and Interest. The Issuer will, solely from the sources herein or in the Indenture provided, pay or cause to be paid the principal of, premium, if any, and interest on each and all Bonds on the dates, at the places and in the manner provided herein, in the Indenture and in the Bonds.

(b) Performance of Covenants, Authority and Actions. The Issuer will at all times faithfully observe and perform all agreements, covenants, undertakings, stipulations and provisions contained in the Bonds, the Agreement, the Bond Purchase Agreement and the Indenture, and in all proceedings of the Issuer pertaining to the Bonds. The Issuer warrants and covenants that it is, and upon delivery of the Bonds will be, duly authorized by the laws of the State, including particularly and without limitation the Act,

to issue the Bonds and to execute the Agreement, the Bond Purchase Agreement and the Indenture, and all other documents to be executed by it, to provide for the security for payment of the principal of, premium, if any, and interest on the Bonds in the manner and to the extent herein and in the Indenture set forth; that all actions on its part for the issuance of the Bonds and execution and delivery of the Agreement, the Bond Purchase Agreement and the Indenture and all other documents to be executed by it in connection with the issuance of the Bonds, have been or will be duly and effectively taken; and that the Bonds will be valid and enforceable special obligations of the Issuer according to the terms thereof.

Section 11. Transcript of Proceedings. The Clerk of Council, or other appropriate officer of the Issuer, shall furnish to the Underwriter a true transcript of proceedings, certified by the Clerk of Council or other officer, of (i) all proceedings had with reference to the issuance of the Bonds and (ii) any other information from the records of the Issuer which may be necessary or appropriate to determine the regularity and validity of the issuance of the Bonds.

Section 12. No Debt or Tax Pledge. Anything in the Bond Legislation, the Bonds or the Indenture to the contrary notwithstanding, the Bonds do not and shall not represent or constitute a debt or pledge of the faith and credit of the Issuer, and the Bonds shall contain a statement to that effect and to the effect that the Bonds are payable solely from the Revenues and are not secured by an obligation or pledge of any moneys raised by taxation. Nothing herein or in the Indenture, however, shall be deemed to prohibit the Issuer, of its own volition, from using to the extent that it is authorized by law to do so, any other resources for the fulfillment of any of the terms, conditions or obligations of the Indenture, the Bond Legislation or any of the Bonds.

Section 13. Prevailing Rates of Wages. As provided in Section 165.031, Ohio Revised Code, all wages paid to laborers and mechanics employed on the Project shall be paid at not less than the prevailing rates of wages for laborers and mechanics for each class of work called for by the Project, which wages shall be determined in accordance with the requirements of Chapter 4115, Ohio Revised Code, for determination of prevailing wage rates.

Section 14. Compliance with Open Meeting Requirements. This Issuing Authority hereby finds and determines that all formal actions relative to the adoption of this Bond Legislation were taken in an open meeting of this Issuing Authority, and that all deliberations of this Issuing Authority and of its committees, which resulted in those formal actions, were in meetings open to the public in compliance with the law.

Section 15. Effective Date. This Ordinance is declared to be an emergency measure immediately necessary for the preservation of the health, safety and welfare of the City of Massillon, Ohio and for the further reason that issuance of the Bonds is necessary so as to maximize jobs and employment opportunities within the City of Massillon, Ohio. Provided it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the elected members to Council it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor. Otherwise it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
