NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MASSILLON, STATE OF OHIO, THAT:

#### Section I:

Ordinance No. 228 - 1996 be and is hereby repealed.

#### Section 2:

That there be and hereby is enacted a new Section 13 "ALLOCATION OF FUNDS - INCOME TAX" of Ordinance No. 143 - 1976. Said new Section 13 shall read as follows:

# Section 13 - ALLOCATION OF FUNDS

- (A) Effective October 1, 2001 through December 31, 2001 the funds collected under the provision of this ordinance shall be disbursed as follows:
  - (1) One Hundred (100) percent shall be deposited in the General Fund and shall be used to defray operating expenses of the City including such part thereof as shall be necessary to defray all costs of administering and enforcing the provisions thereof.
- (B) Effective January 1, 2002 the funds collected under the provisions of this ordinance shall be disbursed as follows:
  - (1) Ninety (90) percent shall be deposited in the General Fund and shall be used to defray operating expenses of the city including such part thereof as shall be necessary to defray all costs of administering and enforcing the provisions thereof.

- (2) There is hereby created a separate fund entitled "Income Tax Capital Improvement Fund". Ten (10) percent shall be deposited in said "Income Tax Capital Improvements" and shall be used for capital improvements.
- (3) Capital Improvements are all property, assets, machinery, equipment or improvements which the City is authorized by law to acquire, construct and maintain, including plans and studies thereof with an estimated life or usefulness of five (5) years or more, including land and interests therein, and including reconstructions, enlargements and extension thereof having an estimated life or usefulness of five (5) years or more provided, however, that the purchase of motorized equipment for the various city departments and the resurfacing and resealing of public streets, including "Chip and Seal" method, shall be deemed Capital Improvement without regard to estimated life or usefulness.

# Section 3:

This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, welfare and safety and the emergency being the necessity of providing funds for the operation of necessary governmental functions imposed by law, including the proper police and fire protection, but not limited thereto, for, without said funds, said governmental functions would have to be curtailed to such an extent that the public safety and welfare would be greatly jeopardized. And provided it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the elected members to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor. Otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the health, safety, and welfare of the community, and for the reason that the grant is necessary to provide the Massillon Police Department to allow the City of Massillon to update the echnology for the department. WHEREAS, Senate Bill 114 proposes to limit the Prevailing Wage Law to construction projects undertaken by or pursuant to a contract with the state on state-owned structures, instead of construction projects undertaken by political subdivisions as provided under current law; and

WHEREAS, as elected representatives for the people of Massillon, we strongly oppose Senate bill 114 and urge its defeat. Prevailing wage was designed to establish a fair rate of wages to be paid to workmen and mechanics employed in construction of public improvements, and has been the law 'Massillon for many years; and

WHEREAS, prevailing wage sends a strong public policy message that only the best contractors with the best-trained and best-qualified workforce should be engaged in the important business of construction public projects; and

WHEREAS, the basis for the prevailing wage and collective bargaining relationship is a fundamental understanding that the success and growth of skilled trades employees is linked to job opportunities for skilled trades employees. For public projects, this means predictability, cost containment, meeting deadlines and budgets, and enhancing job opportunities and economic development;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MASSILLON, STATE OF OHIO, THAT:

#### Section 1:

BY: COMMITTEE OF THE WHOLE

TITLE: A RESOLUTION endorsing the Stark County Park District's half mill replacement levy for the preservation of green space and wildlife habitat, the continued development of the Ohio & Erie Canal National Heritage Corridor, and the building of additional trails throughout the county.

WHEREAS, the Stark County Park District is asking voters to replace a half-mill levy adopted in 1997 with another half-mill levy to be collected for six years, commencing in 2002, first due in calendar year 2003, and

WHEREAS, the Stark County Park District has expanded from a 400-acre district to a truly countywide system encompassing 3,500 acres in eight townships and one city; and

WHEREAS, the preservation of green space and the completion of the proposed Stark County Trail and Greenway System will promote passive recreation, education, conservation and the economic vitality of our county; and

WHEREAS, the Stark County Park District has committed to preserving 80% of all future large-tract acquisitions as open space not to be developed; and

WHEREAS, the Stark County Park District's completion of the dredging of Sippo Lake in Perry Township and Cook Lagoon in the City of Canton have improved fishing and water quality for central Stark County residents; and

WHEREAS, the Stark County Park District's clean-up of litter at Walborn and Deer Creek Reservoirs in eastern Stark County has improved the recreation potential of that area; and

WHEREAS, the Stark County Park District's construction of a new marina, boat launch, and restrooms at Walborn Reservoir have expanded recreational services to area boater and anglers; and

WHEREAS, the Stark County Park District's grant program has provided emergency equipment to area townships and recreation departments, has helped provide restroom facilities at Lincoln Park along the Sippo Valley Trail, and has provided trailed parking at the new Massillon Recreation Center;

WHEREAS, the Stark County Park District has built 30 miles of multi-use recreational trail along the Ohio & Erie Canal National Heritage Corridor; and

WHEREAS, the Stark County Park District has opened a new outdoor education center in Lake Township, thus preserving 12 acres including a fishing pond and woods; and

WHEREAS, the Stark County Park District's land stewardship and educational programs have increased three-fold since 1997;
