## \*AMENDED ORDINANCE NO. 80 - 2002

#### BY: COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE

TITLE: AN ORDINANCE authorizing the Director of Public Service and Safety to enter into a purchase agreement between the City of Massillon and the development group "21 Lincoln Way Project, LLC" for the redevelopment of the sites currently known as the Ohio Drilling and Consolidani properties, and declaring an emergency.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MASSILLON, STATE OF OHIO, THAT:

#### Section 1:

The Council of the City of Massillon, Ohio, hereby finds that it is necessary to enter into a purchase agreement between the City of Massillon and the development group "21 Lincoln Way "oject, LLC" for the redevelopment of the sites currently known as the Ohio Drilling and Jonsolidani properties.

#### Section 2:

The Director of Public Service and Safety of the City of Massillon, Ohio, is hereby authorized and directed to enter into a purchase agreement between the City of Massillon and the development group "21 Lincoln Way Project, LLC" for the redevelopment of the sites currently known as the Ohio Drilling and Consolidani properties. \*The purchase agreement shall be prepared and approved by the Massillon Law Department.

#### Section 3:

The cost of said property shall be Two Hundred Twenty Five Thousand Dollars (\$225,000.00).

#### Section 4:

This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the health, safety, and welfare of the community, and for the additional reason that it is necessary that the contract agreement be entered into for the purchase of the sites currently known as the Ohio Drilling and Consolidani properties in the redevelopment area of the City of sillon. Provided it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the elected members to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor. Otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
