NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MASSILLON, STATE OF OHIO, THAT:

Section 1:

It is hereby determined to be in best interest and promotion of the general health, safety and convenience, comfort, prosperity and welfare of the community to change the designation of the area set forth in Section 2 hereof from R-3 Single Family Residential to R-CRD Condominium Residential District. Said rezoning was approved by the Planning Commission of the City of Massillon, Ohio, on June 18th, 2003 and that notice and public hearing has been given according to law.

Section 2:

The City of Massillon, Ohio, Zone Map as identified by Chapter 1151.02 of the Massillon Code of 1985, be and is hereby amended to show the following described area as R-CRD Condominium Residential District.

Part of Out Lot No. 933, an approximate 18 acre parcel located at the northwest corner of Hankins Road and Valerie Avenue NE. The property will be used for the purpose of constructing a condominium community consisting of 84 units plus a community clubhouse with a swimming pool.

Section 3:

This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure in that the use herein provided for is essential to the proper community growth and hence immediately necessary for the preservation of the health, safety and welfare of the community and that this property would best be served to be designated R-CRD Condominium Residential District. WHEREAS, the City of Massillon carries out a variety of economic development programs designed to promote the creation and expansion of business and industry in the community; and

WHEREAS, Shearer's Foods, Inc, of Brewster has opened a distribution warehouse, in Massillon located at 4360 Sterilite SE.; and

WHEREAS, Shearer's Foods, Inc, of Brewster through this proposed business expansion, plans to provide 25 new full time jobs in the city; and

WHEREAS, the City of Massillon proposes to assist Shearer's Foods, Inc, of Brewster in this expansion of its operations by providing an economic development "inducement grant", the purpose of which is to help offset the company's costs in relocating its operations to Massillon.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MASSILLON STATE OF OHIO, THAT:

Section 1:

This Council hereby authorizes the Mayor to enter into an agreement with Shearer's Foods, Inc, of Brewster providing an economic development "inducement grant," in a total amount not to exceed Fifteen Thousand Dollars (\$15,000.00) for the purpose of assisting the company in expanding its operations in Massillon.

Section 2:

In return for this economic development grant assistance, Shearer's Foods, Inc, of Brewster shall provide the City with information regarding the number of jobs that it has provided as a result of the company's expansion in Massillon.

Section 3:

This Ordinance is declared to be an emergency measure immediately necessary for the preservation of the health, safety, and welfare of the community and for the additional reason that it is necessary to improve the economic climate of the community through the expansion of business and employment opportunities. Provided it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the elected members to Council it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor. Otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

Each days failure to comply with any such provision shall constitute a separate violation.

Section 3:

This ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure, the reason for the emergency being that said enactments are necessary for the more efficient operation of the Building Department of the City of Massillon, Ohio, and for the additional reason for the preservation of the public health, safety and welfare of the community. And provided it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the elected members to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor. Otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
