Lots over 12,001 sq. ft. an additional 10% increase (100 sq. ft.) An accessory building used exclusively for the storage of motor vehicles shall not contain more ground floor area than the main structure and shall be as defined under 1121.02 (30) "Garage, private" of the Massillon City Ordinance. Otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
