961.09 FIRES.

No person shall build, burn or maintain a fire on any park lands in the City except in units constructed as outdoor ovens or fireplaces, and all fires shall be extinguished before the persons starting such fires shall leave the park property. (Ord. 135-1984. Passed 10-1-84.)

961.10 FIREARMS OR FIREWORKS.

No person shall fire, discharge or set off within the boundaries of the City parks any firearms, rocket, torpedo or fireworks of any character whatsoever, unless a written permit is first obtained from the Park Board. (Ord. 135-1984. Passed 10-1-84.)

961.11 ADVERTISING PROHIBITED.

No person shall place or otherwise permanently affix any bill, notice, advertisement, sign or paper within City park boundaries, nor upon any fence, tree, or other protective or decorative device surrounding City park property, or upon such property without approval of City Council. A person may place or otherwise affix any temporary bill, notice, advertisement, sign or paper within City park boundaries with permission from the Parks and Recreation Board. (Ord. 55-1997. Passed 4-21-97.)

961.12 GAMBLING PROHIBITED.

No persons shall be permitted to indulge in any game of chance or gambling in any manner or form within the boundaries of the City parks. (Ord. 135-1984. Passed 10-1-84.)

961.13 LIQUOR, DRUGS PROHIBITED.

No person shall possess or use any intoxicating liquor, beer, illegal drugs or controlled substances of any form whatsoever on park property in the City. (Ord. 135-1984. Passed 10-1-84.)

961.14 PUBLIC DECENCY.

No person shall use threatening, abusive, boisterous, profane or indecent language on any public park grounds, and no person shall commit any obscene or indecent act while on the premises.

(Ord. 135-1984. Passed 10-1-84.)

961.15 ANIMALS.

No person shall tie or release in a public park, or permit any animal whatsoever to run at large within the boundaries of any City park. Further restrictions shall be imposed in South Sippo, North Sippo and Resevoir Parks prohibiting all domestic animals other than for assistance to visually impaired persons. (Ord. 25-1998. Passed 2-2-98.)

961.16 MUSICAL INSTRUMENTS.

No person shall play upon any musical instrument in a boisterous manner within the boundaries of the City park property, nor shall any group of persons (two or more) play as a unit for dancing or the like for fee or otherwise, without having proper written consent of the City Park Commission or its proper representatives. Further, no person shall utilize any type of amplification devices in City parks without first obtaining the written approval of the Park Board.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MASSILLON, STATE OF OHIO, THAT:

Section I:

The Council of the City of Massillon, Ohio, hereby determines it to be necessary in the public health, safety and welfare to enter into a contract without competitive bidding, with MS Consultants, Inc., for the development of an in-lake sediment detention area and stream restoration recommendations for the Reservoir/Sippo Creek Corridor.

Section 2:

The Director of Public Service and Safety of the City of Massillon, Ohio, is hereby authorized and directed to enter into a contract without competitive bidding with MS Consultants, Inc., for the development of an in-lake sediment detention area and stream restoration recommendations for the Reservoir/Sippo Creek Corridor.

Section 3:

That the contract for this professional service will not exceed the amount of Sixteen Thousand Eight Hundred and Eighty -Three Dollars (\$16,883.00).

Section 4:

This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the preservation of the health, safety and welfare of the community and for the additional reason that MS Consultants, Inc., has the experience and technology and familiarity with the project and the area to perform the required services. Provided it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the elected members to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and

ORDINANCE NO. 163 - 2003

BY: FINANCE COMMITTEE

TITLE: AN ORDINANCE authorizing the Auditor of the City of Massillon to deposit the three-tenths percent (.3%) City Income Tax for the Parks and Recreation System into the "Parks and Recreation Operations Fund", "Park and Recreation Debt Retirement Fund" and the "Park and Recreation Capitol Improvement Fund", and declaring an emergency.

WHEREAS, the electors of the City of Massillon voted to raise the city income tax rate by three-tenths percent (.3%) effective January 1st, 1996 and to be used exclusively for the parks and recreation system in the City of Massillon.

WHEREAS, it is necessary to determine what percentage of the tax collected for the Parks and Recreation Department shall be deposited into the "Parks and Recreation Operations Fund", "Park and Recreation Debt Retirement Fund" and the "Park and Recreation Capitol Improvement Fund".

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MASSILLON, STATE OF OHIO, THAT:

Section 1:

It is hereby determined that it is necessary for the Auditor of the City of Massillon to deposit a portion of the three-tenths percent (.3%) City Income Tax for the parks and recreation system into the "Parks and Recreation Fund", "Park and Recreation Capital Improvement Fund" and the "Park and Recreation Bond Retirement Fund".

Section 2:

Effective October 1, 2003 through December 31, 2003 the Auditor of the City of Massillon is hereby authorized to deposit the following percentages into the following funds from the amounts collected from the income tax for the Parks and Recreation Department:

- 1.) Seventy percent (70%) shall be deposited into the "Parks and Recreation Operations 1234 Fund".
- 2.) Thirty percent (30%) shall be deposited into the "Park and Recreation Debt Retirement 1306 Fund".
- Zero percent (0%) shall be deposited into the "Park and Recreation Capitol Improvement 1433 Fund".

Section 3:

Effective January 1, 2004 the Auditor of the City of Massillon is hereby authorized to deposit the following percentages into the following funds from the amounts collected from the income tax for the Parks and Recreation Department:

- 1.) Fifty percent (50%) shall be deposited into the "Parks and Recreation Operations 1234 Fund".
- 2.) Forty percent (40%) shall be deposited into the "Park and Recreation Debt Retirement 1306 Fund".
- Ten percent (10%) shall be deposited into the "Park and Recreation Capitol Improvement 1433 Fund".

Section 4:

That Ordinance No. 117 - 2001 be and is hereby repealed as of October 31, 2003.

Section 5:

That this Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the health, safety and welfare of the community, and for the further reason that said funds are necessary to provide sufficient funds to adequately maintain the Park and Recreation Department and provide sufficient funds for the operations of the department on a daily basis. Provided it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the elected members to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor. Otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
