TITLE: AN ORDINANCE authorizing the Director of Public Service and Safety of the City of Massillon, Ohio, to advertise for and receive sealed bids, according to law, for the sale of a certain tract of land approximately 1.3 acres of land at the northwest corner of State Route 21 and Indian River Road, in the City of Massillon, Stark County, Ohio and owned by said City, which is not needed for any municipal purpose, and declaring an emergency.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MASSILLON, STATE OF OHIO, THAT:

Section 1:

The Council of the City of Massillon, Ohio, hereby determines it to be necessary in the public health, safety and welfare to advertise for and receive sealed bids, according to law, for the sale of a certain tract of land approximately 1.3 acres of land at the northwest corner of State Route 21 and Indian River Road in the City of Massillon, Stark County, Ohio and owned by said City, which is not needed for any municipal purpose.

Section 2:

The following described real estate belonging to the City of Massillon, Ohio, is not needed for any municipal purpose, to-wit:

Located at the northwest corner of State Route 21 and Indian River Road being approximately 1.3 acres of land, in the City of Massillon, Ohio, County of Stark and State of Ohio.

Section 3:

The Director of Public Safety and Service be and is hereby authorized to advertise for and receive sealed bids, according to law, for the sale of a certain tract of land approximately 1.3 acres of land at the northwest corner of State Route 21 and Indian River Road, in the City of Massillon, Stark County, Ohio and owned by said City, which is not needed for any municipal purpose.

Section 4:

The advertisement for the bidding of said real estate shall contain the following instructions:

- 1). Each bidder shall be prepared to review with the administration of the City of Massillon and City Council their intended use for the real estate.
- 2). The successful bidder shall be responsible to pay all fees and costs associated with the sale and transfer of said property.
- 3). The City reserves the right to reject any and all bids.

Section 5:

This Ordinance is declared to be an emergency measure immediately necessary for the preservation of the public health, safety and welfare of the community and for the further reason that it is necessary to dispose of real estate no longer needed for any municipal purpose for the best price obtainable. In addition the emergency passage of this Ordinance will enable the City to sell the land faster and potentially generate revenue. And provided it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the elected members to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor. Otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

TITLE: AN ORDINANCE amending Section 1151.02 of the Massillon Code of 1985 rezoning a certain tract of land from RM-1 Multiple Family Residential to P-1 Vehicular Parking and B-2 Central Business District;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MASSILLON, STATE OF OHIO, THAT:

Section 1:

It is hereby determined to be in the best interest and promotion of the general health, safety and convenience, comfort, prosperity and welfare of the community to change the designation of the area set forth in Section 2 hereof from RM-1 Multiple Family Residential to P-1 Vehicular Parking and B-2 Central Business District. Said rezoning was approved by the Planning Commission of the City of Massillon, Ohio, on July 9th, 2003 and that notice and public hearing has been given according to law.

Section 2:

The City of Massillon, Ohio, Zone Map as identified by Section 1151.02 of the Massillon Code of 1985, be and is hereby amended to show the following described area as P-1 Vehicular Parking and B-2 Central Business District.

Lot No. 611 located on the west side of 2nd Street NE between North and Thorne Avenue NE, shall be designated as P-1 Vehicular Parking. Lot No. 613 located at 207 2nd Street NE shall be designated as B-2 Central Business District. Lot No. 621 a vacant lot on the south side of Thorne Avenue NE between 1st and 2nd Street NE shall be designated as P-1 Vehicular Parking. The properties are owned by F & M Properties and will be used for parking and access to the commercial property located at 136 North Avenue NE.

Section 3:

Provided that this Ordinance receives approval by a majority of the elected members of Council it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

That any prior ordinance or part of any ordinance that may be in conflict with this ordinance, be and is hereby repealed.

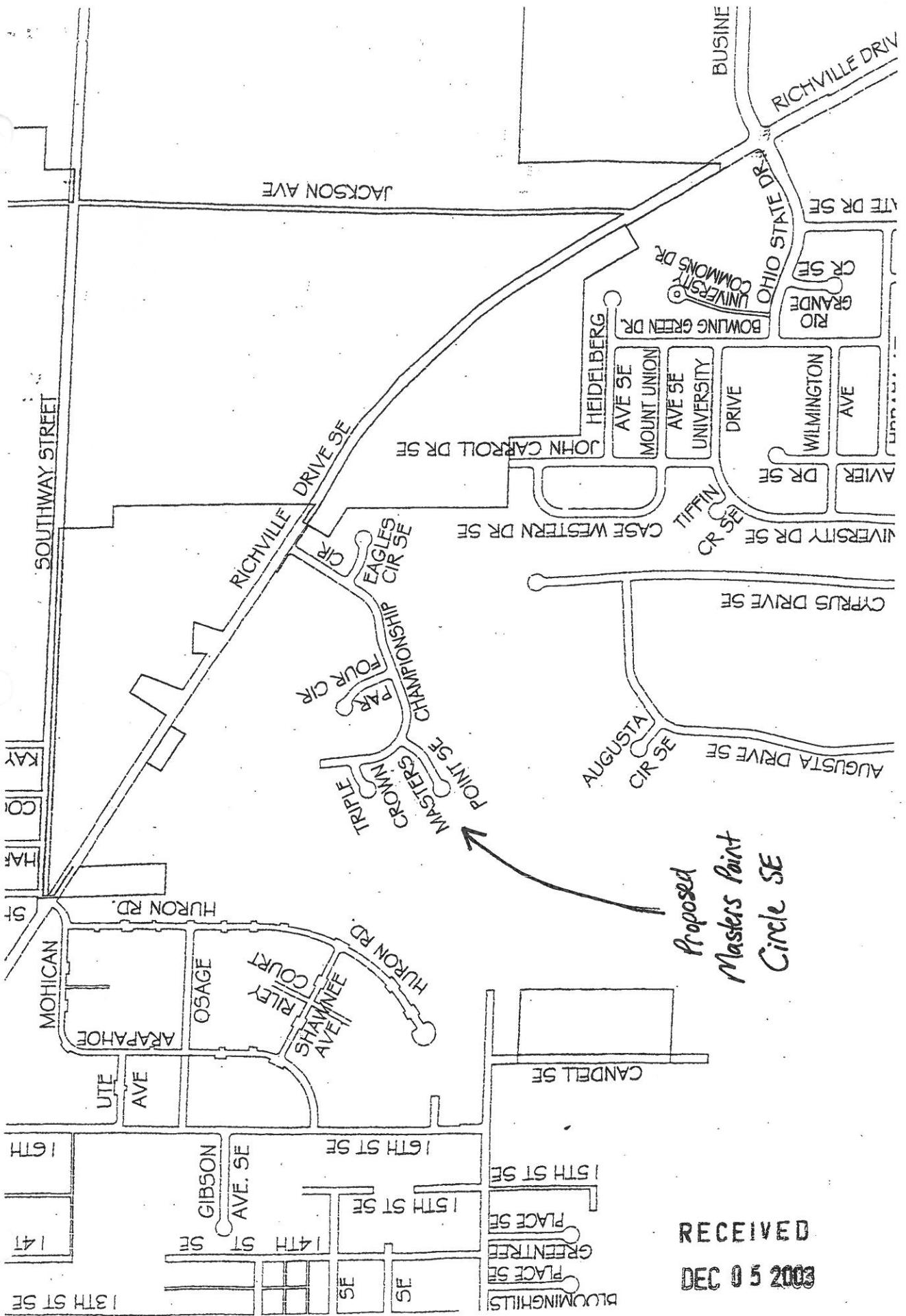

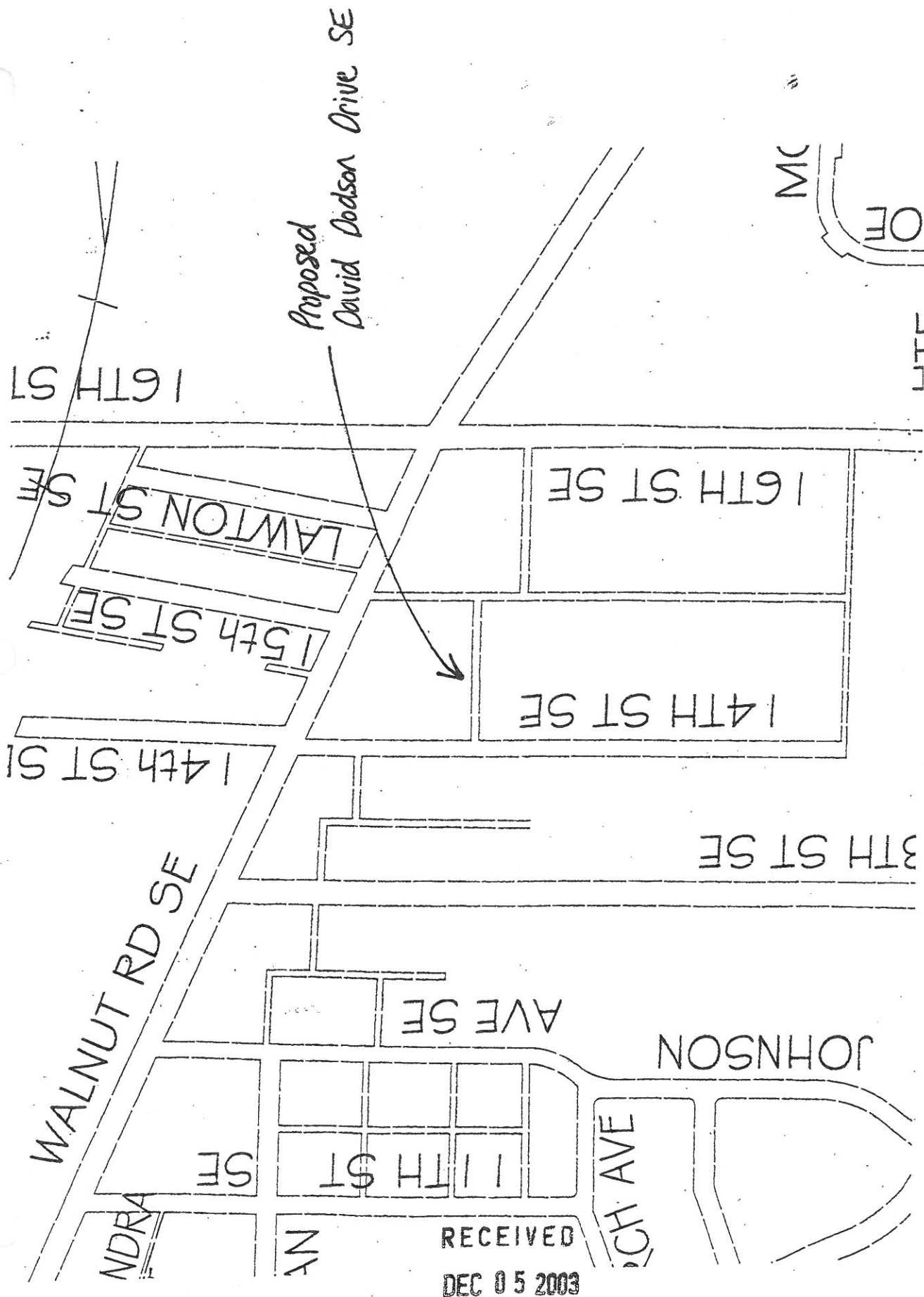

ORDINANCE NO. 198 - 2003

BY: POLICE AND FIRE COMMITTEE

TITLE: AN ORDINANCE appointing certain employees within the City Fire Department as Fire Investigators pursuant to Ohio Revised Code Section 737.27, and declaring an emergency.

WHEREAS, Ohio Revised Code Section 737.27 states in part that the legislative authority of a municipal corporation may invest any officer of the Fire or Police Department with the power and impose on him the duty, to be present at all fires, investigate the cause thereof...and perform all other acts necessary to the effective discharge of such duties, and,

WHEREAS, the establishment and appointment of Fire Investigators within the City of Massillon would increase public safety, now, therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MASSILLON, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1:

The Council of the City of Massillon, Ohio, hereby appoints Fire Department employee Larry R. Layne as Fire Investigators pursuant to Ohio Revised Code Section 737.27. Council agrees that the appointments will make the Fire Department duties easier to perform. This is not an addition of duties, therefore, no enhanced compensation is required.

Section 2:

The Council of the City of Massillon, Ohio, declares this Ordinance to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety and welfare of the inhabitants of the City of Massillon, Ohio for the reason that the establishment and appointment of Fire Investigators within the City of Massillon should occur immediately to increase public safety, wherefore, this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and immediately after its passage and approval by the Mayor.
