Section 1:

The Final Plat for Orchard Hill Estates, in the City of Massillon, Stark County, Ohio, presently on file in the Office of the City Engineer, is hereby approved and accepted and that the dedication to public use is hereby accepted and confirmed. This plat was approved by the Planning Commission at a meeting held July14th 2004. The undertaking given by the owners for improvement of streets and now on file with the City Engineer is approved. The description of Orchard Hill Estates is as follows:

BY: COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE

AN ORDINANCE ACCEPTING A CONVEYANCE OF PROPERTY FROM THE OWNER OR A PERSPECTIVE DEVELOPER AND APPROVING A RECONVEYANCE TO THE OWNER OR THE DEVELOPER AS REQUIRED BY SECTION 5709.41(B) OF THE OHIO REVISED CODE, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, Ohio Revised Code Sections 5709.40, 5709.41, 5709.42 and 5709.43 (the "TIF Statutes") provide that the City Council (the "Council") of the City of Massillon (the "City") may (i) describe certain improvements to be made which benefit or serve parcels of real property (the "Parcels") related to Meadows Plaza Development (the "Development"), and described on Exhibit A attached hereto, (ii) declare certain improvements as defined in Revised Code Section 5709.41 with respect to such Parcels to be a public purpose, thereby authorizing the exemption of those improvements from real property taxation for a period of time, (iii) provide for the making of service payments in lieu of taxes by the owners of such Parcels, and (iv) establish a municipal public improvement tax increment equivalent fund into which such service payments shall be deposited; and

WHEREAS, in order to take the actions described in the first clause of this Ordinance, the City must hold title to the Parcels prior to the adoption of the tax increment financing ("TIF") Ordinance, pursuant to Ohio Revised Code Section 5709.41(B); and

WHEREAS, Council wishes to accept conveyance of the Parcels, from the owner or developer (collectively, the "Owner"), and to reconvey such Parcels to said Owner;

WHEREAS, the City has determined that it is necessary and appropriate and in the best interest of the City to accept such conveyance and to reconvey the Parcels as described above; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MASSILLON, COUNTY OF STARK, STATE OF OHIO, THAT:

Section 1. Pursuant to and in accordance with the provisions of the TIF Statutes including Ohio Revised Code Section 5709.41(B), this Council hereby accepts the conveyance of the Parcels to the City and approves the reconveyance of these Parcels to the Owner.

Section 2. The Mayor is hereby authorized and directed to accept the conveyance of the Parcels and to execute and deliver the quit claim deed reconveying the Parcels to the Owner.
Section 3. The Mayor, City Auditor, Law Director, or any other officials of the City, as appropriate, are authorized and directed to sign any other documents, instruments or certificates and take such actions as are necessary or appropriate to consummate or implement the actions described in or contemplated by this Ordinance.
Section 4. It is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Ordinance were passed in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action, were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.
Section 5. This ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety of the City and its inhabitants for the reason that this ordinance must be immediately effective so that the work can begin on the Development and bonds can be sold as soon as possible to complete such work, wherefore this Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and immediately after its adoption.

ORDINANCE NO. 133 - 2004

TITLE: AN ORDINANCE authorizing the Director of Public Service and Safety to accept a Federal Law Enforcement Block Grant, and declaring an emergency.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MASSILLON, STATE OF OHIO, THAT:

Section 1:

The Council of the City of Massillon, Ohio, hereby determines it to be necessary in the public health, safety and welfare to accept a Federal Law Enforcement Block Grant in the amount of Eleven Thousand Three Hundred and Sixty-Two Dollars (\$11,362.00) for the update of technology in the Police Department.

Section 2:

The Director of Public Service and Safety of the City of Massillon, Ohio, is hereby authorized and directed to accept a Federal Law Enforcement Block Grant in the Massillon Police Department. This grant will require a match of local funds in the amount of One Thousand Two Hundred and Sixty-Two Dollars (\$1,262.00)

Section 3:

This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the health, safety, and welfare of the community, and for the reason that this grant is necessary to continue updating the technology needed to operate the Police Department. Provided it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the elected members to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor. Otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
