The following is an Ordinance enacted by the City of

Massillon, Stark County, Ohio, hereinafter referred to as the Local Public Agency (LPA),
in the matter of the stated described project.

SECTION I - Project Description

WHEREAS, the STATE has identified the need for the described project:

The rehabilitation of the Tremont Avenue Bridge.

NOW THEREFORE, be it ordained by the City of Massillon,
(LPA)
Ohio.

SECTION II - Consent Statement

Being in the public interest, the LPA gives consent to the Director of Transportation to complete the above described project.

SECTION III - Cooperation Statement

The LPA shall cooperate with the Director of Transportation in the above described project as follows:

The rehabilitation of the Tremont Avenue Bridge.

The LPA further agrees to pay One Hundred Percent (100%) of the cost of those features requested by the LPA which are determined by the State and Federal Highway Administration to be unnecessary for the Project.

The LPA further agrees to pay One Hundred Percent (100%) of the cost of the project above the federal share minus the \$325,000 ODOT District 4's District Allocation.

SECTION IV - Utilities and Right-of-Way Statement

The LPA agrees to acquire and/or make available to ODOT, in accordance with current State and Federal regulations, all necessary right-of-way required for the described Project. The LPA also understands that right-of-way costs include eligible utility costs. The LPA agrees to be responsible for all utility accommodation, relocation, and reimbursement and agrees that all such accommodations, relocations, and reimbursements shall comply with the current provisions of 23 CFR 645 and the ODOT Utilities Manual.

SECTION V - Maintenance

Upon completion of the described Project, and unless otherwise agreed, the LPA shall: (1) provide adequate maintenance for the described Project in accordance with all applicable state and federal law, including, but not limited to, 23 USC 116; (2) provide ample financial provisions, as necessary, for the maintenance of the described Project; (3) maintain the right-of-way, keeping it free of obstructions; and (4) hold said right-of-way inviolate for public highway purposes.

SECTION VI - Consultants and Authority to Sign

The Safety Service Director of said City of Massillon is hereby empowered on
(Contractual Agent) (LPA)

behalf of the City of Massillon to enter into contracts with ODOT pre-
(LPA)

qualified consultants for the preliminary engineering phase of the Project and to enter into contracts with the Director of Transportation necessary to complete the above described project.

Upon the request of ODOT, the Safety Service also empowered to assign all rights, title,
(Contractual Agent)

and interests of City of Massillon to ODOT arising from any agreement with its consultant in
(LPA)

order to allow ODOT to direct additional or corrective work, recover damages due to errors or omissions, and to exercise all other contractual rights and remedies afforded by law or equity.

The LPA agrees that if Federal Funds are used to pay the cost of any consultant contract, the LPA shall comply with 23 CFR 172 in the selection of its consultant and the administration of the consultant contract. Further the LPA agrees to incorporate ODOT's "Specifications for Consulting Services" as a contract document in all of its consultant contracts. The LPA agrees to require, as a scope of services clause, that all plans prepared by the consultant must conform to ODOT's current design standards and that the consultant shall be responsible for ongoing consultant involvement during the construction phase of the Project. The LPA agrees to include a completion schedule acceptable to ODOT and to assist ODOT in rating the consultant's performance through ODOT's Consultant Evaluation System.

WHEREAS, the electors of the City of Massillon voted to raise the city income tax rate by three-tenths percent (.3%) effective January 1st, 1996 and to be used exclusively for the parks and recreation system in the City of Massillon.

WHEREAS, it is necessary to determine what percentage of the tax collected for the Parks and Recreation Department shall be deposited into the "Parks and Recreation Operations Fund", "Park and Recreation Debt Retirement Fund" and the "Park and Recreation Capitol Improvement Fund".

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MASSILLON, STATE OF OHIO, THAT:

Section 1:

It is hereby determined that it is necessary for the Auditor of the City of Massillon to deposit a portion of the three-tenths percent (.3%) City Income Tax for the parks and recreation system into the "Parks and Recreation Fund", "Park and Recreation Capital Improvement Fund" and the "Park and Recreation Bond Retirement Fund".

Section 2:

Effective August 1, 2004 through December 31, 2004 the Auditor of the City of Massillon is hereby authorized to deposit the following percentages into the following funds from the amounts collected from the income tax for the Parks and Recreation Department:

- 1.) Sixty-Five percent (65%) shall be deposited into the "Parks and Recreation Operations 1234 Fund".
- 2.) Thirty-Five percent (35%) shall be deposited into the "Park and Recreation Debt Retirement 1306 Fund".
- 3.) Zero percent (0%) shall be deposited into the "Park and Recreation Capitol Improvement 1433 Fund".

Section 3:

Effective January 1, 2005 the Auditor of the City of Massillon is hereby authorized to deposit the following percentages into the following funds from the amounts collected from the income tax for the Parks and Recreation Department:

- 1.) Fifty-Two and a half percent (52.5%) shall be deposited into the "Parks and Recreation Operations 1234 Fund".
- 2.) Forty percent (40%) shall be deposited into the "Park and Recreation Debt Retirement 1306 Fund".
- 3) Seven and a half percent (7.5%) shall be deposited into the "Park and Recreation Capitol Improvement 1433 Fund".

Section 4:

That Ordinance No. 163 - 2003 be and is hereby repealed as of August 31, 2004.

Section 5:

That this Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the health, safety and welfare of the community, and for the further reason that said funds are necessary to provide sufficient funds to adequately maintain the Park and Recreation Department and provide sufficient funds for the operations of the department on a daily basis. Provided it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the elected members to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor. Otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
