ORDINANCE NO. 33 - 2005

BY: FINANCE COMMITTEE

TITLE: AN ORDINANCE making certain appropriations from the unappropriated balance of the Lincoln Center Infrastructure Fund and the Clerk of Court Computer Fund, for the year ending December 31, 2005, and declaring an emergency.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MASSILLON, STATE OF OHIO, THAT:

Section 1:

There be and hereby is appropriated from the unappropriated balance of the Lincoln Center Infrastructure Fund, for the year ending December 31, 2005, the following:

\$450,051.74 to an account entitled "Lincoln Center Infrastructure Project" 1438.425.2510

Section 2:

There be and hereby is appropriated from the unappropriated balance of the Clerk of Court Computer Fund, for the year ending December 31, 2005, the following:

\$1,400.00 to an account entitled "Workers Comp" 1232.130.2270

Section 3:

This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure, for the efficient operation of the various departments of the City of Massillon and for the preservation of the public health, safety and welfare of the community. Provided it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the elected members to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor. Otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
