Section I:

BY: COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE

TITLE: AN ORDINANCE authorizing the Mayor to enter into an agreement with Nation Land Company LLC and Genco I Inc., for a development project. Nation Land Company is planning to construct a new 75,000 square foot warehouse located at 4300 Sterilite Street SE for use by Genco I Inc., The construction of this facility will result in the creation of 18 new jobs within the City of Massillon Enterprise Zone, and declaring an emergency.

WHEREAS, the City of Massillon has encouraged the development of real property and the acquisition of personal property located in the area designated as an Enterprise Zone; and

WHEREAS, Nation Land Company is proposing to construct a new facility at 4300 Sterilite Street SE, within the Massillon Enterprise Zone, through the construction of this new facility at a total investment of \$2,050,000.00 (hereinafter the "Project"), provided that the appropriate development incentives are available to support the economic viability of said .3roject; and

WHEREAS, the Council of the City of Massillon, Ohio, (hereinafter "Council") by Ordinance has designated an area of the City as an "Enterprise Zone" pursuant to Chapter 5709 of the Ohio Revised Code; and

WHEREAS, effective September 12, 1994, and as amended on March 13, 1998, and as amended on March 9, 1999, the Director of Development of the State of Ohio has determined that the aforementioned area designated in said Ordinance No. 163 - 1994 contains the characteristics set forth in 5709.61(A) of the Ohio Revised Code, and has certified said area as an Enterprise Zone under Chapter 5709; and

WHEREAS, the City of Massillon, having the appropriate authority for the stated type of project is desirous of providing Nation Land Company with the incentives available for development of the Project in said Enterprise Zone, under Chapter 5709 of the Ohio Revised Code; and

WHEREAS, Nation Land Company has submitted a proposed agreement application, herein attached as Exhibit "A", to the City of Massillon, Ohio, requesting that the incentives available for development within the Enterprise Zone be approved for the Project; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor of the City of Massillon, Ohio, has investigated the application submitted by Nation Land Company and has recommended approval of the same to the Council on the basis that the company is qualified by financial responsibility and business experience to create employment opportunities in said Enterprise Zone and to improve the economic climate of the City of Massillon; and

WHEREAS, the project site is located in the Perry School District and the Perry Board of Education has been notified in accordance with Section 5709.83 and have been given a copy of the application.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MASSILLON, STATE OF OHIO, THAT:

Section 1:

The Council of the City of Massillon, Ohio does hereby authorize and direct the Mayor to enter into an agreement, attached hereto as Exhibit "A" and incorporated herein by reference, with Nation Land Company providing for the adoption of a project which will improve their facility and preserve employment opportunities within the City of Massillon Enterprise Zone.

Section 2:

This Ordinance is declared to be an emergency measure immediately necessary for the preservation of the health, safety and welfare of the City of Massillon, Ohio and for the further reason that approval of said agreement is necessary so as to maximize the investment that will be made by Nation Land Company within the City of Massillon, Ohio. Provided it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the elected members to Council it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor. Otherwise it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.


Section 2:

Section 13 - ALLOCATION OF FUNDS

- (A) Effective June 1, 2005 the funds collected under the provision of this ordinance shall be disbursed as follows:
 - (1) Eighty Seven (87) percent shall be deposited in the General Fund and Thirteen (13) percent shall be deposited in said "Income Tax Capital Improvements" Fund and shall be used for capital improvements to defray operating expenses of the City including such part thereof as shall be necessary to defray all costs of administering and enforcing the provisions thereof.
 - (2) Capital Improvements are all property, assets, machinery, equipment or improvements which the City is authorized by law to acquire, construct and maintain, including plans and studies thereof with an estimated life or usefulness of five (5) years or more, including land and interests therein, and including reconstructions, enlargements and extension thereof having an estimated life or usefulness of five (5) years or more provided, however, that the purchase of motorized equipment for the various city departments and the resurfacing and resealing of public streets, including "Chip and Seal" method, shall be deemed Capital Improvement without regard to estimated life or usefulness.

Section 3:

This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, welfare and safety and the emergency being the necessity of providing funds for the operation of necessary governmental functions imposed by law, including the proper police and fire protection, but not limited thereto, for, without said funds, said governmental functions would have to be curtailed to such an extent that the public safety and welfare would be greatly jeopardized. And provided it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the elected members to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor. Otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
