TITLE: AN ORDINANCE authorizing and directing the Director of Public Service and Safety of the City of Massillon, Ohio, to enter into a Participatory Consent Agreement with the Ohio Department of Transportation for necessary repairs to State Highways within the corporate limits of the City of Massillon, Ohio, and declaring an emergency.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MASSILLON, STATE OF OHIO, THAT:

Section 1:

The Council of the City of Massillon, Ohio, hereby finds that it is necessary to enter into a Participatory Consent Agreement with the Ohio Department of Transportation for necessary repairs to State Highways within the corporate limits of the City of Massillon, Ohio. Project STA. 241 – 7.94, PID 25450 is for minor rehab/resurfacing SR 241 (Erie Street) from Finefrock Road to Lincoln Way.

Section 2:

The Director of Public Service and Safety of the City of Massillon, Ohio, is hereby authorized and directed to enter into a Participatory Consent Agreement with the Ohio Department of Transportation for necessary repairs to State Highways within the corporate limits of the City of Massillon, Ohio. Project STA. 241 – 7.94, PID 25450 is for minor rehab/resurfacing SR 241 (Erie Street) from Finefrock Road to Lincoln Way.

(SEE EXHIBIT "A" HERETO ATTACHED)

Section 3:

This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the health, safety, and welfare of the community, and for the reason that it is necessary to enter into a Participatory Consent Agreement with Ohio Department of Transportation so as to proceed with the necessary repairs needed to the State Highways within the corporate limits to make the roads safer for vehicular travel. Provided it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the elected members to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor. Otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

CONTRACT (Chapter 5521, Ohio Revised Code)

This contract is made by and between the State of Ohio, Department of Transportation, acting through its director (hereinafter referred to as the "STATE"), 1980 West Broad Street, Columbus, Ohio 43223, and the City of Massillon, (hereinafter referred to as the legislative authority/Local Public Agency or "LPA").

WITNESSTH:

WHEREAS, Chapter 5521 of the Ohio Revised Code provides that the legislative authority may cooperate with the STATE in a highway project made by and under the supervision of the Director of Transportation; and

WHEREAS, through the enactment of preliminary legislation, the LPA and the STATE have agreed to cooperate in the highway project described below; and

WHEREAS, through the enactment of final legislation, the LPA has committed to pay an estimated amount of money as its share of the total estimated cost and expense of the highway project described below; and

WHEREAS, the fiscal officer of the LPA has filed with the LPA a certificate stating that sufficient moneys are available, as required by Chapter 5521 and Section 5705.41 of the Ohio Revised Code. A duplicate certificate is attached hereto; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with the final legislation, the LPA hereby enters into this contract with the STATE to provide for payment of the agreed portion of the cost of the highway project and any additional obligations for the highway project described below.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises and the performances of mutual covenants hereinafter set forth, it is agreed by parties hereto as follows:

SECTION I: RECITALS

The foregoing recitals are hereby incorporated as a material part of this contract.

SECTION II: PURPOSE

The purpose of this contract is to set forth requirements associated with the highway project described below (hereinafter referred to as the "PROJECT") and to establish the responsibilities for the administration of the PROJECT by the LPA and the STATE.

SECTION III: LEGAL REFERENCES

This contract is established pursuant to Chapter 5521 of the Ohio Revised Code.

SECTION IV: SCOPE OF WORK

The work to be performed under this contract shall consist of the following:

Improvement of State Route 241 by planing and resurfacing, including pavement marking and curb repair, lying within the City of Massillon. Total work length of project being approximately 3.35 miles.

SECTION V: FINANCIAL PARTICIPATION

- 1. The STATE agrees to provide the necessary funds as enumerated in this section and allowed by law for the financing of this project.
- 2. The STATE may allocate the money contributed by the LPA in whatever manner it deems necessary in financing the cost of construction, right-of-way, engineering, and incidental expenses, notwithstanding the percentage basis of contribution by the LPA.
- 3. The total cost and expenses for the project are only an estimate and the total cost and expenses may be adjusted by the STATE. If any adjustments are required, payment of additional funds shall correspond with the percentages of actual costs when said actual costs are determined, and as requested, by the Director of Transportation.
- 4. The LPA agrees to pay to the STATE its share of the total estimated cost expense for the above highway project in the amount of One Hundred Sixty Two Thousand Five Hundred Forty Eight and - - 00/100 Dollars, (\$162,548.00)
- 5. The City agrees to assume and bear one hundred percent (100%) of the entire cost of the improvement, less the amount of State funds set aside by the Director of Transportation for the financing of this improvement from funds allocated by the Federal Highway Administration, U.S. Department of Transportation, and further.

Also, the City agrees to assume and bear the entire cost and expense of the installation and/or repair of curb ramps which are necessary to ensure compliance with the Americans with Disabilities Act.

In addition, the City also agrees to assume and bear one hundred percent (100%) of the cost of any construction items requested by the City on the entire improvement, which are not necessary for the improvement, as determined by the State and Federal Highway Administration.

The LPA agrees that change orders and extra work contracts required to fulfill the construction contracts shall be processed as needed. The STATE shall not approve a change order or extra work contract until it first gives notice, in writing, to the LPA. The LPA shall contribute its share of the cost of these items in accordance with other sections herein.

SECTION VI: RIGHT-OF-WAY AND UTILITIES

- 1. The LPA agrees that all right-of-way required for the described project will be acquired and/or made available in accordance with current State and Federal regulations. The LPA also understands that right-of-way costs include eligible utility costs.
- 2. The LPA agrees that all utility accommodation, relocation, and reimbursement will comply with the current provisions of 23 CFR 645 and the ODOT Utilities Manual, including that:
 - A. Arrangements have been or will be made with all utilities where facilities are affected by the described PROJECT, that the utilities have agreed to make all necessary removals and/or relocations to clear any construction called for by the plans of this PROJECT, and that the utilities have agreed to make the necessary removals and/or relocations after notification by the LPA or STATE.
 - B. The LPA shall, at its own expense, make all removals and/or relocations of publicly-owned utilities which do not comply with the reimbursement provisions of the ODOT Utilities Manual. Publicly-owned facilities which do comply with the reimbursement provisions of the ODOT Utilities Manual will be removed and/or relocated at project expense, exclusive of betterments.
 - C. The removals and/or relocation of all utilities shall be done in such a manner as not to interfere with the operation of the contractor constructing the PROJECT and that the utility removals and/or relocations shall be approved by the STATE and performed in accordance with the provisions of the ODOT Construction and Materials Specifications.

SECTION VII: ADDITIONAL PROJECT OBLIGATIONS

- 1. The STATE shall initiate the competitive bid letting process and award the PROJECT in accordance with ODOT's policies and procedures.
- 2. The LPA agrees:
 - A. To keep said highway open to traffic at all times;
 - B. To provide adequate maintenance for the PROJECT in accordance with all applicable state and federal law, including, but not limited to, Title 23, U.S.C., Section 116;

C. To make ample financial and other provisions for such maintenance of the PROJECT after its completion;

D. To maintain the right-of-way and keep it free of obstructions in a manner satisfactory to the STATE and hold said right-of-way inviolate for public highway purposes;

E. To place and maintain all traffic control devices conforming to the Ohio Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices on the project in compliance with the provisions of Section 4511.11 of the Ohio Revised Code;

F. To regulate parking in accordance with Section 4511.66 of the Ohio Revised Code, unless otherwise controlled by local ordinance or resolution.

SECTION VIII: DISPUTES

In the event that any disputes arise between the STATE and LPA concerning interruption of or performance pursuant to this contract, such disputes shall be resolved solely and finally by the Director of Transportation.

- This contract constitutes the entire contract between the parties. All prior discussions and understandings between the parties are superseded by this contract.
- 2. Neither this contract nor any rights, duties or obligations described herein shall be assigned by either party hereto without the prior express written consent of the other party.
- 3. Any change to the provisions of this contract must be made in a written amendment executed by both parties.
- 4. This contract and any claims arising out of this contract shall be governed by the laws of the State of Ohio. TITLE: AN ORDINANCE amending Ordinance No. 143 - 1976 by repealing Section 13 - "ALLOCATION OF FUNDS - INCOME TAX" and enacting a new Section 13 "ALLOCATION OF FUNDS - INCOME TAX" and repealing Ordinance No. 164 - 2006, and declaring an emergency.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MASSILLON, STATE OF OHIO, THAT:

Section I:

Ordinance No. 164 - 2006 be and is hereby repealed.

Section 2:

That there be and hereby is enacted a new Section 13 "ALLOCATION OF FUNDS - INCOME TAX" of Ordinance No. 143 - 1976. Said new Section 13 shall read as follows:

Section 13 - ALLOCATION OF FUNDS

- (A) Effective January 1, 2007 the funds collected under the provision of this ordinance shall be disbursed as follows:
 - (1) Ninety-Five (95) percent shall be deposited in the General Fund and Five (5) percent shall be deposited in said "Income Tax Capital Improvements" Fund and shall be used for capital improvements to defray operating expenses of the City including such part thereof as shall be necessary to defray all costs of administering and enforcing the provisions thereof.
 - (2) Capital Improvements are all property, assets, machinery, equipment or improvements which the City is authorized by law to acquire, construct and maintain, including plans and studies thereof with an estimated life or usefulness of five (5) years or more, including land and interests therein, and including reconstructions, enlargements and extension thereof having an estimated life or usefulness of five (5) years or more provided, however, that the purchase of motorized equipment for the various city departments and the resurfacing and resealing of public streets, including "Chip and Seal" method, shall be deemed Capital Improvement without regard to estimated life or usefulness.

Section 3:

This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, welfare and safety and the emergency being the necessity of providing funds for the operation of necessary governmental functions imposed by law, including the proper police and fire protection, but not limited thereto, for, without said funds, said governmental functions would have to be curtailed to such an extent that the public safety and welfare would be greatly jeopardized. And provided it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the elected members to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor. Otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

Section 2:

The City Council hereby declares that amounts may be transferred between accounts in the same Department subject to the approval of the Department Head, the Finance Committee and the Auditor.

Section 3:

That the City Auditor is hereby authorized to draw his/her warrants on the City Treasurer for payments from any of the foregoing appropriations upon receiving proper certificates and vouchers therefore, approved by the Board of Officers (or Officer) authorized by law to be approved the same, or an Ordinance a Resolution of council to make the expenditures; provided that no warrant shall be drawn or paid for salaries or wages except to persons employed by authority of and in accordance with law or Ordinance. Provided further that the appropriation for contingencies can only be expended upon approval of a two-thirds vote of Council for items of expense constituting a legal obligation against the City and for purposes other than those covered by other specific appropriations herein made.

Section 4:

That there be and hereby is transferred from various appropriated accounts above certain funds as follows:

\$ 656,400.00	from General Fund to Fire Pension Fund
\$ 546,000.00	from General Fund to Police Pension Fund
\$ 380,000.00	from General Fund to Lincoln Center Phase II Bond Retirement Fund
\$ 5,000.00	from General Fund to State Hospital Endowment Fund
\$ - 0 -	from General Fund to Bond Retirement - Shaw Avenue Fund

Section 5:

The Department Directors, monthly, shall complete the attached financial report. The report should be completed and turned into the Council Clerk by the 15th of each month. The Council Clerk will distribute the reports to all council members.

Section 6:

Budget Commission that the City Council hereby creates will consist of the Mayor, and his designee, Auditor, Finance Committee and any other council member that desires to be on the commission. Quarterly meetings will be held to review revenue, expenses, purchase orders that are outstanding or utilized as well as any departmental issues and/or needs will be assessed and discussed.

Section 7:

The yearly budget proposed by the Mayor will be assessable to City Council no later than October 15, of each calendar year.

Section 8:

All Capital Improvement proposed projects or expenditures will be evaluated by the City Council in June.

Section 9:

That this Ordinance being one providing for appropriation for the current expenses of the City of Massillon, Ohio, shall be in force and take effect from and after passage and upon approval of the Mayor.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MASSILLON, STATE OF OHIO, THAT:

Section I:

The Council of the City of Massillon, Ohio, hereby finds it necessary to authorize the City Auditor to pay various 2006 bills that have been received and that will be received by his office between January 1, 2007 and March 1, 2007, out of the 2007 appropriations within the various departments of the City of Massillon, Ohio,

Section 2:

The City Auditor is hereby authorized and directed to pay various 2006 bills that have been received and that will be received by his office between January 1, 2007 and March 1, 2007, out of the 2007 appropriations within the various departments of the City of Massillon, Ohio.

Section 3:

This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure, the reason for the emergency being that said funds are immediately necessary to pay various 2006 bills that will be submitted to the City Auditors office between January 1, 2009 and March 1, 2007, and for the preservation of the public health, safety and welfare of the community. Provided it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the elected members to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor. Otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force form and after the earliest period allowed by law.

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
