#### WITNESSETH:

Whereas, the City carries out a variety of economic development programs designed to promote the creation and expansion of business and industry in the community; and

Whereas, the Company, which specializes in pipeline construction services for the oil and natural gas industry, desires to relocate and expand its business operations to property located in the City of Massillon at 2200 Venture Place SE (hereinafter the "Project Site"). The Company will use the Project Site to construct a new 16,200 square foot industrial building for fabrication, shop, warehousing, and office space (hereinafter the "Project") and

Whereas, the Company, proposes to invest \$2,028,900 on this Project, including property acquisition, construction of new buildings, machinery & equipment, furniture & fixtures, and inventory; and

Whereas, the Company, as a result of this project, plans to relocate approximately 72 existing jobs and create 13 new jobs in Massillon within a three year period; and

Whereas, the City of Massillon proposes to assist the Company in this relocation by providing an economic development "inducement grant", the purpose of which is to help offset the Company's costs in relocating its operations to Massillon.

Now, therefore, in consideration of the mutual covenants herein contained and the benefit to be derived by the parties from the execution hereof, the parties herein agree as follows:

### Section I: Project Description

The Company shall relocate and expand its business operations to Massillon, through the construction of a new 16,200 square foot facility at 2200 Venture Place SE in Nova East Industrial Park, at a total cost of \$2,028,900. As a result of this project, the Company shall relocate 72 existing jobs and create 13 new jobs at the Project Site within a three year period.

#### Section 2: Economic Development Grant

In order to assist the Company in this relocation and expansion, the City shall make an economic development inducement grant to the Company in a total amount not to exceed Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00). The Company shall use these funds to help offset its costs related to the relocation and expansion of its operations at the Project Site.

This inducement grant shall be provided in the form of a deferred payment loan, at 0% interest, for a ten year term. At the end of the ten year period, the balance on said deferred payment loan shall be \$0.00, and no payment shall be required, provided that Company is still in operation at the Project Site.

The entire amount of the inducement grant shall become immediately due and payable either upon the bankruptcy, reorganization, syndication, dissolution or liquidation of Company. In addition, if during the term of the deferred payment loan, the Company relocates its business operations outside the corporate limits of the City of Massillon, Ohio, the entire amount of the inducement grant shall become immediately due and payable.

#### Section 3: Assurance of Project Jobs

In return for this economic development grant assistance, the Company shall furnish the City with information regarding its total project investment and the number of jobs that it has provided at the Project Site as a result of the project.

#### Section 4: Disbursement of Funds

The City shall provide this inducement grant to the Company, or its designee, upon the relocation and the establishment of its business operations at the Project Site. Economic development grant funds shall be disbursed by the City on the basis of vouchers submitted by the Company, including any supporting documentation as needed to verify project costs.

Whereas, the City carries out a variety of economic development programs designed to promote the creation and expansion of business and industry in the community; and

Whereas, the Company, which operates a grocery store at 1619 Walnut Road SE (hereinafter the "Project Site"), desires to expand its business operations through the construction of a gasoline fuel pump island with canopy (hereinafter the "Project"), and

Whereas, the Project will provide needed services to the residents of the southeast side of Massillon; and

Whereas, the City proposes to assist the Company in this Project by providing an economic development "inducement grant", the purpose of which is to help offset the Company's costs in constructing needed storm drainage site improvements at the Project Site.

Now, therefore, in consideration of the mutual covenants herein contained and the benefit to be derived by the parties from the execution hereof, the parties herein agree as follows:

#### Section I: Project Description

The Company shall expand its business operations through the construction of a gasoline fuel pump island with canopy at its store location at 1619 Walnut Road SE, in the City of Massillon, Stark County, Ohio. As part of this project, the Company will undertake certain storm drainage improvements as indicated on the approved site plan. These drainage improvements include: installation of a 6" PVC pipe from the fuel pump canopy to the catch basin on 16<sup>th</sup> Street SE; and construction of a concrete drive entrance and grade out of a ditch along Walnut Road SE.

#### WITNESSETH:

Whereas, the City carries out a variety of economic development programs designed to promote the creation and expansion of business and industry in the community; and

Whereas, the Company desires to expand its business operations to property located in the City of Massillon at 410 Oberlin Road SW (hereinafter the "Project Site"). The Company will use the Project Site to expand its existing direct sales and marketing business for health related pharmaceutical prodructs, commemorative collectibles and other consumer products (hereinafter the "Project").and

Whereas, the Company, proposes to invest \$5,607,000 on this Project, including property acquisition, improvements to existing buildings, site improvements, machinery & equipment, and furniture & fixtures; and

Whereas, the Company, as a result of this project, plans to create 500 new full-time jobs at the Project Site within three years of the Project's initial operations; and

Whereas, the City of Massillon proposes to assist the Company in this business expansion by providing economic development grant assistance, the purpose of which is to help the Company manage the costs of expansion, allowing it to remain its competitiveness as well as to attract and grow its workforce.

Now, therefore, in consideration of the mutual covenants herein contained and the benefit to be derived by the parties from the execution hereof, the parties herein agree as follows:

#### Section I: Project Description

The Company shall expand its business operations to an existing facility located at 410 Oberlin Road SW, in the City of Massillon, Stark County, Ohio, at a total project investment of \$5,607,000, including \$200,000 in land costs, \$2,907,000 in building costs, \$2,000,000 in machinery and equipment costs, and \$500,000 in on-site infrastructure and/or site preparation. The Company shall create a minimum of 500 jobs at the Project Site within three years of the project's initial operations. The average wage of the new jobs will be \$14.92 per hour, plus \$4.48 per hour in benefits. The Company shall commit to hiring at least 10 percent disadvantaged and/or minority persons, as defined by the Ohio Administrative Code.

### Section 2: City Economic Development Grant Assistance

This Project is being assisted by the State of Ohio through a 60 percent, eight-year job creation tax credit awarded by the Ohio Tax Credit Authority. In order to provide the required local financial support necessary for the Company to secure these tax credits and to further assist

the Company in this expansion project, the City shall provide economic development grant assistance to the Company in a total amount not to exceed One Hundred Sixty Thousand Four Hundred Seventy Two Dollars (\$160,472.00). This grant assistance shall be provided as set forth in this Agreement.

# Section 3: Economic Development Inducement Grant

The City hereby grants the Company an economic development inducement grant in the amount of Sixty Thousand Four Hundred Seventy-Two Dollars (\$60,472). This economic development inducement grant shall be disbursed by the City to the Company upon the Company's start-up of business operations at the Project Site. The Company shall provide a minimum of 75 full-time jobs at the Project Site before these grant funds shall be disbursed by the City. The Company shall provide documentation satisfactory to the City that business operations have commenced at the Project Site and that the required jobs are in place, prior to disbursement of the economic development inducement grant.

### Section 4: Economic Development Job Creation Grant

The City hereby grants the Company an economic development job creation grant in an amount not to exceed One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000). This job creation grant shall be paid to the Company over an eight-year period according to the following formula:

The City shall make an annual payment to the Company in an amount equal to six percent (6%) of the city income tax withholding payments made by the Company on behalf of those persons employed by the Company at the Project Site for the calendar year for which an annual grant payment is due and payable by the City. The City shall make an annual economic development job creation grant payment to the Company once a year for a period not to exceed eight years, beginning with the first year business operations commence at the Project Site, or until a total amount of \$100,000 has been disbursed by the City, whichever occurs first. The maximum amount of economic development job creation grant payments made by the City to the Company, pursuant to this section, shall not exceed \$100,000, and the City shall make no more than eight (8) annual grant payments. Such payments will be made only so long as the Agreement is in effect and the Company is in compliance with the terms and conditions in accordance therewith. All such grant payments shall cease if the agreement is terminated or cancelled.

The amount of this annual economic development job creation grant payment shall be calculated each year in arrears and will be based on 6% of the total amount of city income tax withholding payments paid by the Company on behalf of those persons employed by the Company at the Project Site for the preceding calendar year. The City shall make such annual payment amount on or before June 30 of each calendar year following the calendar year for which the Company made income tax withholding payments to the City.

#### Section 5: Assurance of Project Jobs

In return for this economic development grant assistance, the Company shall furnish the City with information regarding its total project investment and the number of jobs that it has provided at the Project Site.

In the event the Company fails to achieve and maintain the full-time employment levels proposed for the Project, as set forth in Section 1 of this Agreement, the Company may not earn the entire amount of the economic development job creation grant as set forth in Section 4 of this Agreement.

# Section 6: Company to Maintain Operations at Project Site

The Company shall maintain its operations at the Project Site for a minimum of 16 years. On or before March 1 of each year, the Company shall provide the City with a written certification that is has maintained its operations at the Project Site. The certification shall be signed by the Company's chief executive officer, chief financial officer, or any other authorized officer of the Company. If the Company fails to maintain its operations at the Project Site as described in this section, the Company hereby agrees to refund to the City the entire amount of the grant assistance provided by the City pursuant to this agreement.

### Section 7: Relocation of Project Jobs

The Company shall not relocate employment positions from the Project Site to another location outside the City without the prior approval of the legislative authority of the City. For purposes of this Agreement, the transfer of an individual employee from one political subdivision to another political subdivision shall not be considered a relocation of an employment position as long as the individual's employment position in the first political subdivision is refilled.

If the Company relocates employment positions in violation of this Section, the Company shall not claim any economic development grant from the City under Sections 3 and 4 of this Agreement, for any calendar years in which the relocation occurs and any subsequent calendar years.

# Section 8: Compliance with Ohio Tax Credit Agreement

The Company agrees that it will remain in full compliance with its Tax Credit Agreement executed with the State of Ohio. The Company agrees that it take all action necessary to cure any and all defaults under its Tax Credit Agreement with the State of Ohio, Termination by the State of Ohio of its Tax Credit Agreement with the Company will be cause for termination of this Agreement by the City.

#### Section 9: Termination

The entire amount of the economic development grant assistance provided by the City to the Company under the terms of this Agreement shall become immediately due and payable upon the bankruptcy, reorganization, syndication, dissolution or liquidation of the Company. In addition, if during the 16 year period specified in Section 6 of this agreement, the Company relocates its business operations outside the corporate limits of the City of Massillon, Ohio, the entire amount of the inducement grant shall become immediately due and payable.

If, as determined by the legislative authority of the City, the Company has failed to perform satisfactorily any requirements of this Agreement, or if the Company is in violation of any provision of this Agreement, or if the Company is in violation of any provision of any other agreement entered into by and between the State of Ohio, Tax Credit Authority or the Ohio Department of Development and the Company, or upon just cause, the City may terminate the Agreement after providing the Company with written notice, in accordance with the notice provisions of this Agreement, (the "Notice"), of its failure to perform satisfactorily any requirement of this Agreement. The Notice shall provide the Company with a thirty-(30) day period to cure any and all defaults under this Agreement.

#### Section 10: Effect of Termination

Within sixty (60) days after termination of this Agreement, the Company shall repay to the City any and all grant funds paid by the City to the Company pursuant to this Agreement,

#### Section 11: Forbearance Not a Waiver

No act of forbearance or failure to insist on the prompt performance by the Company of its obligations under this Agreement, either express or implied, shall be construed as a waiver by the City of any of its rights hereunder.

#### Section 12: Indemnification

The Company agrees to hold the City harmless from any and all liabilities or claims caused by or resulting from Company's performance of the obligations or activities in furtherance of the Project. The Company will reimburse the City for any judgments arising from Company's performance hereunder which may be obtained against the City, including, but not limited to, judgments for infringements of patents or copyrights. The Company agrees to reimburse the City for all costs incurred by the City in defending against any such claims or legal actions if called upon by the City to do so.

#### Section 13: Adherence to State and Federal Laws, Regulations

The Company agrees to comply with all applicable federal, state, and local laws related to the Project. The Company accepts full responsibility for payments of all real and personal property taxes, unemployment compensation, insurance premiums, worker's compensation premiums, all income tax deductions, social security deductions, and any and all other taxes or payroll deductions required for all employees engaged by the Company on the performance of the work authorized by this Agreement. During the term of the Agreement, the Company further agrees to make good faith efforts to resolve any and all findings and orders issued by the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency ("EPA") and to pay any and all fines, assessments, or other charges owed to the Ohio EPA.

#### Section 14: Equal Employment Opportunity

The Company will not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, religion, color, sex, national origin, ancestry, veteran status, disability or age. The Company shall ensure that applicants for employment are considered for employment and that employees are treated during employment, without regard to their race, religion, color, sex, national origin, ancestry, veteran status, disability or age. The Company will incorporate the requirements of this paragraph in all of its respective contracts for any of the work prescribed herein (other than subcontracts for standard commercial supplies or raw materials), and the Company will require all of its subcontractors for any part of such work to incorporate such requirements in all subcontracts for such work.

#### Section 15: Outstanding Liabilities

The Company affirmatively covenants that it does not owe: (1) any delinquent taxes to the State of Ohio (the "State") or a political subdivision of the State; (2) any moneys to the State or a state agency for the administration or enforcement of any environmental laws of the State; and (3) any other moneys to the State, a state agency or a political subdivision of the State that are past due, whether the amounts owed are being contested in a court of law or not.

#### Section 16: Falsification of Information

The Company affirmatively covenants that it, any parent company of the Company, and any other related entity or member have made no false statements to the City in the process of obtaining this grant of funds. If the Company, any parent company of the Company, or other related entity or member has knowingly made a false statement to the City to obtain this grant of funds, the Company shall be required to return all funds immediately to the City.

#### Section 17: Notices

All notices, consents, demands, requests and other communications which may or are required to be given hereunder shall be in writing and shall be deemed duly given if personally delivered or facsimile with confirmation and regular United States mail, or sent by United States mail, registered or certified, return receipt requested, postage prepaid, to the addresses set forth hereunder or to such other address as the other party hereto may designate in written notice transmitted in accordance with this provision.

#### Section 18 Amendments

This agreement may be amended or modified by the parties, only by means of a written agreement, signed by all parties to this Agreement.

### Section 19: Assignment

Neither this Agreement nor any rights, duties, or obligations described herein shall be assigned or subcontracted by the Company without the prior express written consent of the City. Such consent shall not be unreasonably withheld.

Where the City has consented to an assignment as described above, each and all of the terms and conditions of this Agreement shall extend to and bind and inure to the benefit of not only the Company, but to its successors and assigns.

#### Section 20: Miscellaneous

This Agreement shall be governed by and constructed in accordance with the laws of the State of Ohio.

This Agreement and its exhibits and any documents referred to herein constitute the complete understanding of the parties and merge and supersede any and all other discussions, agreements and understandings, either oral or written, between the parties with respect to the subject matter hereof.

Whenever possible, each provision of this Agreement shall be interpreted in such manner as to be effective and valid under applicable law, but if any provision of this Agreement is held to be prohibited by or invalid under applicable law, such provision shall be ineffective only to the extent of such prohibition or invalidity, without invalidating the remainder of such provisions of this Agreement.

The City and the Company acknowledge that this agreement must be approved by formal action of the legislative authority of the City as a condition for the agreement to take effect. This agreement takes effect upon such approval.

Existing Sections 1121.02 (23) and (67) of CHAPTER 1121 "CONSTRUCTION OF LANGUAGE; DEFINITIONS" of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Massillon shall be repealed and new Sections 1121.02 (23) (23.1) and (67) of CHAPTER 1121 CONSTRUCTION OF LANGUAGE; DEFINITIONS", enacted to read as follows:

#### 1121.02 DEFINITIONS

- (23) "Essential Services" means the erection, construction, alteration or maintenance by public utilities or Municipal departments of underground, surface, or overhead gas, electrical, steam, fuel or water transmission or distribution system, collection, communication, supply or disposal systems, including towers, poles, wires, mains, drains, sewers, pipes, conduits, cables, fire alarm and police call boxes, traffic signals, hydrants and similar equipment in connection herewith, but not including buildings which are necessary for the furnishing of adequate service by such utilities or Municipal departments for the general health, safety, or welfare, and further excluding from the definition of the "Essential Services" under the Codified Ordinances of the City of Massillon, Ohio cellular or wireless communications systems, towers, facilities, structures, support structures, and all other facilities attendant thereto.
- (23.1) "Cellular Communications Antenna, Tower, Communication Systems, or Wireless Communication Systems" shall mean any structure or devise used to receive or transmit electrode magnetic waves between cellular phones, pagers, and ground wired communication systems, including both directional antennas, such as panels, microwave dishes, and satellite dishes, and omni, directional antennas such as whips or other equipment utilized to serve personal communication services.
- (67) "Public utility" means a person, firm or corporation, municipal department, board or commission duly authorized to furnish and furnishing under Federal, State or Municipal regulations to the public gas, steam, electricity, sewage disposal, wired communication, wired telegraph, transportation or water.

Existing Section 1187.01(a) of CHAPTER 1187 "SUPPLEMENTAL ZONING REGULATIONS" of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Massillon shall be repealed and new Sections 1187.01(a) and (b) of CHAPTER 1187 "SUPPLEMENTAL ZONING REGULATIONS", enacted as follows:

1187.01 CELLULAR OR WIRELESS COMMUNICATIONS SYSTEMS AND TOWERS, COMMERCIAL TELEVISION AND RADIO TOWERS, PUBLIC UTILITY MICROWAVES AND PUBLIC UTILITY T.V. TRANSMITTING TOWERS.

- (a) Radio and television towers, public utility microwaves and public utility T.V. transmitting towers and their attendant facilities shall be permitted in I-1 and I-2 Districts and on public or quasi-public property in non-industrial districts provided such use shall be located centrally on a continuous parcel of not less than one and one-half times the height of the tower measured from the base of the tower to all points on the property line.
- (b) Cellular or Wireless Communications Towers, Antenna, communications Systems or Wireless Communications systems and their attendant facilities shall be permitted in I-1 and I-2 Districts and on public or quasi-public property in non-industrial districts provided such use shall be located centrally or, a continuous parcel of not less than, one and one-half times the height of the tower measured from the base of the tower to all points on the property line.

III.

Existing Section 1189.04 of CHAPTER 1189 "GENERAL EXCEPTIONS" of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Massillon shall be repealed and a new Section 1189.04 of CHAPTER 1189 "GENERAL EXCEPTIONS", enacted to read as follows:

#### 1189.04 HEIGHT LIMIT

The height limitations of the Zoning Ordinance shall not apply to farm buildings, chimneys, church spires, flag poles <u>or</u> public monuments <del>or</del> <del>wireless transmission towers</del>; provided, however, that the Board of Zoning Appeals may specify a height limit for any such structure when such structure requires authorization as a condition use.

TITLE: AN ORDINANCE amending Ordinance No. 8 – 2007 by revising Section 4 of the 2007 budget, and declaring an emergency.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MASSILLON, STATE OF OHIO, THAT:

#### Section I:

Ordinance No. 8 - 2007 a copy of which is attached hereto as Exhibit "A" be and is hereby amended.

#### Section 2:

The following provision is hereby inserted into Ordinance No. 8 - 2007:

\$441,000.00 from General Fund to Fire Pension Fund \$348,000.00 from General Fund to Police Pension Fund \$314,520.00 from General Fund to Lincoln Center Debt Fund \$ 23,911.73 from General Fund to OPWC Debt Fund

#### Section 3:

This ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure, the reason for the emergency being that said amendment is necessary to the budget as a requirement by the State Auditor for these transferred to be completed. Provided it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the elected members to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor. Otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

# AN ORDINANCE TO APPROVE CURRENT REPLACEMENT PAGES TO THE MASSILLON CODIFIED ORDINANCES AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the Ohio Constitution requires that Ohio municipal ordinances comply with State law if they are an exercise of the Municipality's police powers;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the Council of the City of Massillon, Ohio:

SECTION 1: That the ordinances of the City of Massillon, Ohio, of a general and permanent nature, as revised, recodified, rearranged and consolidated into component codes, titles, chapters and sections within the 2008 Replacement Pages to the Codified Ordinances, are hereby approved and adopted.
