NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MASSILLON, STATE OF OHIO, THAT:

Section 1:

The Council of the City of Massillon, Ohio, hereby determines it to be necessary in the public health, safety and welfare to advertise for and receive sealed bids and, subject to the approval of the Council of the City of Massillon, and enter into contract with the highest bidder, for the sale of approximately 50 acres located at the Legends Golf Course, in the City of Massillon, Stark County, Ohio and owned by said City, which are not needed for any municipal purpose.

Section 2:

The following described real estate belonging to the City of Massillon, Ohio, is not needed for any municipal purpose, to-wit:

Known as being part of Out Lot 1031, part of Out Lot 559, part of Out Lot 560, part of Out Lot 561 and Out Lot 704, in the City of Massillon, Ohio, County of Stark and State of Ohio.

Section 3:

The Director of Public Safety and Service be and is hereby authorized to advertise for and receive sealed bids and, subject to the approval of the Council of the City of Massillon, and enter into contract with the highest bidder, for the sale of approximately 50 acres located at the Legends Golf Course, in the City of Massillon, Stark County, Ohio and owned by said City, which are not needed for any municipal purpose.



Section 4:

- 3). The City and/or Council reserves the right to reject any and all bids.

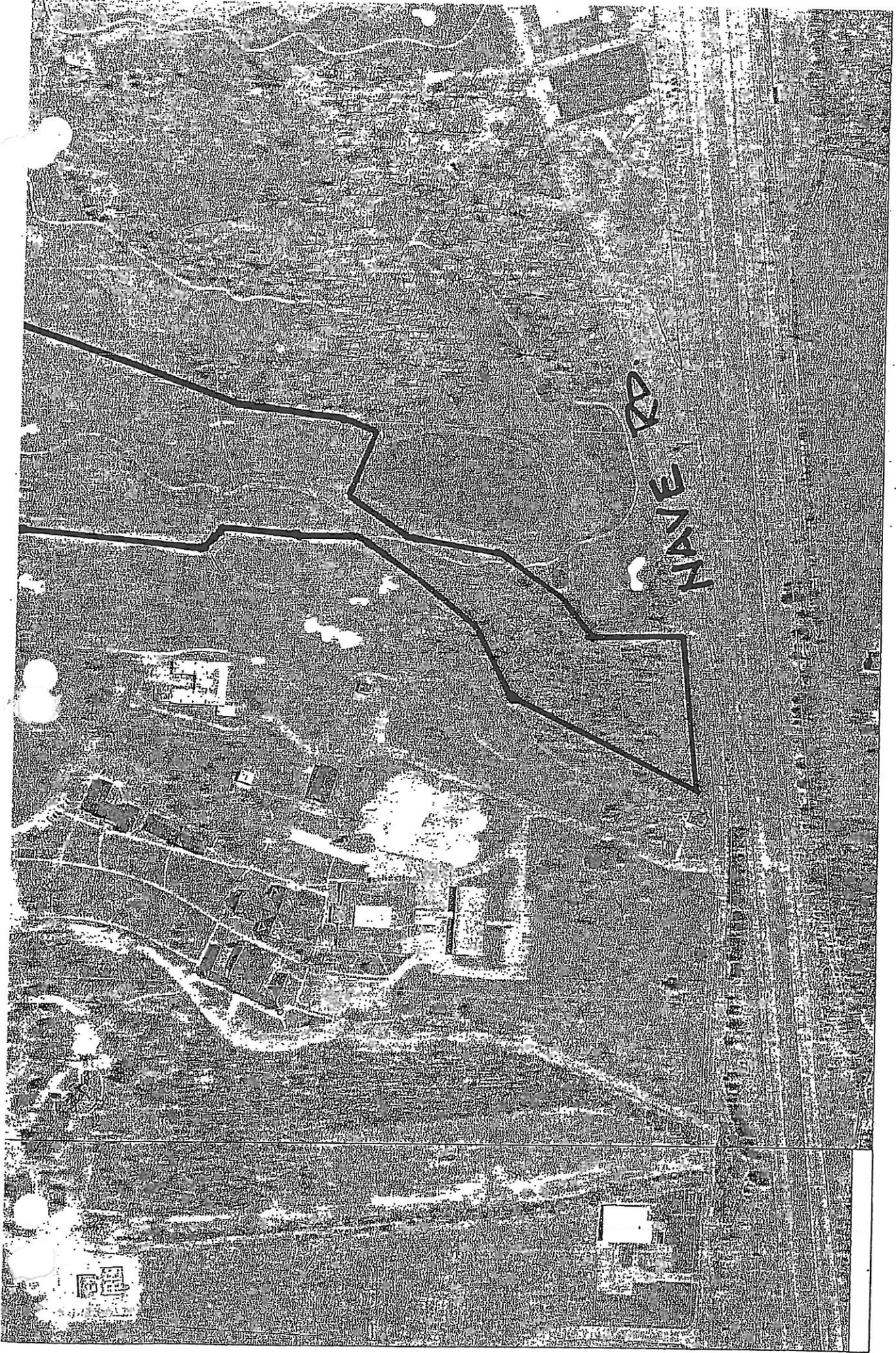
Section 5:

And provided it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the elected members to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor. Otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

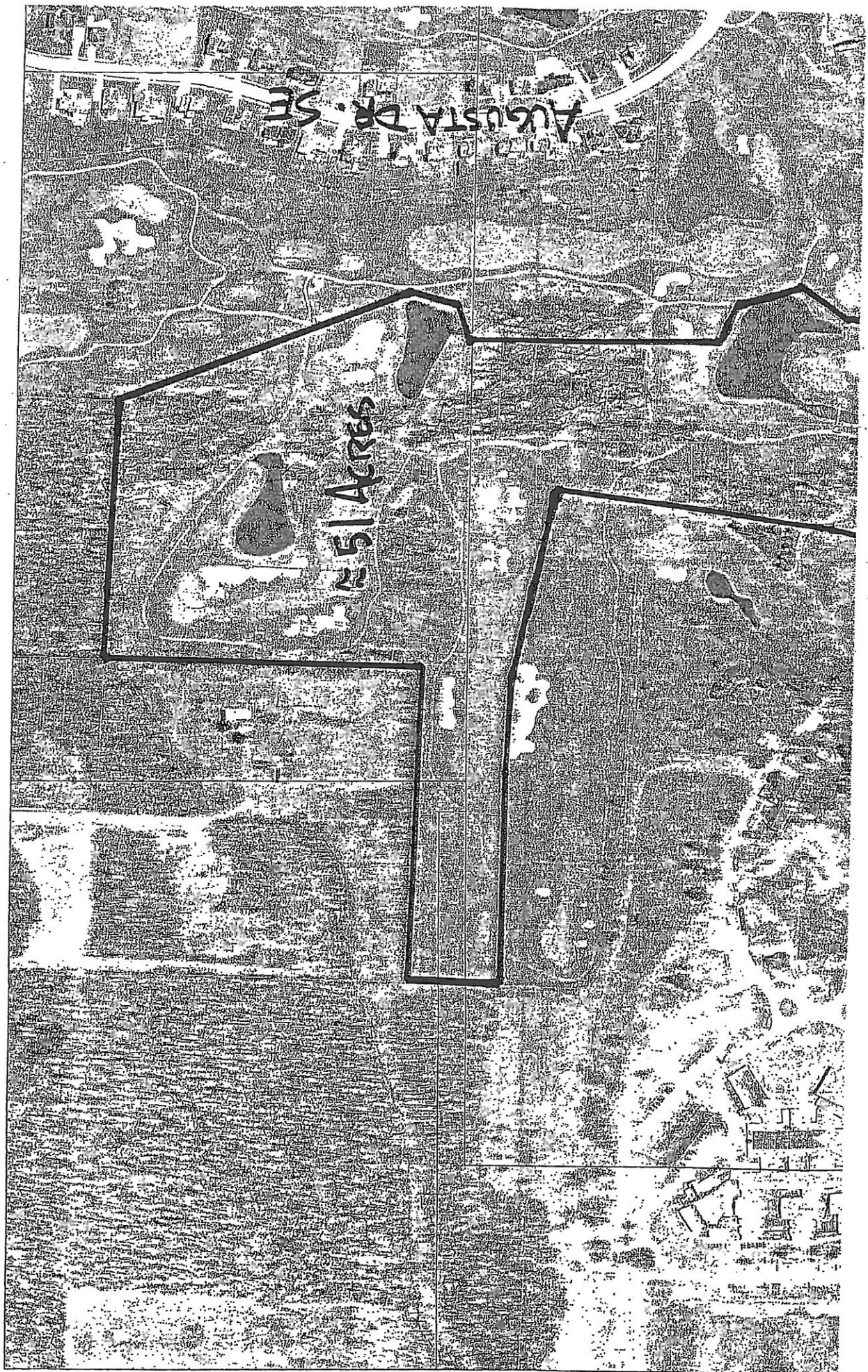

ORDINANCE NO. 65 - 2008

BY: COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE

TITLE: AN ORDINANCE repealing Ordinance No. 37 – 2008 and enacting a new ordinance indicating what services the City of Massillon, Ohio, will provide to the Poets Glen Area Annexation, upon annexation, and declaring an emergency.

WHEREAS, certain property owners have filed a petition requesting the Poets Glen Area be annexed to the City of Massillon, Ohio, pursuant to the Ohio Revised Code Section 709.02, and

WHEREAS, Ohio Revised Code Section 709.03(D) requires that upon receiving notice, the Municipal Legislative Authority, shall by Ordinance or Resolution, adopt a statement indicating what services, if any, the municipal corporation will provide to the territory proposed for annexation upon annexation, and

WHEREAS, this Ordinance is intended to comply with the requirements of the Ohio Revised Code section 709.03(D), and

WHEREAS, it is required by Section 709.033 (A) (6) of the Ohio Revised Code, that no street or highway will be segmented by municipal/township boundary line as to create a maintenance problem; and if a street or highway is divided, the municipality agrees to assume all maintenance of such street or highway as part of the annexation.

WHEREAS, the legislative authority of the City of Massillon, Ohio, is supportive of the annexation proposal, and

WHEREAS, the Stark County Commissioners held a public hearing at the Massillon City Council Chambers, One James Duncan Plaza, Massillon, Ohio, on Wednesday, April 9, 2008 at 7:00p.m, and it was alleged that Massillon City Ordinance No. 37 – 2008 failed to include the names of all the streets in the annexation.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MASSILLON, STATE OF OHIO, THAT

Section 1:

The Council of the City of Massillon, Ohio, hereby finds it necessary to repeal Ordinance No. 37 - 2008 and enact a new revised ordinance concerning the services to be provided upon annexation.

Section 2:

The City will extend approximately 825 feet of 8 inch sanitary sewer at a cost of approximately \$65,000.00 and approximately 2240 feet of water main at a cost of approximately \$150,000.00 which will be paid through funds provided to the City from Aqua Ohio to the proposed area. Also the City will maintain the following roadways for the proposed area to be annexed: **Full width sections of Bison Avenue NW (27<sup>th</sup> Street NW), Beaumont Avenue NW and Wooster Road NW along the frontage of the subject area to be annexed as shown on the proposed annexation map.**

Section 3:

Sanitary sewer is not available to the proposed area and the City of Massillon, Ohio, will extend to the proposed area, upon annexation, the availability of all municipal services extended to all of the current citizens, residents and property owners of the City of Massillon, Ohio, including, but not limited, to the services of the Municipal Police Department, services of the Engineering Department, services of the Building Department, services of the Street Department, services of the Safety Department, services of the Planning Department, services of the Health Department, services of the Sewer Department, and the services of the City of Massillon Administration within approximately one year of the annexation. The City of Massillon will also maintain the full width of the pavement **along the sections of Bison Avenue, Beaumont Avenue and Wooster Road NW** along the frontage of the subject area to be annexed.

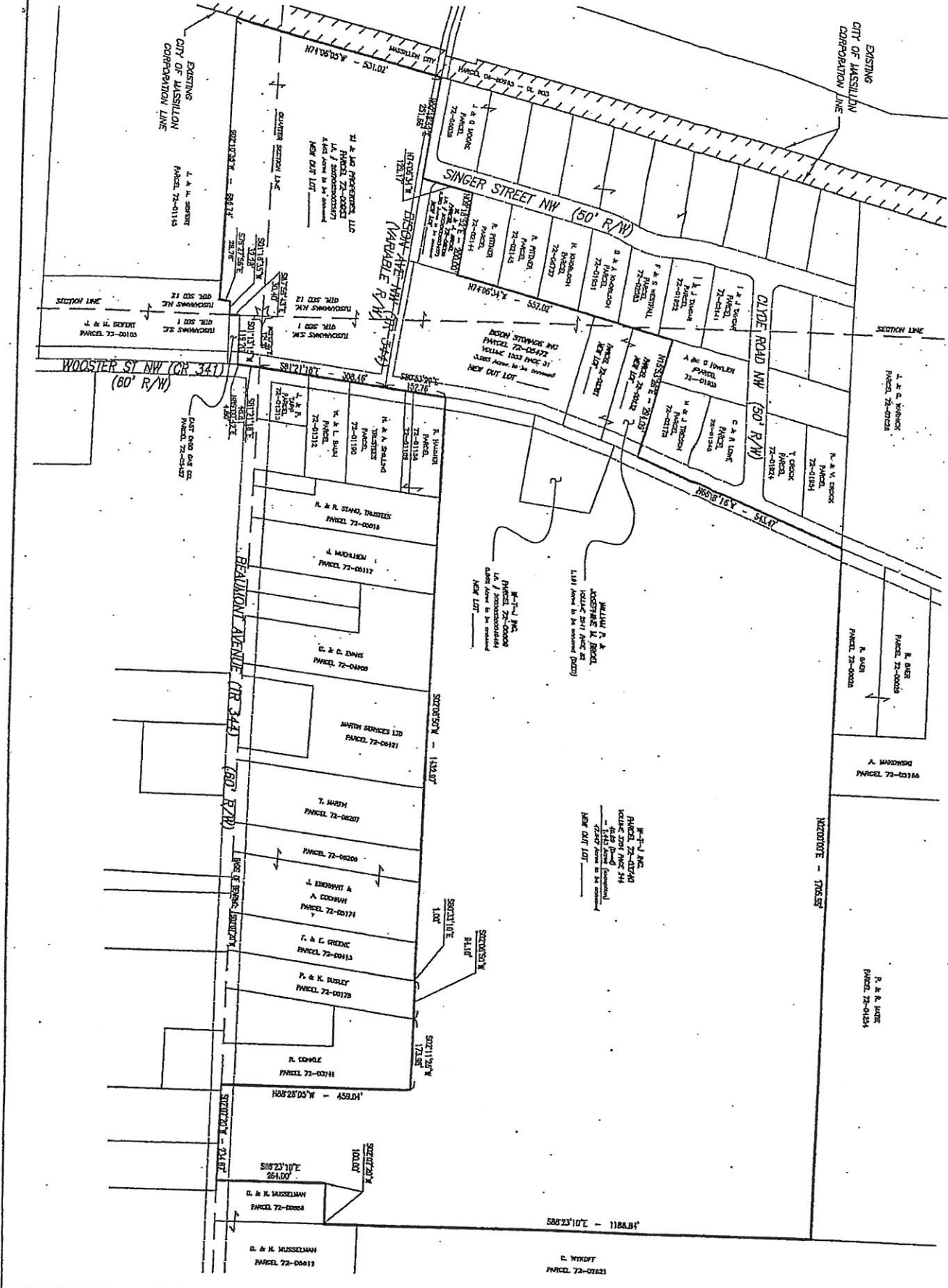
Section 4:

This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure for the preservation of the health, safety and welfare of the community and for the additional reason that it is necessary to indicate what services the City of Massillon will provide to the area upon annexation and correct an inadvertent omission in Ordinance No. 37 - 2008. Provided it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the elected members to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the mayor. Otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

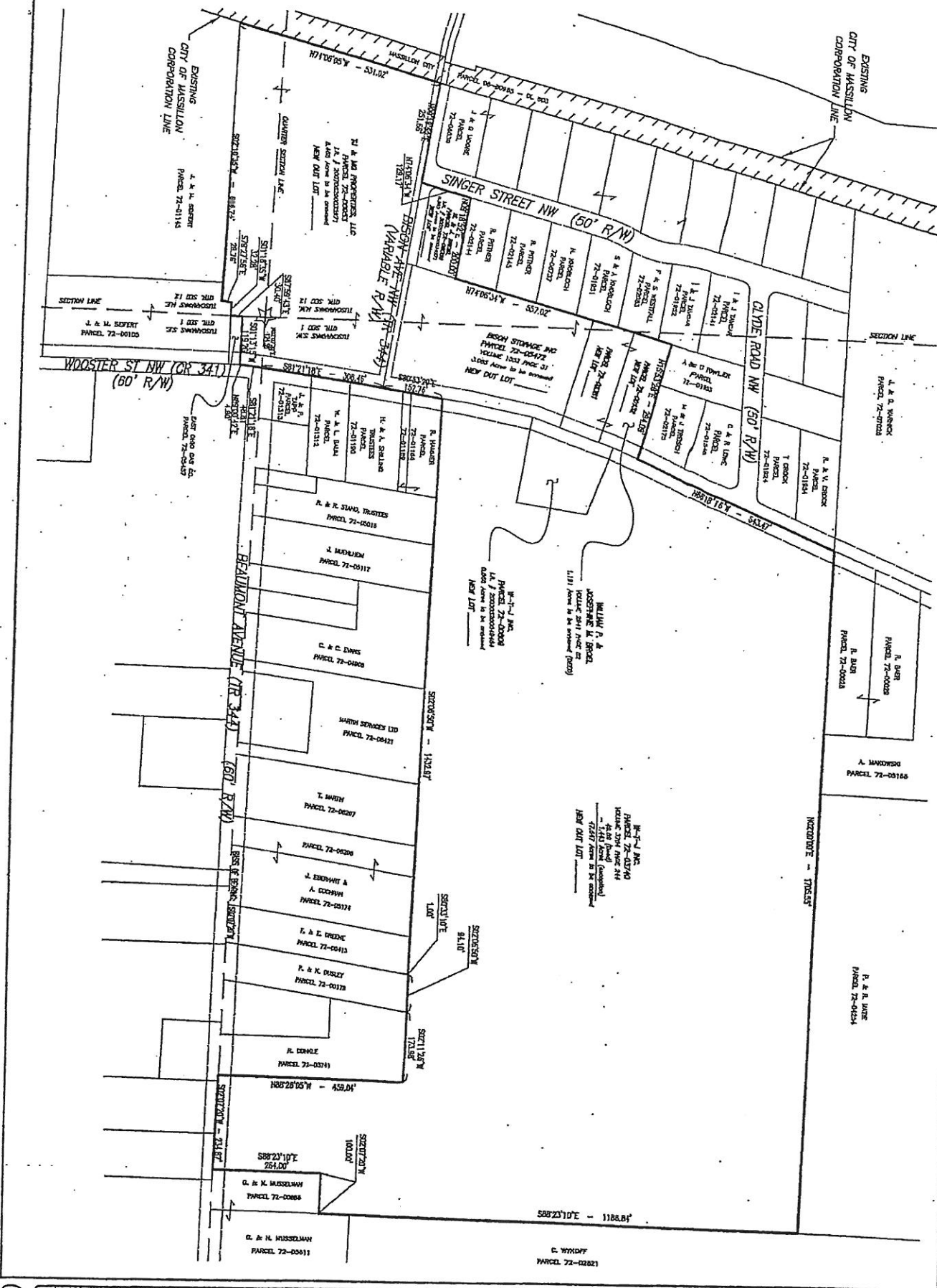

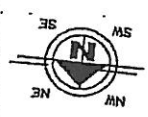

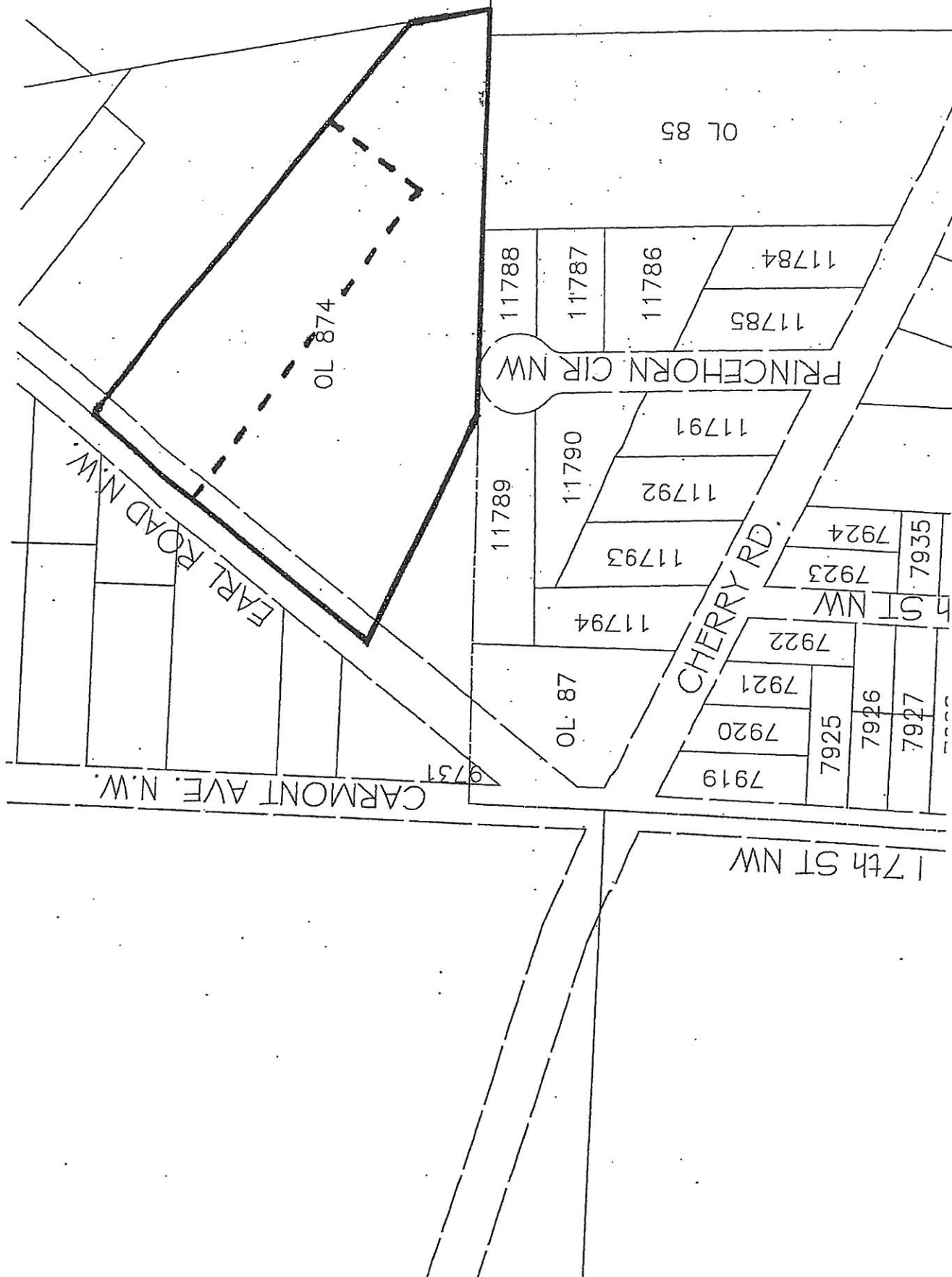

Provided it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the elected members to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor. Otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

**ACTION:**

**SUMMARY:**

**Purpose of the Advisory Board:**

The purpose of the advisory board is: to provide advice and input to the Recreation Board on the past and current financial situation of the department, the current operational aspects of the Recreation Center, Parks department, senior center and golf course. To do a comparison study with 4-5 other municipalities as it relates to operations and budgets with comparable population, size of budget and aspects of operations.
