NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MASSILLON, STATE OF OHIO, THAT:

Section 1:

The Council of the City of Massillon, Ohio, hereby determines it to be necessary in the public health, safety and welfare to enter into three Non-Surface Development Gas & Oil Leases with Lake Region Oil, Inc., for parcels known as South Sippo Park, 8.92 acres, parcel numbers 06-80381, 06-80287 and 06-80404, North Sippo Park, 39.41 acres, parcel numbers 06-80382, 06-80383 and 06-80409 and Shriver Park, 5.40 acres, parcel number 06-80195 owned by the City of Massillon.

Section 2:

The Director of Public Service and Safety of the City of Massillon, Ohio, is hereby authorized to enter into three Non-Surface Development Gas & Oil Leases with Lake Region Oil, Inc., for parcels known as South Sippo Park, North Sippo Park and Shriver Park owned by the City of Massillon. 
