This Council hereby authorizes the Mayor to enter into a development agreement with The ABCD, Inc., to utilize Neighborhood Stabilization Program (NSP) funding to acquire, rehabilitate and resell two vacant, foreclosed vacant lots in the City of Massillon.

# Section 2:

The Mayor of the City of Massillon is hereby authorized to enter into a development agreement with The ABCD, Inc., to utilize Neighborhood Stabilization Program (NSP) funding to acquire, rehabilitate and resell two vacant, foreclosed vacant lots located on 8<sup>th</sup> Street SE and South Avenue SE. The total estimated project cost, including acquisition, redevelopment and resale is \$278,666 (Two Hundred Seventy-Eight Thousand Six Hundred and Sixty-Six Dollars). All proceeds from the sale of these homes will be returned to the City's NSP fund to be used for additional housing projects.

# Section 3:

This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure immediately necessary for the preservation of the health, safety, and welfare of the community and for the additional reason that it is necessary to improve the economic climate of the community through the expansion of business and employment opportunities. #### Detailed Program Narrative

This proposal for Acquisition/New Construction in the City of Massillon has been prepared by Diversified Housing Development Group, (DHD Group) for the Association for Better Community Development, Inc., (ABCD, Inc.).

#### Key Personnel:

ABCD, Inc., will act as the developer under the guidance of Will Dent, CEO/President and Larry Bell, Director of Housing and Community Development. ABCD, Inc., is a Community Housing Development Organization (CHDO), experienced in the construction of affordable housing. ABCD, Inc., has many successful projects including both new construction and rehabilitation. A detailed record of accomplishments are included with this submission.

Lisa Miller, owner of Diversified Housing Development Group will serve as a consultant for the project. She worked for the City of Canton, as Project Manager, managing the City of Canton's HOME Program. She has over 10 years of experience in housing inspection, housing codes/regulations, lead based paint regulations and project management. She is familiar with all the processes of tax foreclosures and the Uniform Relocation Act (URA), as well as Community Development Block Grant regulations. She was responsible for Land Acquisition and Disposition for the City of Canton from 1996 until her retirement in 2007.

We have located two parcels on South Ave SE, in the NSP target area, see enclosed County Auditor printouts. Our plan of action is to acquire these two vacant, abandoned and/or foreclosed parcels, replat them into three buildable parcels. We would construct two (2) single family two story homes (similar to homes on Pearl Ave), with approximately 1,200 square feet. The homes will have three (3) bedrooms, one bathroom, basement and a one car garage. Planned amenities include central air, garage door opener, concrete drive, stove, microwave, garbage disposal, and refrigerator.

NSP parcels will be purchased at 1 % below the appraised value at a minimum. Appraisals will be no more than 60 days old.

Parcels can be acquired immediately upon receipt of funds for closing. All construction will be completed within six months of the start of construction. The homes will be placed on the market and offered for sale not to exceed 95% of the appraised value.

We have set our budget at \$279,000 for two (2) houses. This budget is to acquire and construct the homes, including any necessary landscaping, utilities, permits, seller's share of closing cost, real estate taxes, and developer's fee, etc., see budget for details. Larry Kolic, our contractor will build these homes to meet the model energy code.

We are requesting that Stark County finance the entire project and all proceeds from the sales will be returned to Stark County.

The homes will be sold to qualifying households at 120% of Area Median Income (AMI).

We will monitor all activities and report as necessary any activities that require changes to City of Massillon. We will ensure that the project remains within budget and submit all paperwork for draw request while ensuring that all payments are processed in accordance with any/all agreements. All meetings will be held at ABCD, Inc.

In addition to conventional financing, we have identified two unique funding sources for the project that are specifically equipped to assist the clientele identified in the RFP.

First, we have contacted Stark Metropolitan Housing Authority (SMHA) regarding their Section 8 voucher program. They informed us that Section 8 recipients that have been on the program for more than one (1) year, may use the voucher toward payment of a mortgage payment, should they choose to purchase a home.

SMHA has provided a letter of support for our proposal for Neighborhood Stabilization Program. SMHA states that the timeline for the voucher program is about six months from application to finish.

Second, the Ohio Housing Finance Agency's (OFHA), has various programs that our target market could utilize.

One such program is the Mortgage Credit Certificate (MCC) Program for homebuyers. Their literature states, "An MCC allows you to take a direct tax credit for a portion of your mortgage interest for the life of the mortgage.

#### Other OHFA programs include:

Homebuyer Tax Credit Advantage Program which provides up to 3 percent of the purchase price of the home to be used towards down payment or closing costs. Program specifics have been included in the attached literature.

First-Time Homebuyer Program which states someone must not have owned or had an ownership interest in a principal residence in the last three years, he credit worthy -minimum credit scores may apply, and qualify for the loan requested, have a signed Purchase and Sales Agreement for a qualifying property. Other requirements may apply.

The income and sales price limits for Stark County for the above OHFA programs are as follows:

Agreement information on all of the above programs in an effort to provide them with as many options as possible for their financing needs.

Provided it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the elected members to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor. Otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
