NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MASSILLON, STATE OF OHIO, THAT:

Section 1:

The Council of the City of Massillon, Ohio, hereby finds that it is necessary to sign the Consent Legislation with the Ohio Department of Transportation for the Epoxy Pavement Marking Project, PID 94458.

SECTION I - Project Description

WHEREAS, the (LPA/STATE) has identified the need for the described project:

Installing epoxy pavement markings on US30 and IR77 within the City Limits

NOW THEREFORE, be it ordained by the City of Massillon of Stark County, Ohio.

SECTION II - Consent Statement

Being in the public interest, the LPA gives consent to the Director of Transportation to complete the above described project.

SECTION III - Cooperation Statement

The LPA shall cooperate with the Director of Transportation in the above described project as follows:

The State shall assume and bear 100% of all of the costs of the improvement.

The LPA further agrees to pay One Hundred Percent (100%) of the cost of those features requested by the LPA which are determined by the State and Federal Highway Administration to be unnecessary for the Project.

SECTION IV - Utilities and Right-of-Way Statement

The LPA agrees that all right-of-way required for the described project will be acquired and/or made available in accordance with current State and Federal regulations. The LPA also understands that right-of-way costs include eligible utility costs.

SECTION V - Maintenance

Upon completion of the described Project, and unless otherwise agreed, the LPA shall: (1) provide adequate maintenance for the described Project in accordance with all applicable state and federal law, including, but not limited to, 23 USC 116; (2) provide ample financial provisions, as necessary, for the maintenance of the Project; (3) maintain the right-of-way, keeping it free of obstructions; and (4) hold said right-of-way inviolate for public highway purposes.

Section 4:

Police Services including and analysis of expenditures; staffing; salaries, overtime and compensatory time; benefits; leave use; workloads and service efficiency; equipment/assets; capital planning and maintenance; vehicle (fleet) management; dispatch and jail operations; contract management; and alternative methods of service delivery.

Section 5:

Administrative assessment including a collective bargaining analysis.

Section 6:

The Clerk of Council is authorized to correct any typographical errors discovered herein during or after the pendency or passage of this ordinance. The Clerk of Council is further authorized, in conjunction with the Law Department and the Council President to correct any ministerial or de minimis errors that do not substantially alter the intended results or numerical total sums of this ordinance, during or after the pendency or passage of this ordinance. TITLE: AN ORDINANCE amending Sections 181.03(a), 181.04, 181.06(a)(1) and 181.14(a) of CHAPTER 181 "INCOME TAX" of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Massillon to reflect the increase in the municipal income tax rate from one and eight-tenths percent (1.8%) to two and one-tenths percent (2.1%) to be effective July 1, 2013 subject to the approval of the electors of the City of Massillon at the Primary Election to be held on May 7, 2013, and declaring an emergency.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MASSILLON, STATE OF OHIO, THAT:

Section 1:

Subject to the approval of the electors of the City of Massillon as provided in Section 718.01 of the Revised Code of Ohio, certain sections of Chapter 181 of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Massillon are hereby amended to provide for an increase in the tax rate levied on income from one and eight-tenths percent (1.8%) to two and one-tenths percent (2.1%) effective July 1, 2013.

That said Sections 181.03(a), 181.04, 181.06(a)(1) and 181.14(a) of CHAPTER 181 "INCOME TAX" shall be amended to read as follows:

181.03 IMPOSITION OF TAX.

(a) An annual tax for the purposes specified in Section 181.01 shall be imposed on and after July 1, 2013, at the rate of two and one-tenths percent (2.1%) per annum on the following:

(all remaining subsections of 181.03 shall remain as currently in effect)

181.04 EFFECTIVE PERIOD.

The tax shall be levied, collected and paid with respect to the salaries, wages, commissions and other compensation, and with respect to the net profits of businesses, professions or other activities earned from and after July 1, 2013. The provisions hereof shall not be considered to repeal, invalidate, or impair the effective provisions of previous local income tax enactments of this Municipality or the duties and accrual obligations arising thereunder.

(Ord. 106-1995. Passed 5-17-95.)

181.06 COLLECTION AT SOURCE

(a) (1) Each employer within or doing business within this Municipality who employs one or more person on a salary, wage, commission or other compensation basis, shall at the time of payment thereof, deduct the tax of two and one-tenths percent (2.1%) from the gross salaries, wages, commissions, or other compensation earned by City residents regardless of where such compensation was earned and shall deduct the tax of two and one-tenths percent (2.1%) from the salaries, wages, commissions, or the compensation earned within this Municipality by nonresidents.

(all remaining subsections of 181.06 shall remain as currently in effect)

181.14 ALLOCATION OF FUNDS

(a) Effective July 1, 2013 the funds collected under the provisions of this chapter shall be disbursed as follows:

(all remaining subsections of 181.14 shall remain as currently in effect)

Section 2:

That this Ordinance amending certain sections in CHAPTER 181 of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Massillon shall only be effective upon the approval by the electors of the City of Massillon at the Primary Election to be held on May 7, 2013, in regard to the aforesaid increase of the income tax rate. Provided, however, that if the approval is not received, this ordinance, which amends certain sections of CHAPTER 181 of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Massillon, shall be of no effect and the aforesaid sections shall be in full force and effect as presently written in CHAPTER 181.

Section 3:

That this is the desire and request of the Council of the City of Massillon that the ballot for said question shall be substantially in the following form.

SAMPLE BALLOT

Shall the Ordinance providing for an increase in the municipal income tax rate from one and eight-tenths percent (1.8%) to two and one-tenths percent (2.1%) to be effective July 1, 2013 for the purpose of providing for services, general fun expenditures and Capital Improvements be passed?

Section 4:

That this Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety and it shall go into effect immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor. The reason for said emergency is the immediate necessity of increasing the income tax rate so the City of Massillon can provide for services, general fund expenditures and Capital Improvements.

TITLE: AN ORDINANCE amending Section 181.15 "CREDIT FOR TAX PAID TO ANOTHER MUNICIPALITY" OF CHAPTER 181 "INCOME TAX" of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Massillon by enacting a new Section 181.15 "CREDIT FOR TAX PAID TO ANOTHER MUNICIPALITY" of said CHAPTER 181 "INCOME TAX", and declaring an emergency.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MASSILLON, STATE OF OHIO, THAT:

Section 1:

Section 181.15 "CREDIT FOR TAX PAID TO ANOTHER MUNICIPALITY" of said CHAPTER 181 "INCOME TAX" of the Codified Ordinance of the City of Massillon be and hereby is repealed.

Section 2:

That there be and hereby is enacted a new Section 181.15 "CREDIT FOR TAX PAID TO ANOTHER MUNICIPALITY" of said CHAPTER 181 "INCOME TAX" of the Codified Ordinance of the City of Massillon. Said section shall read as follows:

181.15 CREDIT FOR TAX PAID TO ANOTHER MUNICIPALITY

- (a) Where a resident of this Municipality is subject to a municipal income tax in another municipality or in a joint economical development district, such resident shall be allowed a credit up to a maximum of one and eight-tenths (1.8%) of such tax rate paid to the other municipality.
- (b) Every individual taxpayer who resides in this municipality who receives net profits, salaries, wages, commissions, or other personal service compensation for work done or services performed or rendered outside of this municipality, if it is made to appear that he had paid a municipal income tax on the same income taxable under this chapter to another municipality or in a joint economical district, shall be allowed a credit on the first one and eight-tenths (1.8%) of such tax rate paid to the

other municipality or a joint economical development district. The credit shall not exceed the amount of one and eight-tenths (1.8%) of such tax rate paid to the other municipality or a joint economical development district.

- (c) This credit shall be effective commencing July 1, 2013 only in the event that Ordinance No. 4-2013 is approved by a majority of the voters in the Municipality at the election to be held on May 7, 2013, otherwise this ordinance shall be of no force and effect, and the currently existing version of 181.15 shall remain in effect unchanged.

Section 3:

This ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure, the reason for the emergency being that said enactments are necessary for the more efficient operation, funding, and services funded by the General Fund of the City of Massillon, Ohio, and for the additional reason for the preservation of the public health, safety and welfare of the community. Provided it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the elected members to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor. Otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

WHEREAS, Mr. Gamber has fully cooperated with all members of City Council and has devoted himself to his responsibilities and duties as President of Massillon City Council, and

WHEREAS, City Council desires to recognize and note upon its official records its appreciation and commendation to Mr. Glenn E. Gamber for the excellent service he has rendered to the people and the City of Massillon during his terms of office.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MASSILLON, STATE OF OHIO, THAT:

Section 1:
