TITLE: AN ORDINANCE authorizing the Mayor of the City of Massillon, Ohio, to enter into an agreement with Han Ryee to provide an economic development "inducement grant" to assist the business in renovation expenses at 24 Lincoln Way West, and declaring an emergency.

WHEREAS, the City of Massillon carries out a variety of economic development programs designed to promote the creation and expansion of business and industry in the community; and

WHEREAS, Han Ryee desires to renovate the building located at 24 Lincoln Way West, and

WHEREAS, the City of Massillon proposed to assist Han Ryee with renovation expenses of the business by providing an economic development "inducement grant", the purpose of which is to help offset the company's costs with the renovations.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MASSILLON, STATE OF OHIO, THAT

Section 1:

This Council hereby authorizes the Mayor to enter into an agreement with Han Ryee by providing an economic development "inducement grant", in a total amount not to exceed Fifteen Thousand Dollars (\$15,000.00) for the purpose of assisting the business with the renovations at 24 Lincoln Way West.

Section 2:

In return for this economic development grant assistance, Han Ryee shall provide the City with information regarding the number of jobs that it has provided as a result of the renovation to the business.

This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure, for the efficient operation of the various departments of the City of Massillon and for the preservation of the public health, safety and welfare of the community. Provided it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the elected members to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor. Otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

TITLE: AN ORDINANCE establishing a fund entitled "Foreclosure Property Administration Fund 1220", and creating line items within said fund, and declaring an emergency.

Section 1:

There be and is hereby established within the City of Massillon, Ohio, a fund entitled "Foreclosure Property Administration Fund 1220", and creating line items within said fund.

Section 2:

The City Auditor is hereby authorized and directed to draw her warrants and make payments on vouchers duly approved by the proper departmental authority.

Section 3:

That this Ordinance is declared to be an emergency measure immediately necessary in order to keep federal grant dollars in one specific fund as recommended by the State Auditor for accounting procedures within the Auditor's Department. Provided it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the elected members to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor. Otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

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
