

The Tax Commissioner, upon consideration of the application filed by the County Auditor, as secretary of the county budget commission, on September 18, 2014, for an extension of time beyond the statutory date of September first to complete its work, as provided by Revised Code section 5705.27, finds that the extension of time is necessary and approves October 1, 2014, as the date within which such work shall be completed, pursuant to Ohio Revised Code section 5705.341 (last para.).

The Tax Commissioner also extends the October first deadline contained in Ohio Revised Code section 5705.34 for the political subdivision to authorize the necessary tax levies to the auditor by the same number of days that the extension to certify rates is granted by this entry. Accordingly, the political subdivision must authorize the necessary tax levies to the auditor by October 31, 2014. The County Auditor must notify each political subdivision affected by this
