ORDINANCE NO. 88 - 2015

BY: STREETS, HIGHWAYS AND TRAFFIC COMMITTEE

TITLE: AN ORDINANCE authorizing the Director of Public Service and Safety of the City of Massillon, Ohio, to advertise for and receive sealed bids, and enter into a contract, upon award and approval of the Board of Control, with the lowest and best bidder for the 2015 Priority Street Segment Resurfacing Project, and declaring an emergency.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MASSILLON, STATE OF OHIO, THAT:

Section 1:

The Council of the City of Massillon hereby determines it to be necessary in the public health, safety and welfare to advertise for and receive sealed bids, and enter into a contract, upon award and approval of the Board of Control, with the lowest and best bidder for the 2015 Priority Street Segment Resurfacing Project for the City of Massillon.

Section 2:

The Director of Public Service and Safety is hereby authorized and directed to advertise for and receive sealed bids according to law, and to enter into a contract upon award and approval of the Board of Control with the lowest and best bidder for the 2015 Priority Street Segment Resurfacing Project. The current project cost estimate is One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00) and will be funded through the 1419 Marketplace Infrastructure Fund.

Section 3:

The Clerk of Council is authorized to correct any typographical errors discovered herein during or after the pendency or passage of this ordinance. The Clerk of Council is further authorized, in conjunction with the Law Department and the Council President to correct any ministerial or de minimis errors that do not substantially alter the intended results or numerical total sums of this ordinance, during or after the pendency or passage of this ordinance. Corrected copies are to be sent to all official recipients.

Section 4:

This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the preservation of the public health, safety and welfare of the community and for the additional reason that it is necessary that bids be received so that work may begin on the 2015 Priority Street Segment Resurfacing Project. Provided it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the elected members to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor. Otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
