TITLE: AN ORDINANCE establishing a new Special Revenue Fund entitled "1211 Budget Stabilization Fund", to ensure the City can provide consistent, uninterrupted municipal services in the event of economic disruption, and declaring an emergency.

WHEREAS, pursuant to R.C. 5705.13(A), a municipal legislative authority is permitted to establish a special revenue fund for the purpose of accumulation resources to stabilize subdivision budgets against cyclical changes in revenues and expenditures, and;

WHEREAS, as identified in the city Financial Recovery Plan, the City is desirous of establishing such a special revenue with the primary source of revenues thereto being a percentage of the annual General Fund carry over balance, and;

WHEREAS, the Administration and the City Auditor has established a target balance for the Budget Stabilization Fund to be Three Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$300,000.00), the initial deposit, from the 2015 General Fund carry over balance. Thereafter, the annual transfer shall be ten percent (10%) of the initial deposit credited to the Budge Stabilization Fund in the preceding fiscal year's carry over balance.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MASSILLON, STATE OF OHIO, THAT:

Section 1:

There be and is hereby established within the City of Massillon, Ohio, a fund entitled "1211 Budget Stabilization Fund", which shall be funded with transfers as percentage of annual General Fund carry over balance.

Section 2:

That the Budget Stabilization Fund Policy for the City of Massillon, Ohio, is set forth in the document attached hereto as Exhibit "A" and made a part hereof.

Section 3:

That by reason of the immediate necessity for implementing the Budget Stabilization Fund Policy without delay so as to enhance the fiscal integrity of the City, this measure is determined to be an emergency ordinance for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety and welfare of the City of Massillon, Ohio, and its inhabitants and providing it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of all members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its adoption, otherwise from and after the earliest time allowed by law, after its passage and approval by the Mayor.

EXHIBIT "A"

I. Introduction

A budget stabilization fund helps ensure that the City can provide consistent, uninterrupted municipal services in the event of economic disruption or volatility. The City's primary revenue source, the income tax, is more volatile than property taxes, which are a more traditional source of municipal revenue.

This policy establishes the amounts the City of Massillon will strive to maintain in the budget stabilization fund, how it will be funded, and the conditions under which the accumulated balance may be spent.

II. Funding Reserve Targets

Funding of the budget stabilization fund will occur through general fund transfers. Per Ohio revised Code 5705.12(A), the amount of money to be transferred from the general fund in any fiscal year shall be ten percent (10%) of the initial deposit credited to the general fund. The annual transfer recommendation will be made to City Council by the Auditor.

III. Conditions for Use of Reserves

A. Use of Reserves

It is the intent of the City to limit use of the budget stabilization fund to address unanticipated, non-recurring needs. Reserves shall not normally be applied to recurring annual operation expenditures. The fund may, however, be used to allow time for the City to restructure its operations in a deliberate manner (such as might be required in the case of a sustained economic downturn), but such use will only take place in the context of an adopted long-term financial sustainability plan.

B. Authority to Use Reserves

The City Council may authorize, by two-thirds vote, use of reserves for purposes consistent with the purposes described in 3A above.

C. Replenishment of Reserves

In the event City Council authorizes use of the budget stabilization fund, the Auditor will work with the Administration including all elected officials to develop a plan for the replenishment of the fund for City Council consideration. The City will strive to replenish the fund within one year of use subject to the guidelines set forth in Ohio Revised Code 5705.12(A).

Section 1:

Subject to the approval of the electors of the City of Massillon as provided in Section 718.01 of the Revised Code of Ohio, new Section 181.031 LEVY OF ADDITIONAL TAX is hereby enacted and shall read as follows:

181.031 LEVY OF ADDITIONAL TAX

In addition to the income tax levied pursuant to Section 181.03, there is hereby levied, a tax upon earnings at the additional rate of two-tenths (.2) of one percent (1.0%) upon those items enumerated in Section 181.03 to be specifically dedicated for the purpose of City Street Repair and Repaving.

Section 2:

That this Ordinance amending certain sections in CHAPTER 181 of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Massillon shall only be effective upon the approval by the electors of the City of Massillon a Special Election to be held August 2, 2016, in regard to the aforesaid increase of the income tax rate. Provided, however, that if the approval is not received, this ordinance, which amends certain sections of CHAPTER 181 of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Massillon, shall be of no effect and the aforesaid sections shall be in full force and effect as presently written in CHAPTER 181.

TITLE: A resolution directing the Stark County Board of Elections to conduct an election at a Special Election on August 2, 2016 for the purpose of providing the electors of the City of Massillon, Ohio, with the opportunity to approve or disapprove an Ordinance providing for a proposed increase in the City of Massillon, Ohio income tax ordinance from 1.8% to 2% effective for collection commencing January 1, 2017, such increase to be exclusively used for the purpose of City Street Repair and Repaving, and declaring an Emergency.

WHEREAS, upon due investigation and consideration, the Council of the City of Massillon, Ohio, has determined that the amount of revenues which will be available to the City of Massillon, Ohio, will be insufficient to provide an adequate amount of funds for the purpose of funding City Street Repair and Repaving;

WHEREAS, said Council has determined that it is in the best interest of the health, safety and welfare of the residents of the City of Massillon, Ohio to conduct a Special Election on August 2, 2016 to provide the electors of the City of Massillon, Ohio an opportunity to approve or disapprove an income tax increase from 1.8% to 2% commencing for collection January 1, 2017, such increase to be exclusively used for the purpose of City Street Repair and Repaving;

WHEREAS, in accordance with Ohio Revised Code Section 718.04 (C)(2), no municipal corporation shall levy a tax on income at a rate in excess of one percent (1.0%) without having obtained the approval of the excess by a majority of the electors of the municipality voting on the question;

WHEREAS, Council has passed Ordinance No. ______ - 2016 increasing said income tax for said purpose; and

WHEREAS, Council resolves to specify the date of said election as the Special Election on August 2, 2016.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MASSILON, OHIO THAT:

- // There shall be submitted to the electors of the City of Massillón, Ohio the question of approving or disapproving an income tax increase from 1.8% to 2%, collection commencing January 1, 2017.
- The increase in tax shall be an annual tax for the period specified above levied on the income of every person residing in or earning or receiving income in the City of Massillon, Ohio, and the tax shall be measured by municipal taxable income.
- 3. The City of Massillon, Ohio is levying the tax increase in accordance with the limitations of Chapter 718 of the Ohio Revised Code and this resolution hereby incorporates the provisions of said Chapter 718.
- The Council of the City hereby specifies that said election is to be held at a Special Election on August 2, 2016.

- 5. The Board of Elections is hereby directed that the purpose of the proposed income tax increase is to provide funds for the purpose of City Street Repair and Repaving.
- The submission of said income tax increase proposal, the notice of election, the form of ballot, the certification of the additional tax as voted outside the one percent limitation, and the levying of such tax increase shall be in accordance with the provisions of Ohio Revised Code Section 718.04(C)(2) and other related Sections of the Ohio Revised Code, in accordance with the statutes in such cases made and provided.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT THE FORM OF THE BALLOT CAST AT SUCH ELECTION SHALL BE:

"A MAJORITY AFFIRMATIVE VOTE IS REQUIRED FOR PASSAGE

Shall the Ordinance providing for an increase in the municipal income tax rate from 1.8% to 2.0% levy on income, effective January 1, 2017, for the purpose of City Street Repair and Repaving be passed.

- 7 That the Clerk of Council be and hereby is directed to cause notice of such election to be published as required by law.
- This Resolution is declared to be an emergency measure necessary to the immediate
 preservation of the public health, safety and welfare of the residents of the City of
 Massillon, Ohio to ensure that the Stark County Board of Elections approves this

resolution as complying with the mandates of Section 718.04 of the Ohio Revised Code to accept the placing of the tax increase on the ballot within the time deadlines of the Ohio Revised Code, and shall become effective at the earliest date allowed by law.

- 9, This resolution shall go into effect as soon as permissible by law.
- This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure for the preservation of the public health, safety and welfare of the community. Provided it receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the elected members of Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor. Otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
