TITLE: AN ORDINANCE amending Section 1151.02 of the Massillon Code of 1985 by rezoning a certain tract of land from R-1 One Family Residential to R-T Two Family Residential, and declaring an emergency.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MASSILLON, STATE OF OHIO, THAT:

Section 1:

It is hereby determined to be in the best interest and promotion of the general health, safety and convenience, comfort, prosperity and welfare of the community to change the designation of area set for in Section 2 hereof from R-1 One Family Residential to R-T Two Family Residential. Said rezoning was approved by the Planning commission of the City of Massillon, Ohio, on June 13, 2018, and that notice and public hearing has been given according to the law.

Section 2:

The City of Massillon, Ohio, Zone Map as identified by Section 1151.02 of the Massillon Code of 1985, be and is hereby amended to show the following described area as R-T Two Family Residential:

Being known as Lot #2510 of Parcel #606741, located at 671 Cliff St. N.W., Massillon, Ohio, on the corner of Cliff St. N.W. and Cable Ct. N.W. In addition, Lot #2511 of Parcel #604840, located at 660 Guy St. N.W., Massillon, Ohio, on the corner of Guy St. N.W. and Cable Ct. N.W. The applicant is Massillon Cable TV, Inc. The purpose for the rezoning is to build a duplex on each of the parcels.

Section 1:

The Council of the City of Massillon, Ohio, hereby determines it necessary in the public health, safety and welfare for the Director of Public Service and Safety of the City of Massillon, Ohio, to enter into a Contract with the Board of Education of the Massillon City School District to provide two (2) police officers for law enforcement services in Massillon Washington High School and Massillon Junior High School.

Section 2:

The Director of Public Service and Safety of the City of Massillon, Ohio, is hereby authorized and directed to enter into a Contract with the Board of Education of the Massillon City School District to provide two (2) police officers to provide law enforcement services in Massillon Washington High School and Massillon Junior High School during all days in which school is in session with students in attendance. Contract attached hereto as Exhibit "A".

Section 3:

Section 3:

This Ordinance is declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the efficient operation of the various departments of the City of Massillon and for the additional reason to align the 2018 budget. Provided this Ordinance receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the elected members to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor. Otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
