NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MASSILLON, STATE OF OHIO, THAT:

Section 1:

There be and hereby is appropriated from the unappropriated balance of the 1240 Veterans Park/Duncan Plaza Improvement Fund, for the year ending December 31, 2019, the following:

\$ 5,000.00 to an account entitled "Supplies" - 1240.125.5.2410

Section 2:

The Clerk of Council is authorized to correct any typographical errors discovered herein during or after the pendency or passage of this ordinance. The Clerk of Council is further authorized, in conjunction with the Law Department and the Council President to correct any ministerial or de minimis errors that do not substantially alter the intended results or numerical total sums of this ordinance, during or after the pendency or passage of this ordinance. Section 3:

This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the efficient operation of the various departments of the City of Massillon and for the further reason to purchase supplies for the upkeep of Veterans Park and Duncan Plaza. Provided this Ordinance receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the elected members to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor. Otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
