Grants are available to businesses that have experienced economic hardship due to government-mandated shutdowns or other imposed business restrictions.

Eligible businesses may receive grants to pay for:

- Payroll and related costs, employee benefits, and state and local taxes assessed on compensation
- Rent expenses or business mortgage obligations
- Utility expenses, for services that began before February 15, 2020
- Costs associated with creating a safe business environment due to COVID-19

Grants of up to \$10,000 are available but funding is limited.

Eligible applicants include:

For profit business entities and sole proprietors with a physical business location

Eligibility requirements:

- Business must be located in the City of Massillon home offices are not eligible
- Have 25 or fewer employees, including business owner(s)
- Have not received a City of Massillon Economic Inducement Grant after January 1, 2019
- Have not received any COVID-19 related financial assistance from the Federal or state government
- Can articulate how their business has been negatively impacted by COVID-19
