TITLE: A RESOLUTION authorizing the City of Massillon, Ohio, to form and join a governance structure for Region 6 pursuant to the OneOhio Memorandum of Understanding and the OneOhio Subdivision Settlement Agreement in the City of Massillon's ongoing Opioid Litigation; also authorizing the Mayor and/or the Director of Public Service and Safety to enter into any necessary agreements and to take any necessary actions to facilitate said process, and declaring the same to be an emergency.

WHEREAS, the City of Massillon, Ohio, is a local government that has adopted and approved the OneOhio Memorandum of Understanding (the "Memorandum"), which establishes a mechanism to disburse settlement proceeds from opioid litigation into Ohio's communities to help abate the opioid crisis, including allocations to local governments and regions through a statewide foundation; and

WHEREAS, the City is a participant in Region 6, as established by the Memorandum; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Memorandum, each region shall create their own governance structure so it ensures all local governments have input and equitable representation regarding regional decisions, including representation on the statewide foundation board, and selection of projects to be funded from the region's regional share; and

WHEREAS, regions have the responsibility to make submissions regarding the allocation of funds to projects that will equitably serve the needs of the entire region; and

WHEREAS, the regional governance structure below ensures all local governments in Region 6 have input and equitable representation regarding regional decisions under the Memorandum;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MASSILLON, STATE OF OHIO, THAT:

Section 1:

The City of Massillon, Ohio, is authorized to form and join a governance structure for Region 6 pursuant to the OneOhio Memorandum of Understanding and the OneOhio Subdivision Settlement Agreement as follows:

- 2 members appointed by the Stark County Commissioners;
- 2 members appointed by the mayor of the largest municipality;
- 2 members appointed by a majority vote of the mayors or head executives of the remaining municipalities;
- 2 members appointed by a majority vote of the various boards of township trustees;
- and 2 community members elected by the above members who have experience in addiction, mental illness and treatment and effected by, and active in, the fight against the opioid crisis.
- -- For a total of 10 members.

Section 2:

The Mayor and/or the Director of Public Service and Safety are authorized to enter into any necessary agreements and to take any necessary actions to facilitate the process outlined above in Section 1.

Section 3:

All formal actions of this Council relating to the adoption of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action, were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements.

Section 4:

The Clerk of Council is authorized to correct any typographical errors discovered herein during or after the pendency or passage of this ordinance. The Clerk of Council is further authorized, in conjunction with the Law Department and the Council President to correct any ministerial or de minimis errors that do not substantially alter the intended results or numerical total sums of this ordinance, during or after the pendency or passage of this ordinance. NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MASSILLON, STATE OF OHIO, THAT:

Section 1:

Effective January 1, 2024, the Mayor of the City of Massillon, Ohio, shall receive a one-time salary increase to \$90,000.00 per year. This one-time salary increase shall be in lieu of, and not in addition to, the CPI salary increase provided for in Ordinance No. 174 – 2019. Said CPI salary increase for the Mayor is hereby suspended for calendar year 2024. Effective January 1, 2025, the Mayor shall commence receiving said CPI salary increase.

Section 2:

Effective January 1, 2024, the Auditor of the City of Massillon, Ohio, shall receive a one-time salary increase to \$77,000.00 per year. This one-time salary increase shall be in lieu of, and not in addition to, the CPI salary increase provided for in Ordinance No. 174 – 2019. Said CPI salary increase for the Auditor is hereby suspended for calendar year 2024. Effective January 1, 2025, the Auditor shall commence receiving said CPI salary increase.

Section 3:

In the event of any conflict between the provisions of any existing ordinances or resolutions and the provisions of this Ordinance, the provisions of this Ordinance shall control.
