

I hereby certify that the above plat of Part of Out Lot 163, in the City of Massillon, County of Stark, Ohio, has been surveyed and a topography made me this 21st day of January, 1982. That the above parcel lies in the flood plain of area set forth by the U.S. ARMY CORPS OF ENGINEERS in a study dated January, 1970. The above elevation shown are in conjunction with said study. The approximate flood plain elevation for a 100 year storm is 939.10. The storm of July 4, 1969 the flood plain rose to approximately 935.0. At the present time of the survey the City of Massillon is not policing any lots within it's limits that are being filled. Requiring permits to do so. It is the intent of this plat to show actual ground elevations as they exist and that any fill that is added to the above area, the City of Massillon Engineer's Office should be notified and if any buildings are erected they are flood prone.



Upon finishing the topo and survey of the above, I have been in contact with Robert Wagoner, City of Massillon City Enginner. He advises that the filling of the property in the area has been going on for some time and that the Army Corps. of Engineer's has sort of given the policing of this to the City and the County. As far as the City of Massillon requiring permits and drawings to fill low lands are concerned they have not required this as of yet. I do feel that there will be no problem in the re-zoning of the said property and that if the prospective buyer is aware of the conditions that do exist as far as getting permision from the City Engineer to bring a building site elevation to a point where the flood control will not bother him in any way and designing a building that would meet the standards of the said City, I feel this would be adequate to your client.
