Whereas, upon the 16th day of January 1904, The Jarvis Estates Co. ^{Subsidiary} ^{of} ^{Superintendent} ^{of} ^{Public Works} ^{Board} ^{of} ^{Ohio} ^{State} ^{Government} ^{of} ^{Massillon} ^{County} ^{of} ^{Stark} ^{State} ^{of} ^{Ohio} ^{entered} its ^{appearance before the Board} ^{for the purpose of} ^{determining the boundary line between its land and the lands of the State of Ohio and presented then and there the following application: Superintendent of Public Works Columbus, O.—Sir: The undersigned respectfully represents that it is the owner of the following interest, to wit: an estate in fee simple in the following described real estate abutting upon lands claimed by the State of Ohio, situated in the city of Massillon, Township of Virgil, County of Stark, State of Ohio and described as follows: Description:—Lying just of South Erie Street in said city, being of that part of lands belonging to The Jarvis Estates Co., lying east of the last line of the Canal as shown by map of D. C. Kenyon recorded in Vol. 3, at page 8 of the Ohio Canal maps, which will be flooded by the waters of the Ohio Canal when said canal is filled to its proper level opposite said lands together with the required berm bank. Said portion of said Jarvis Estates Co.'s land lying south of a tract owned by William Vogt and described in the record of his deed thereto in volume 432 at page 291 of the Deed Records of Stark County, Ohio, also that part of lands belonging to the same company east of the same line and lying south of said Vogt's tract of land and north of the north line of a tract owned by J. H. Jones described in the record of his deed in volume 435 at page 481 of said Deed Records which will be flooded by the State of Ohio for the purpose of raising the level of the canal to its proper level opposite said lands, and further the required amount for a berm bank. And that it desires to settle all disputes as to the boundary line between the above described land and the lands of the state of Ohio, and any claims that the state of Ohio may have to any portion of the above described land. Now, therefore, the undersigned The Jarvis Estates Company, herewith, enters its appearance before the Superintendent of Public Works of the State of Ohio and submits all its claims as to said boundary line to the award and decision of said Superintendent of Public Works of the State of Ohio for the purpose of determining the boundary line between the above described lands and the lands of the State of Ohio and the ownership of the same, and it fully agrees to accept as final and conclusive the award and decision of the Superintendent of Public Works thereto, as provided in section 218-224 R.S.}

And, whereas, said ~~Board~~ of Public Works of the State of Ohio has carefully investigated the claims of all parties in connection with the boundary line of said lands, and

Whereas, surveys of said lands have been made under the direction of the ~~Chief Engineer of the Board~~ of Public Works of the State of Ohio, and

Whereas, all matters in relation to said boundary lines were fully considered ~~at a meeting of the Board of Public Works of the State of Ohio~~ on the 11th day of February, 1911 and

Whereas, all of the provisions in section 218-224 of the Revised Statutes of Ohio have been fully complied with,

Now, Therefore, the ~~Board~~ of Public Works of the State of Ohio herewith makes the following award and decision and fixes the boundary line between the lands of said The Jarvis Estates Company and the lands of the State of Ohio as follows:

So much of the following described line as determined by a survey made by E. E. Britton, Jan 30th, 1914, as the west of the two tracts of land in South Massillon, Stark County, Ohio, described in the application of The Jarvis Estates Company as recited above. Commencing at a point opposite the corner end of the tunnel around original Lock No. 5 of the Ohio Canal in South Massillon, Stark Co. Ohio, which point is 12.12 feet west of the inner face of the easterly wall of said tunnel and running thence southeasterly by a straight line 280 feet to a point opposite station 81 of D. C. Kenyon's transit line of his survey of said Canal, made 1890 and 97.5 feet easterly thereof, measured at right angles thereto thence southeasterly by a straight line 215.6 feet to a point opposite station 683 of said Kenyon's transit line, and 154 feet west of the inner face of the curving in the west side of South Erie street in said city, measured at right angles thereto. thence southeasterly, in a line parallel to and 154 feet west of the inner face of the westly curving of South Erie street, 516 feet more or less, to the southwesterly line of a certain lot owned by the said Jarvis Estates Co. excepting therefore 100 feet of the line last described that lies in the rear of a lot owned by William Vogt.

By mutual agreement the last described line was established so as to avoid the irregular contour line that would have been necessary had the line been extended around the bayou that projects from the canal, but it is understood that the State of Ohio shall not be liable for the overflow of any land east of the line herein established, or be required to fill any portion of the same to prevent such overflow.

For a more definite description of the boundary line thus established, reference is hereby made to a plat of the survey made by E. E. Britton, as referred to above, a correct copy of which is hereto attached and made a part of this finding.
