

It is to be noted that all of these areas drain directly or indirectly into the Tuscarawas River. With the exception of the last two named, they must, perforce, drain through valleys in which, as indicated in the table, the City of Massillon has built, or is building trunk sewers, for the accommodation of its own area. In the case of the Columbia Heights and Forest Avenue areas the City of Massillon has planned, but has not yet constructed, sewers to which these territories be tributary. In all cases the Massillon main trunk sewer, known as the Tuscarawas Trunk, is the natural and final sewer outlet. Also the tentative location of future Massillon sewage treatment works, (see 1923 Report on Trunk Sewers for Massillon) is such as to enable service to all of the territory indicated.

m A general conclusion of this consideration is that the sewerage of Massillon, either present or contemplated, is favorably sited for the economical collection of wastes from the territories as described. This is true to the extent ^{that} were separate provision to be made these would parallel the facilities included in the Massillon plan.
