At the extreme northeast corner of this district are about twenty acres which drain east and south to Sippo Creek, rather than directly to Tuscarawas River. This area can be served only by pumping to the summit on North Front Street, or by the construction of about 2½ miles of sewer connecting to the Sippo Trunk at Dam Road. This latter sewer would traverse territory which is not of present concern to the City. This area, as described, is accordingly left without drainage outlet until such time as the aggregate development warrants facilities not now economic.
