

UNSEWERED AREAS -- OUTLETS

On Drawing 3142.4 ²¹⁰³ is shown an outline of the present day sanitary drainage of Massillon. The whole city is now served by two main drains which traverse West Street and South Erie Street. Except in the Little Sippo Valley, both of these outlet lines have been pushed out to the ultimate limit of flat grades; in two instances added territory has been brought in by pumps.

City areas still unsupplied with sanitary drainage are the following:

1. Section bounded generally by Front, Vogel, Mill and Lake Streets.
2. East Tremont Street east from Lincoln Street and along Sippo Creek.
3. Area tributary to Little Sippo Creek and lying east of Lincoln Street and McLean Street.
4. The southmost margin of the city and including Forest Avenue
5. The west end of the city, west from Columbus Street and centering to Pigeon Run Road at West Tremont Street.
6. West Cherry Street in the vicinity of Cliff Street. Also the area laying between the River and the Canal.
7. Earl Street.

Each of these areas is developed in greater or less degree and is in need of sewerage. In the aggregate they include 1100 acres of developable area or forty five percent of the present corporate area.

Additional to the corporate area are settled sections which adjoin the city limits and include --

Sippo Heights, a development on the east boundary and draining to a cesspool in the Sippo Valley; also merging into the settlement along the Canton Road;

Columbia Heights and West Park immediately north of the Central Steel Company Plant. Of these, West Park is sewered with an outlet into the river at Oberlin Road;

Wooster Road toward Brookfield;

Outlets

Natural drainage from the foregoing sections both city and adjoining is afforded by several streams or valleys. These are the economic routes for sewers of general service and each has been made the location for a sanitary trunk sewer hereinafter described.
